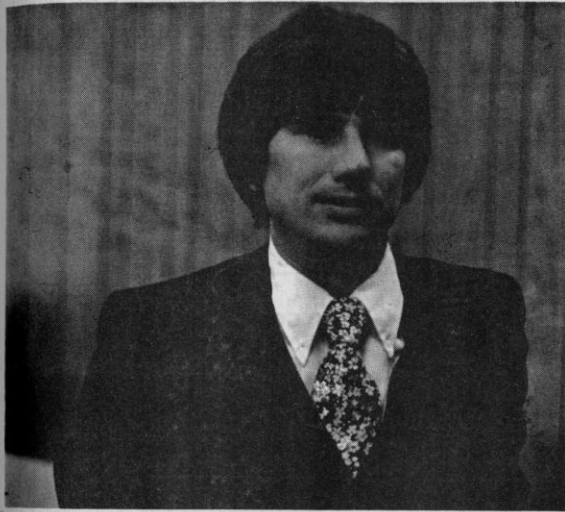


Heath new head of library staff



DR. HEATH

The appointment of Dr. Fred M. Heath as university librarian at UNA was announced recently by Dr. William L. Crocker, dean of Faculty and Instruction.

"Dr. Heath joins the UNA staff from Radford University in Virginia where he served six years as assistant director of the library," Dr. Crocker said. "In the newly-created position of university librarian, Dr. Heath's responsibilities will include Collier Library and media and library-type services throughout the campus. This is being done in order to coordinate and facilitate better services for the student body."

As for his goals at UNA, Dr. Heath said, "I want to be completely sure of needs for change. I plan to consider all of the holdings of information and resources on campus for possible integration.

This would not be a short-term effort, but one which will allow us to move in a cooperative way."

A native of Enterprise, Dr. Heath attended Indian Springs School but graduated from Enterprise High. He received his B.S. degree in history from Tulane University in 1966. Dr. Heath took officer training through Tulane's Air Force ROTC program, but received a deferment in order to attend the University of Virginia where he received his Master's degree in Russian history.

"I was called to active duty in 1968," Dr. Heath said, "and I spent four years in the Air Force with a team specifically assigned to analyze the U.S. effort in Vietnam."

Dr. Heath said that three of those four years of study were spent at Maxwell Air Force Base in Montgomery.

"We had access to some highly sensitive materials encompassing all departments of all branches of service," he said. "I spent many hours in research in the National Archives in Washington. This was good experience for a young historian."

Out of the Air Force in 1972, Dr. Heath received the Master of Library Science degree a year later at Florida State University.

After one year as reference librarian at the University of Richmond, he moved to his position at Radford. Dr. Heath received the Ed.D. degree in education administration from nearby Virginia State. His dissertation was entitled "The Policy-Making Role of the State Council of Higher Education in Virginia."

He said that his training in administration has been beneficial as both teacher and librarian.

Dr. Heath's wife, the former Jean Benton of Enterprise, will remain in Virginia for a time where she is children's librarian for the state.

"She is regional consultant for 28 counties in overseeing children's programs in public libraries," he said. "She is considering enrolling in the Master of Business Administration degree program at UNA."

As a point of human interest, Dr. Heath informed that his mother-in-law, Mrs. Martha Bain Benton, attended UNA in the early 1920s when the school was called State Normal.

The Heaths have a daughter, Laura, 10, who attends Powell School.

The family enjoys participating in almost all water sports, including sailing, canoeing, and swimming. Dr. Heath is also a golfer.
