

LIBRARY SCIENCE ADDED THIS FALL TO THE CURRICULUM

Junior, Seniors Enroll With Miss Emerson In New Course

For the first time at S. T. C. students may study library science. This new course is designed "for students who wish to be teacher-librarians in high schools. The work includes how to organize a small library; how to catalog and classify books; how to maintain a shelf list and accession records; where and how to order books and supplies; how to select books; where to obtain free and inexpensive materials; how to organize a clipping, pamphlet and picture file." The students enrolling in this course meet with Miss Myrtle Emerson, college librarian, for two regular class periods a week. They also spend five hours a week actually working in the various departments of the library in order to gain experience.

Fourteen juniors and seniors have enrolled in the course, which is limited to fifteen members of these two classes.
