Many of the Notable Books of 1973 will be on display. They are selected by the Notable Books Council, Reference and Adult Services Division, of the American Library Association.

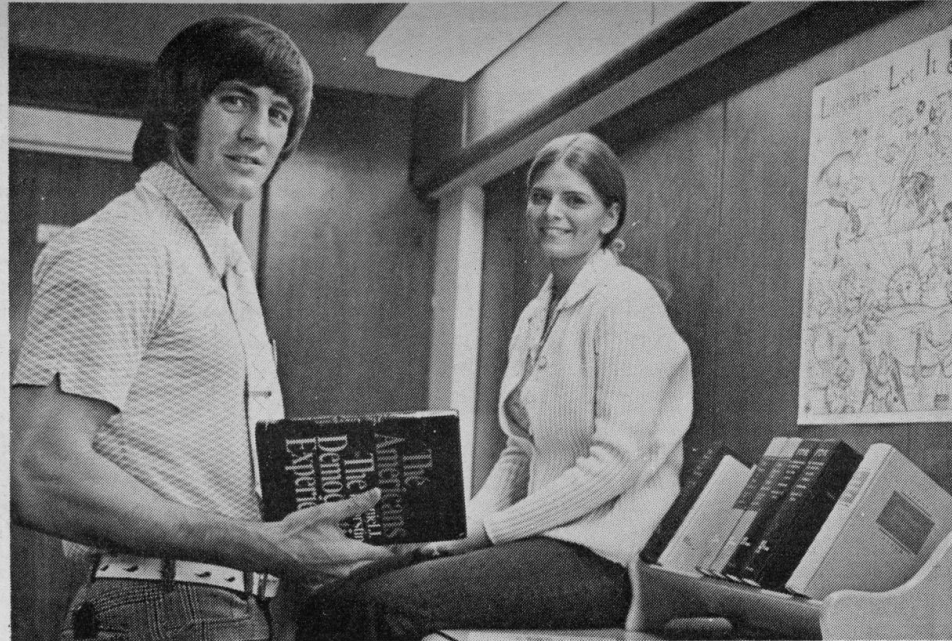
LIBRARIANS ATTEND STATE MEETING
