

THE LIBRARY ADDS MANY NEW BOOKS

Valuable Works Are Given By Faculty

VOLUMES FROM LIBRARY OF LOVED TEACHER

More than one thousand books have already been added to the library this year, according to a recent statement from Miss Emerson, librarian. The greater part of this number includes valuable gifts from faculty and former faculty members.

A fine collection of books on education, psychology, and curriculum were contributed by Dr. Houchell, who, this summer, accepted a position in Virginia. The late Miss Bratton, beloved faculty member, left an invaluable group of books to the library including many sociology reference works. Miss Simpson of the English department was the recent donor of many interesting volumes for use by English students.

History students will profit greatly by the fine set of "Messages and Papers of the Presidents" in twenty volumes recently given by Dr. Willingham's brother.

In addition to these gifts, the librarian reports that approximately 200 volumes of bound magazines have been received, and about sixty agricultural yearbooks, mineral resources reports, and statistical abstracts of the United States have been received from Washington.

New books for each department have been ordered and these books will be published as soon as they are available to students, Miss Emerson states.
