

## U N A's Packaging Guidelines Federal Financial Aid 2010-2011

Federal financial aid funds are distributed to UNA students along the following guidelines:

Applications are considered for awards after all eligibility issues, including verification requirements, are satisfied. The university is given limited amounts of certain funds. Those are awarded to eligible students on a first-come, first-serve basis.

<b>Program</b>	<b>Award Amounts and selection criteria</b>
<b>Pell Grant</b>	\$555 - \$5550; maximum based on student's Estimated Family Contribution (EFC), eligibility and enrollment status.
<b>Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant (SEOG)</b>	\$150 - \$300; awarded to Pell Grant recipients with lowest EFC. Limited funds available.
<b>Alabama Student Assistance Program (ASAP)</b>	\$150 - \$300; awarded to Pell Grant recipients. Based on availability of funds. Preference given to students who apply before April 1.
<b>Academic Competitiveness Grant (AC)</b>	\$750 – 1st year students; \$1300 – 2 <sup>nd</sup> year students. Awarded to students receiving Pell Grants who are US Citizens, in their 1 <sup>st</sup> or 2 <sup>nd</sup> academic year of study. Awarded to students who have completed a recognized rigorous secondary school program of study.
<b>National Science &amp; Mathematics Access to Retain Talent Grant (SMART)</b>	\$4000; awarded to Pell Grant recipients who are US Citizens in their 3 <sup>rd</sup> or 4 <sup>th</sup> academic year of study in an eligible degree program. Eligible degree programs include Physical, Life or Computer Sciences, Engineering, Technology, Mathematics, or a critical-need foreign language. Must maintain a minimum 3.0 GPA.
<b>TEACH Grant</b>	UNA will not participate in the TEACH grant program for the 2010-2011 school year.
<b>Federal Work Study</b>	\$2500 average award. Based on student eligibility. Amount may be adjusted based on departmental budget and need.
<b>Stafford Loan (subsidized and unsubsidized)</b>	See Loans page for amounts. Your eligibility will be based on your EFC, budget, classification and dependency status.
<b>Parent (PLUS) Loan</b>	\$200 and up; Award is based upon parent request and is limited by student's annual budget. See Loans page for more information.
<b>Federal Work Study</b>	\$2500 average award. Based on student eligibility. Amount may be adjusted based on departmental budget and need.
