

# Library Personnel Asks For Student-Faculty Support

This year at Florence State College the students and faculty have the privilege of using the new library wing.

Freshmen can not realize how needed this new wing was, but

any upper-classman who has had to study or work in the old library knows what a blessing the new wing is to the school.

Many things have been added to the library-study carels, better stacks, smoking areas and a new reading room.

There have also been some changes in the rules. Students and faculty are asked to use the correct entrance and exit. There will be library staff members at the exit to check the books of each student who wishes to leave the library. This means all books which a person may have with him when leaving the library, whether they are library books or not, will be examined. Not only books will be checked, but handbags and brief cases will also be checked before leaving the library. This is not meant to be an insinuating precaution but merely to eliminate the problems of disappearing books from the library shelves. This is also to insure more accurate inventory of the source materials when it is taken. Miss Ruth Dacus, head librarian, has asked the cooperation of both students and faculty in executing this program.

It has been suggested that upperclassmen and some freshmen who did not have a tour of the new wing come by the library and pick up a copy of the diagram showing the entire library placement plan.

If there are questions, personnel at the checkout desk or librarian's office will furnish further information concerning the library.

In using the library, do not forget that it is new and that it must be used for many years to come. It is up to everyone on campus to help keep the library in good shape for better service.

application for the test) should be obtained six weeks in advance of the desired testing date from Law School Admission Test, Educational Testing Service, Princeton, New Jersey, or from the Office of Student Affairs on the campus. Applications must reach ETS at least two weeks before the desired testing date.

The Graduate Record Examinations, required of applicants for admission to a number of graduate schools, as well as by an increasing number of donors of graduate fellowships, will be conducted five times during this year. This fall candidates may take the GRE on Saturday, Nov. 17. In 1963 the dates are Jan. 19, March 2, April 27, and July 6. Each applicant should inquire of the graduate school of his choice which of the examinations he should take and on which dates.

The GRE tests offered will include a test of general scholastic ability as well as advanced level tests of achievement in seventeen different major fields of study.

A Bulletin of Information for candidates, containing an application and providing details of registration and administration as well as sample questions, may be obtained from Educational Testing Service, Princeton, New Jersey, or from the Office of Student Affairs on campus. A completed application must reach the Educational Testing Service office at least fifteen days before the testing date for which the candidate is applying.
