UNA is dedicating the George Lindsey Archive at the George Lindsey UNA Film Festival next Friday, March 7 at 10 a.m.

The archive will be located in the Collier Library Archives on the second floor. The archive will be a dedication to UNA graduate George Lindsey and his life long excellence in the entertainment industry.

Lindsey donated films, scripts, and memorabilia to the archives in 1990. Some of his donations include original scripts from most of the television shows and movies Lindsey was cast in. Lindsey also has donated awards and plaques to the archives that he received throughout his career.
