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University of North Alabama Students and Faculty at a Glance:

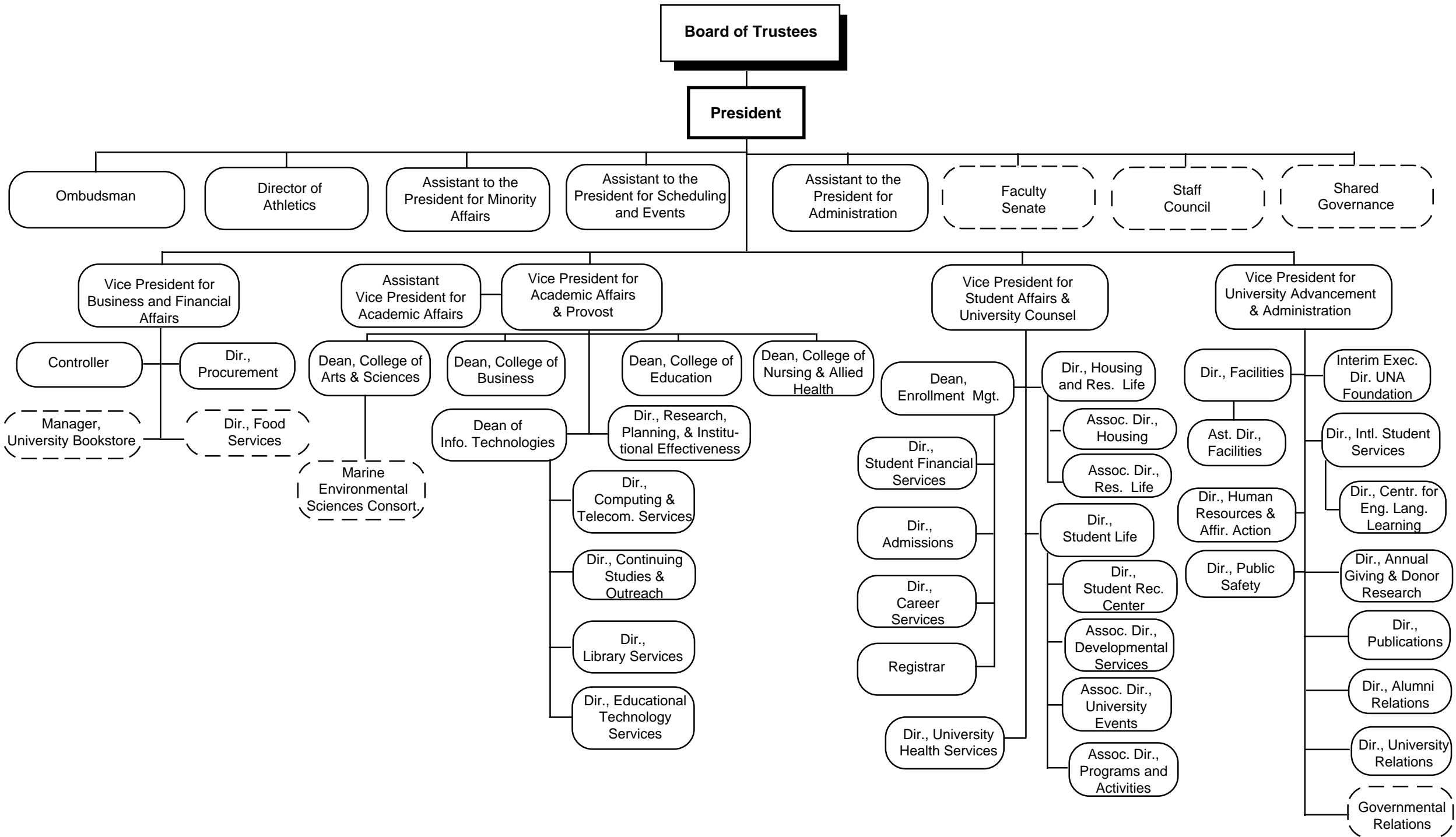
Student Profile - Fall 2004

- * **Number of Students** 5,971 total students of which 5,200 (87%) are undergraduate students and 771 (13%) are graduate students.
- * **Status of Students** 4,435 (74%) are full-time students and 1,536 (26%) are part-time students
- * **Gender of Students** 3,436 (58%) are female and 2,535 (42%) are male
- * **Age of Students** 72% of all students are less than 25 years of age, 26% of all students are 25 to 49 years of age, and 2% of the students are 50 years and older.
- * **Ethnicity of Students** 75% are white, 9% are black, 2% are American Indian/Alaskan Native, 7% did not report ethnic group, 5% are International, and 2% are from other ethnic groups
- * **Residency of Students** 74% are residents of Alabama, 10% are residents of Tennessee, 5% are residents of Mississippi, 5% are from 36 other states, and 6% from 42 foreign countries
- * **Housing of Students** 19% of undergraduate students live in student housing

Faculty Profile - Fall 2004

- * **Number of Faculty** 290 instructional faculty of which 200 (69%) are full-time and 90 (31%) are part-time
- * **Rank of Full-Time Faculty** 27% are professors, 27% are associate professors, 36% are assistant professors, and 10% are instructors
- * **Gender of Full-Time Faculty** 60% are male and 40% are female
- * **Ethnicity of Full-Time Faculty** 87% are white, 6% are black, and 7% are from other ethnic groups
- * **Credentials of Full-Time Faculty** 69% hold a doctoral degree and 73% are considered terminally prepared in their discipline.
- * **Tenure Status of Full-Time Faculty** 65% are tenured, 25% are non-tenured on tenure track, and 10% are on non-tenure track

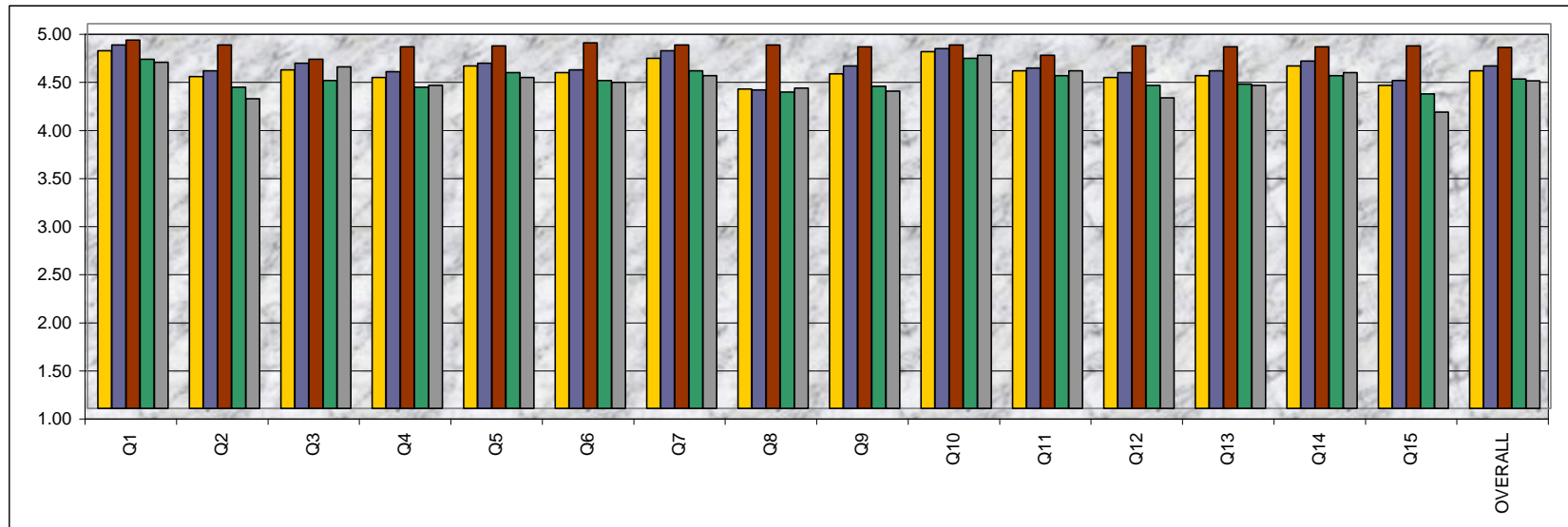

CAAP Mathematics Description

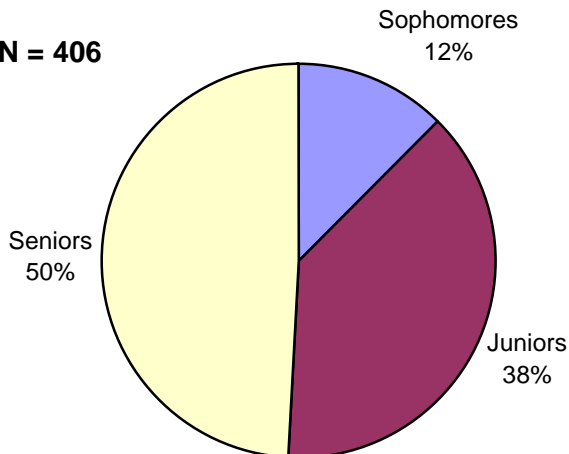
This 35-item, 40-minute test measures the student's mathematical reasoning ability to solve mathematical problems encountered in many postsecondary curricula. It emphasizes quantitative reasoning rather than the memorization of formulas. The content tested includes pre-, elementary, intermediate and advanced algebra; coordinate geometry; trigonometry; and introductory calculus.

Number of Students by Class*

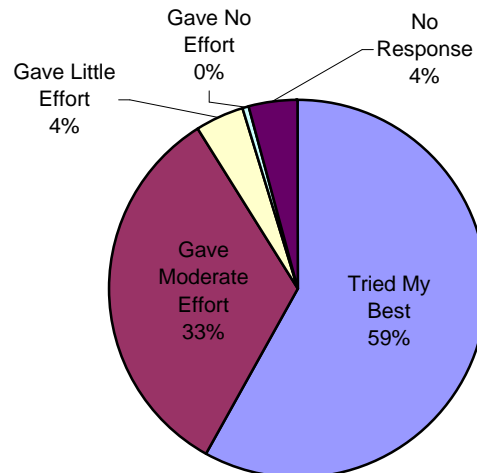

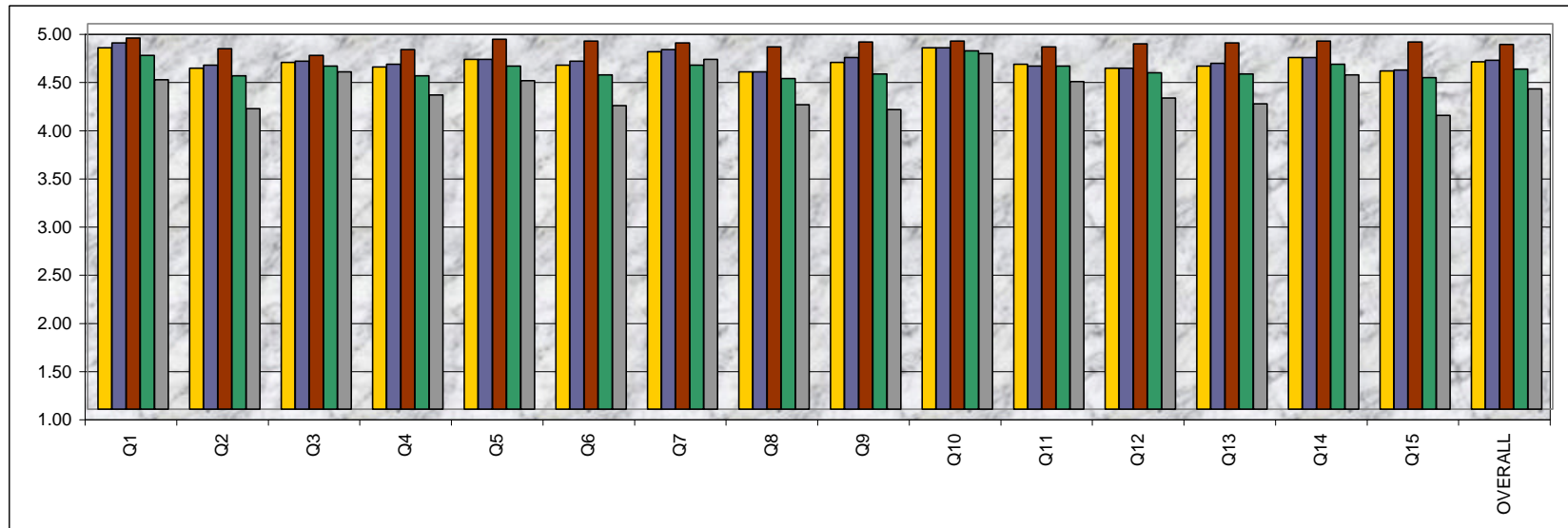

CAAP Reading Test - Spring 2005

CAAP Reading Description

The CAAP Reading Test is a 36-item, 40-minute test that measures reading comprehension as a combination of skills that can be conceptualized in two broad categories:

Referring Skills: Test items that focus on referring skills require the student to derive meaning from text by identifying and interpreting specific information that is explicitly stated. Typical items of this type require students to recognize main ideas of paragraphs and passages, to identify important factual information, and to identify relationships among different components of textual information.

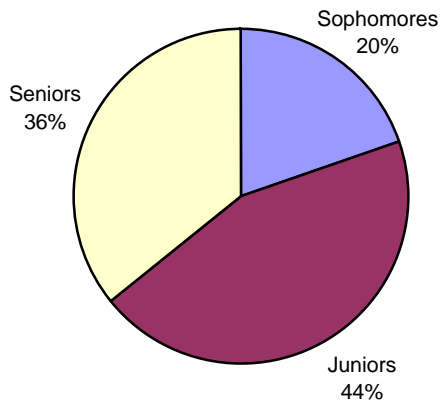
Reasoning Skills: Test items that focus on reasoning skills require students to determine implicit meanings and to go beyond the information that is explicitly presented. Typical items in this category assess students' ability to determine meaning from context, to infer main ideas and relationships, to generalize and apply information beyond the immediate context, to draw appropriate conclusions, and to make appropriate comparisons.

The Reading Test consists of four prose passages of about 900 words each that are representative of the level and kinds of writing commonly encountered in college curricula.

Number of Students by Class*

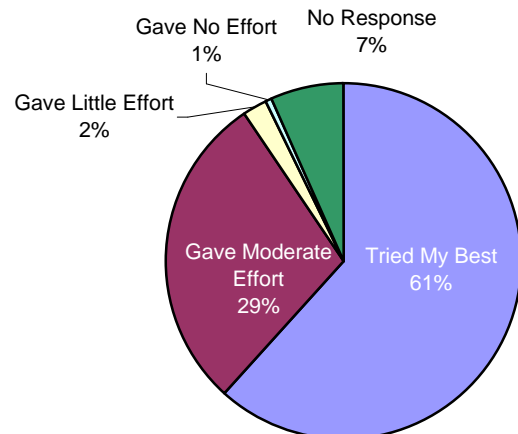

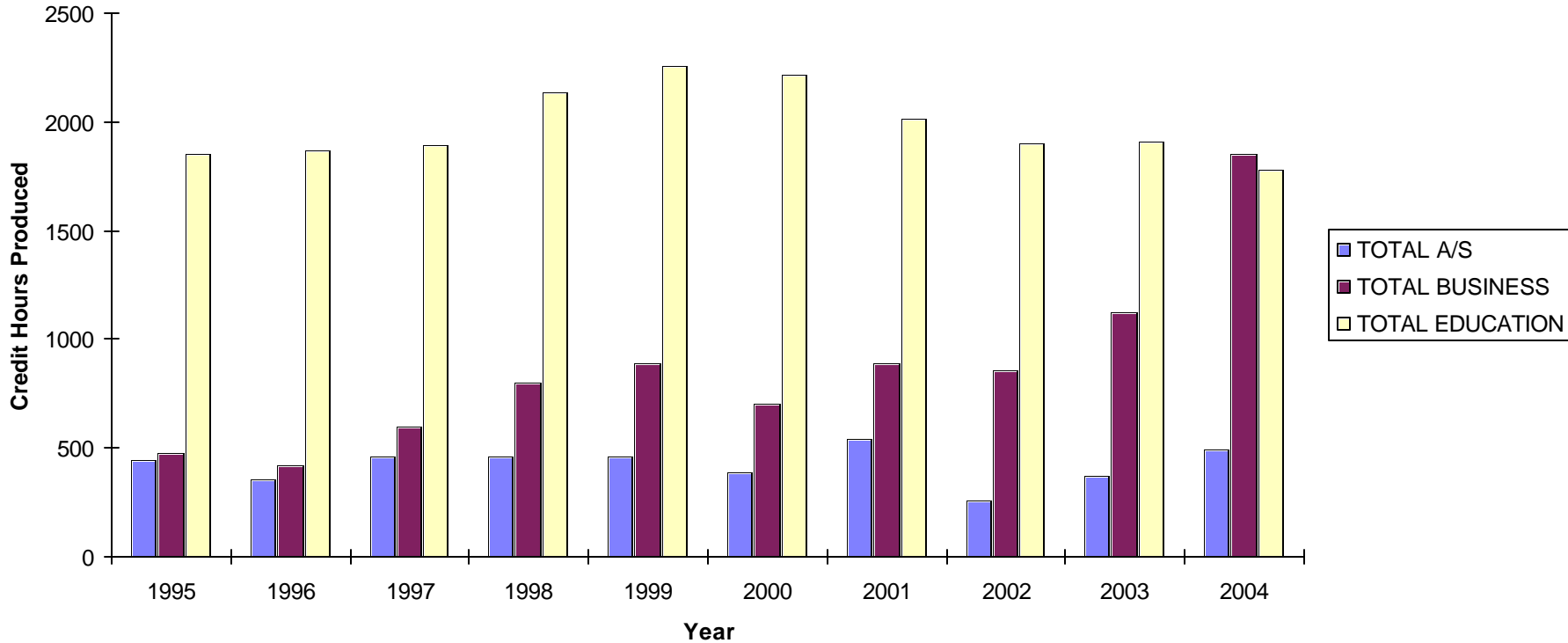

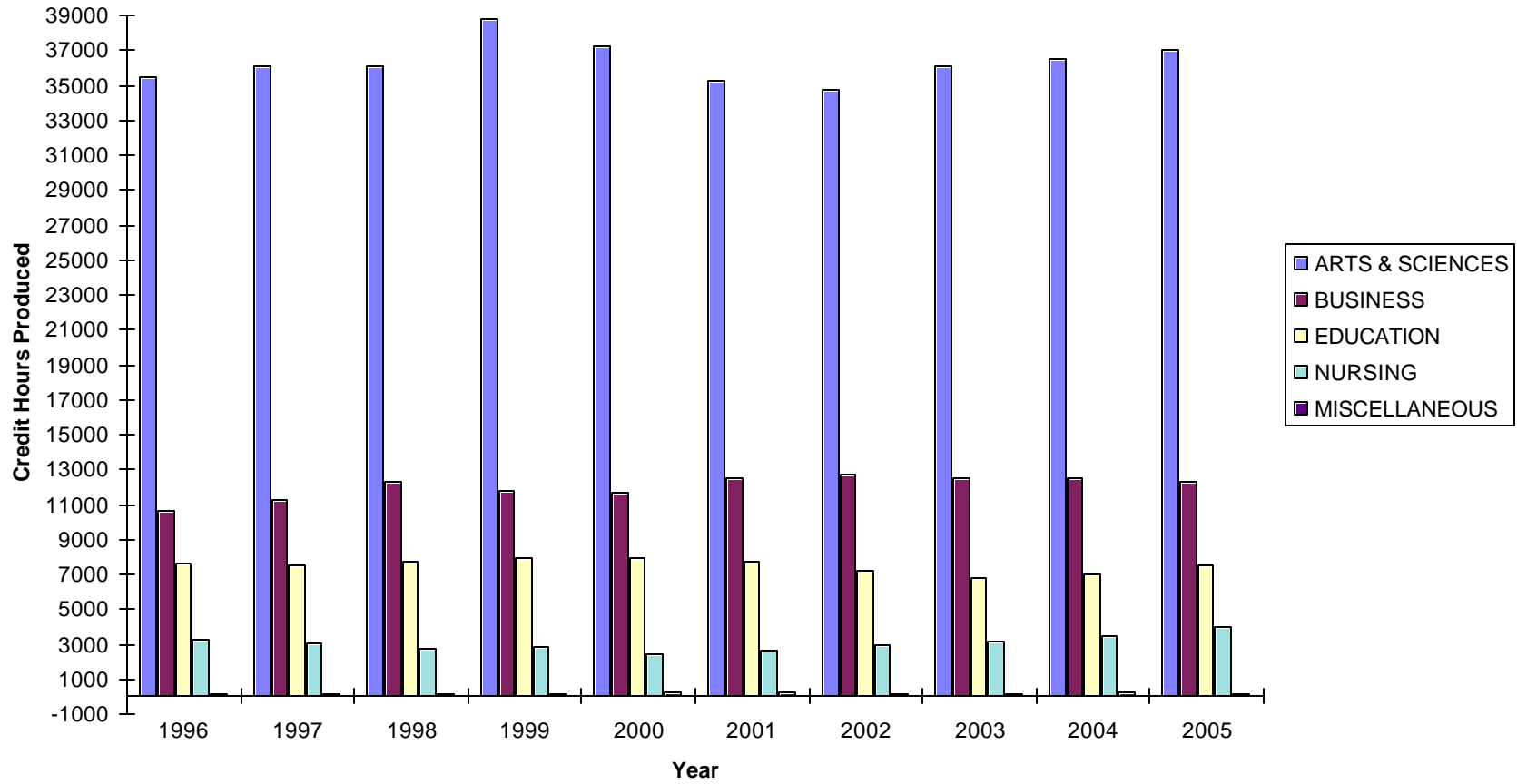

Combined Undergraduate and Graduate Credit Hour Production Spring 1996 - Spring 2005

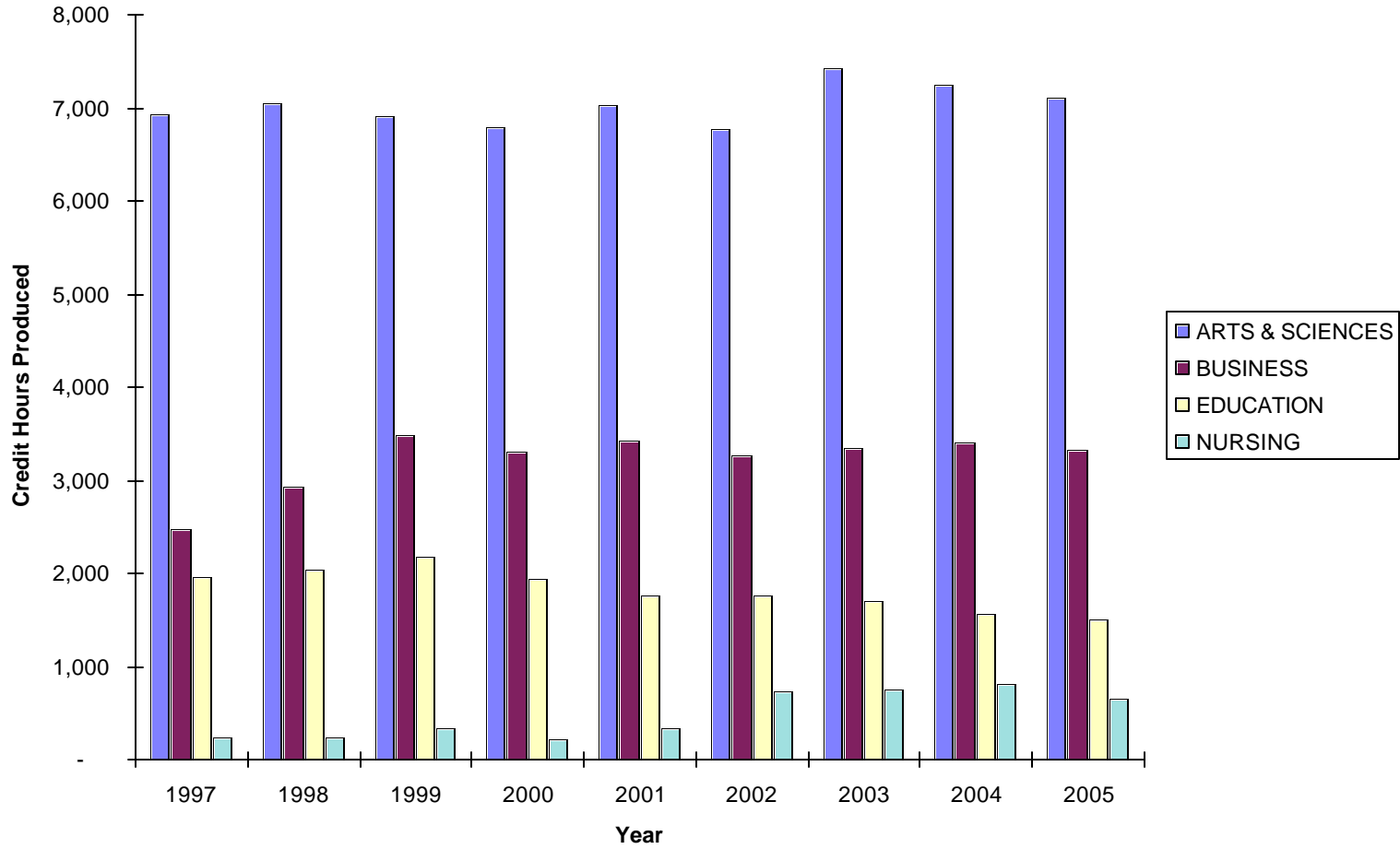

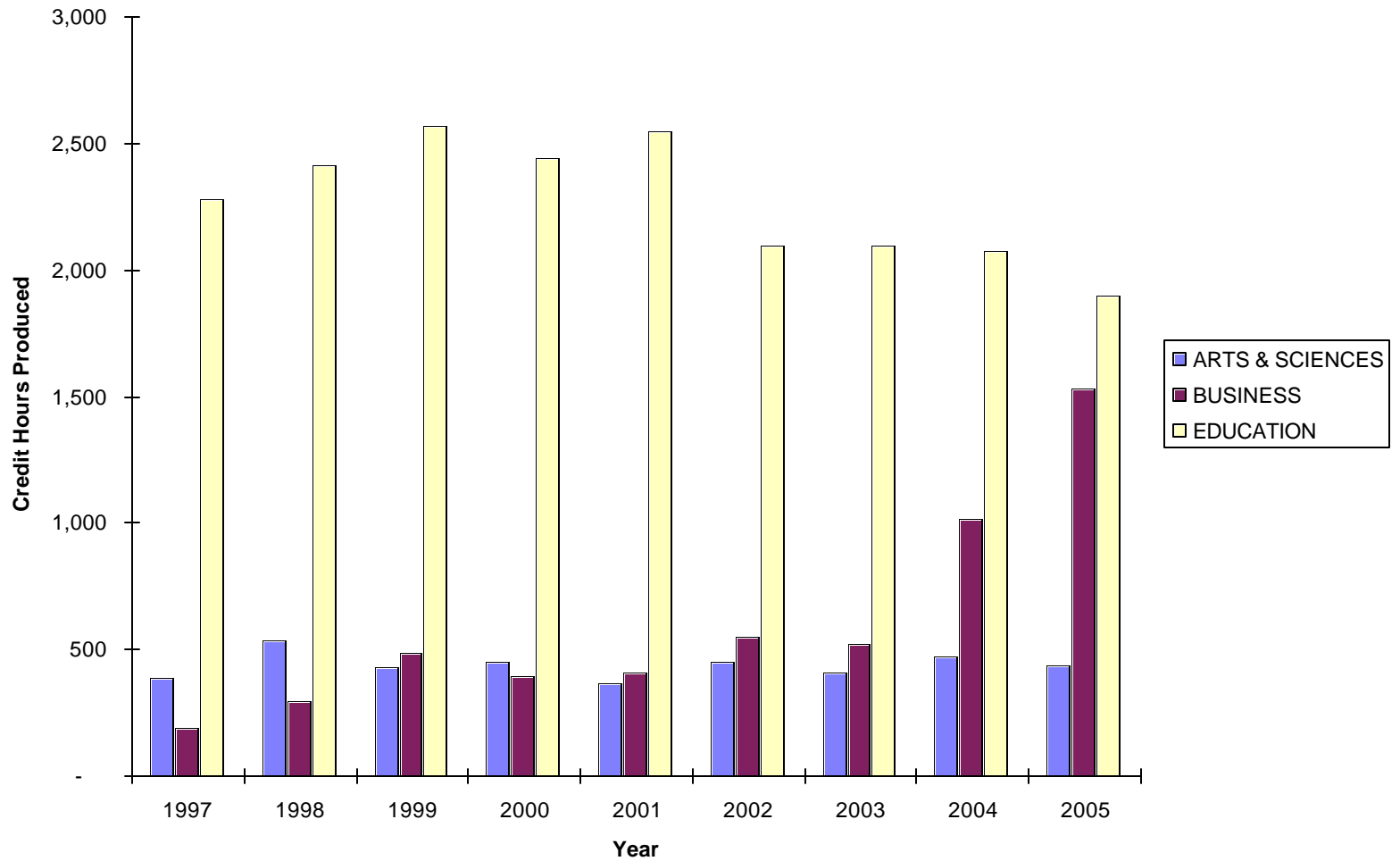

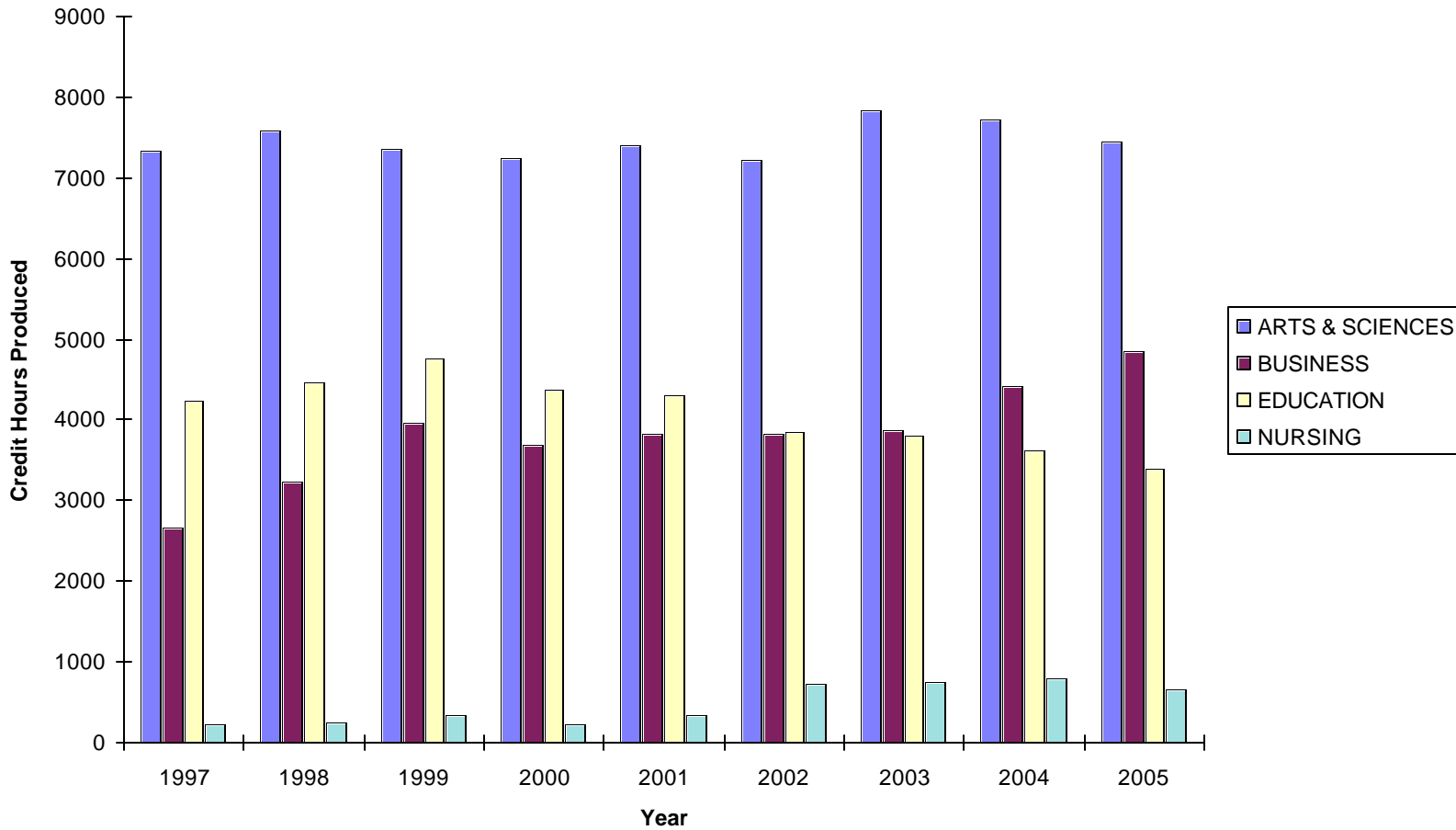
Undergraduate Credit Hour Production Summer 1997 - Summer 2005

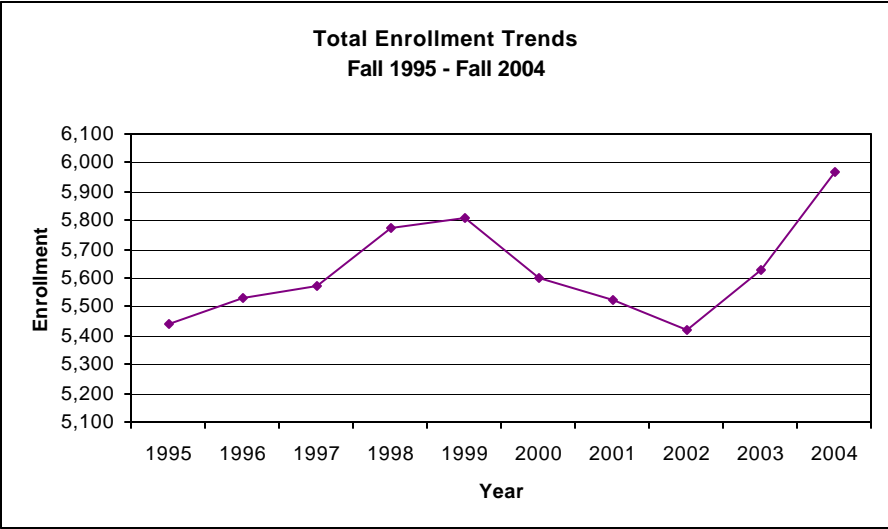
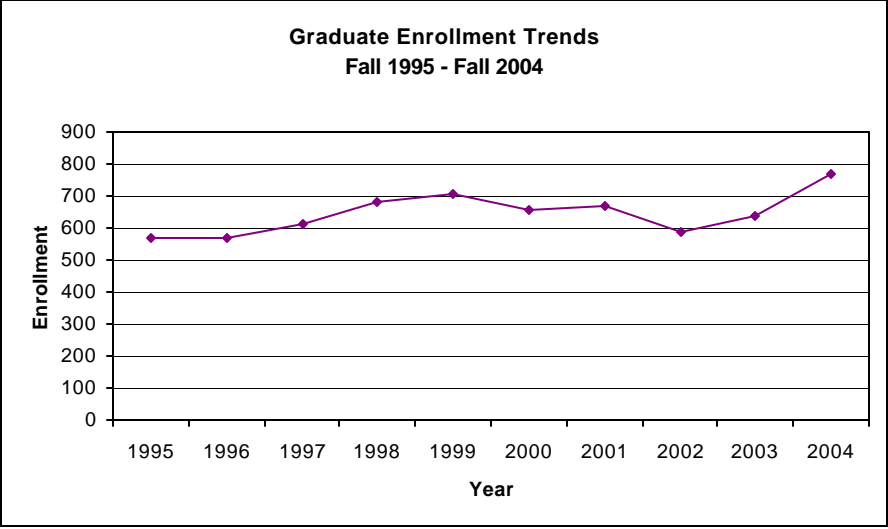
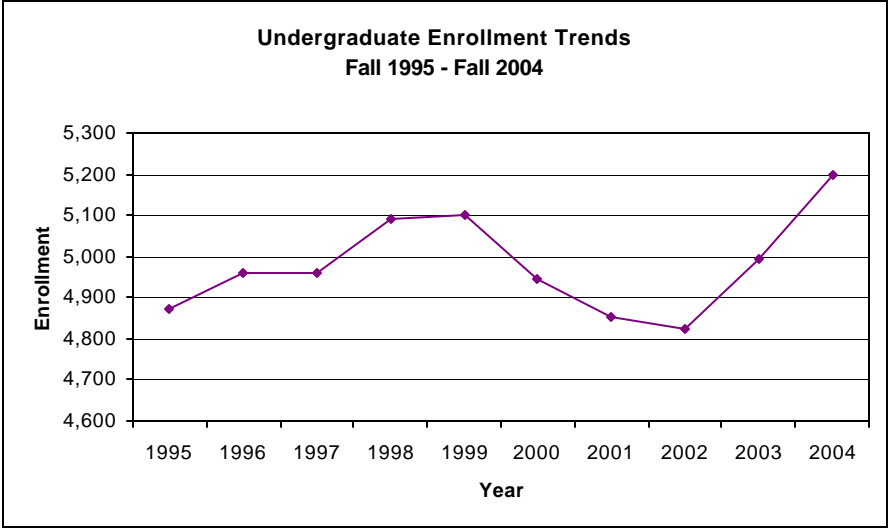


Summer Credit Hour Production - Total University Summer 1997 - Summer 2005

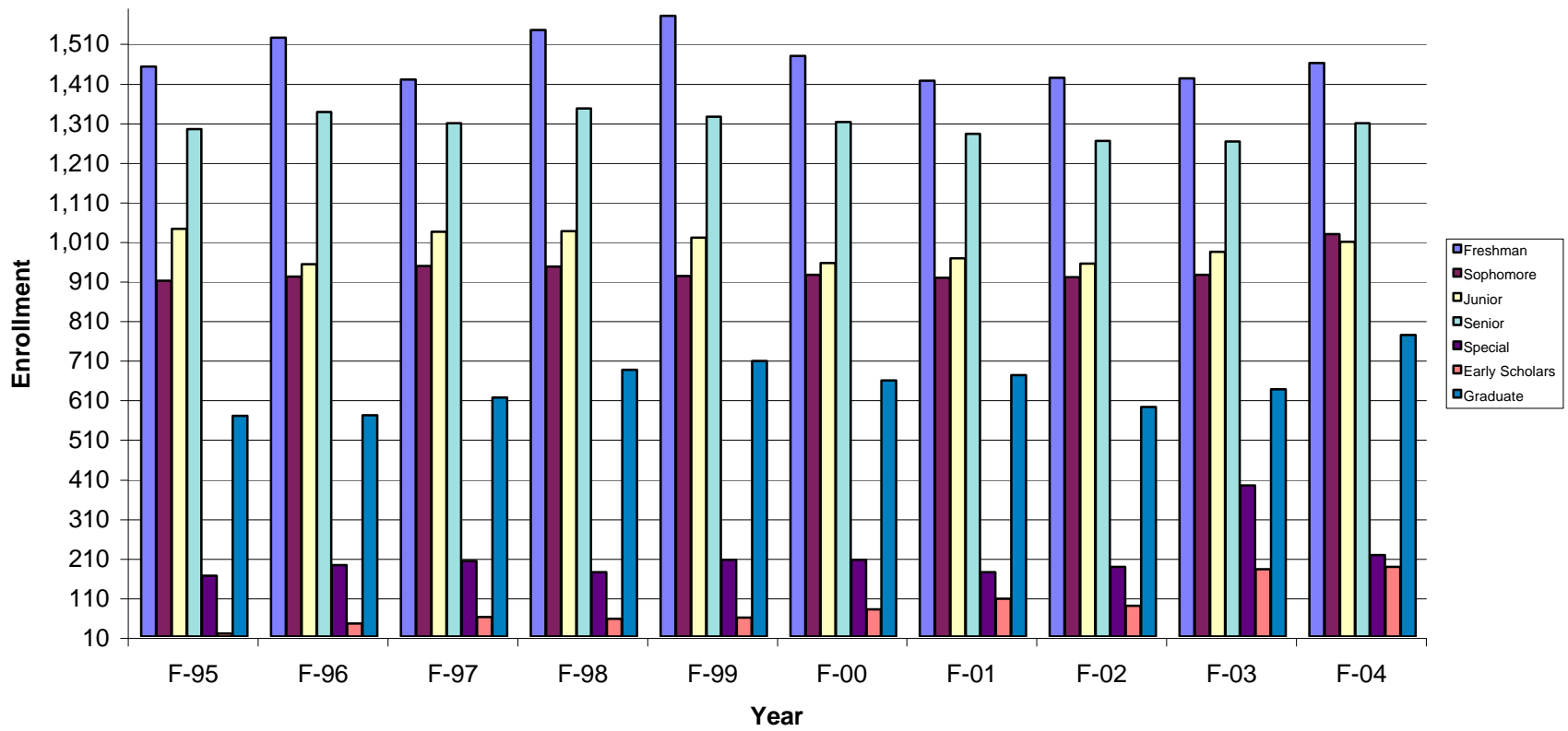

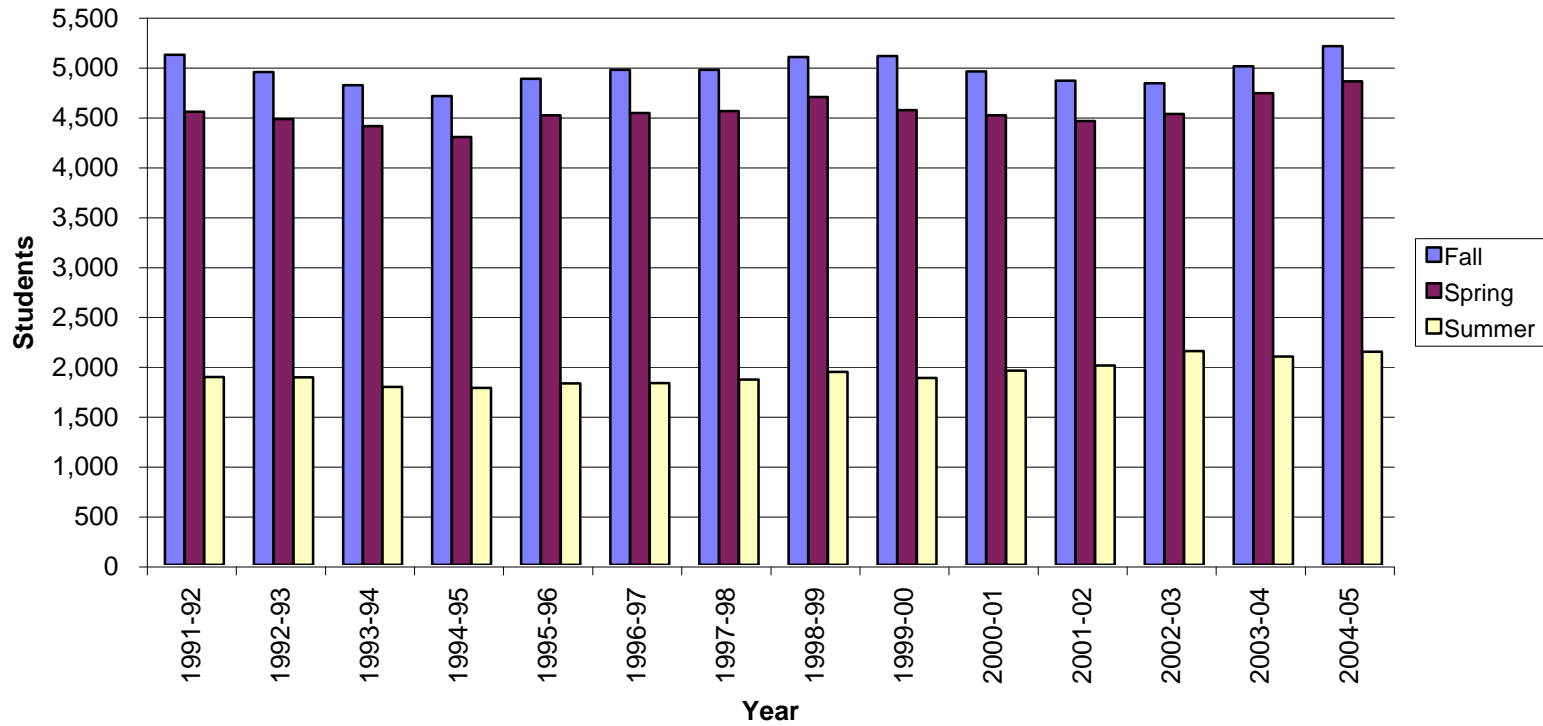
Enrollment Trends by Classification Fall 1995 - Fall 2004



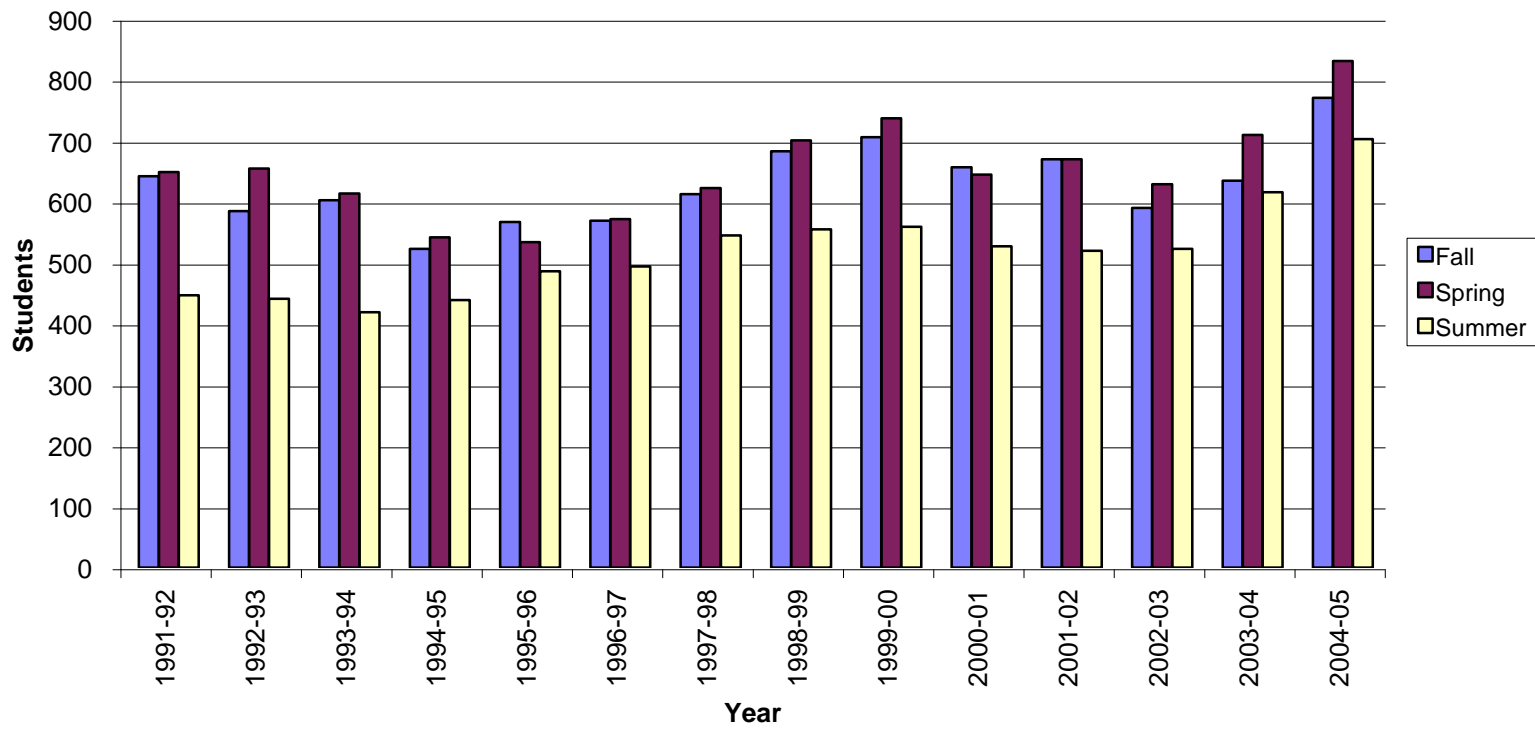

University of North Alabama Graduate Enrollment Trends by Semester



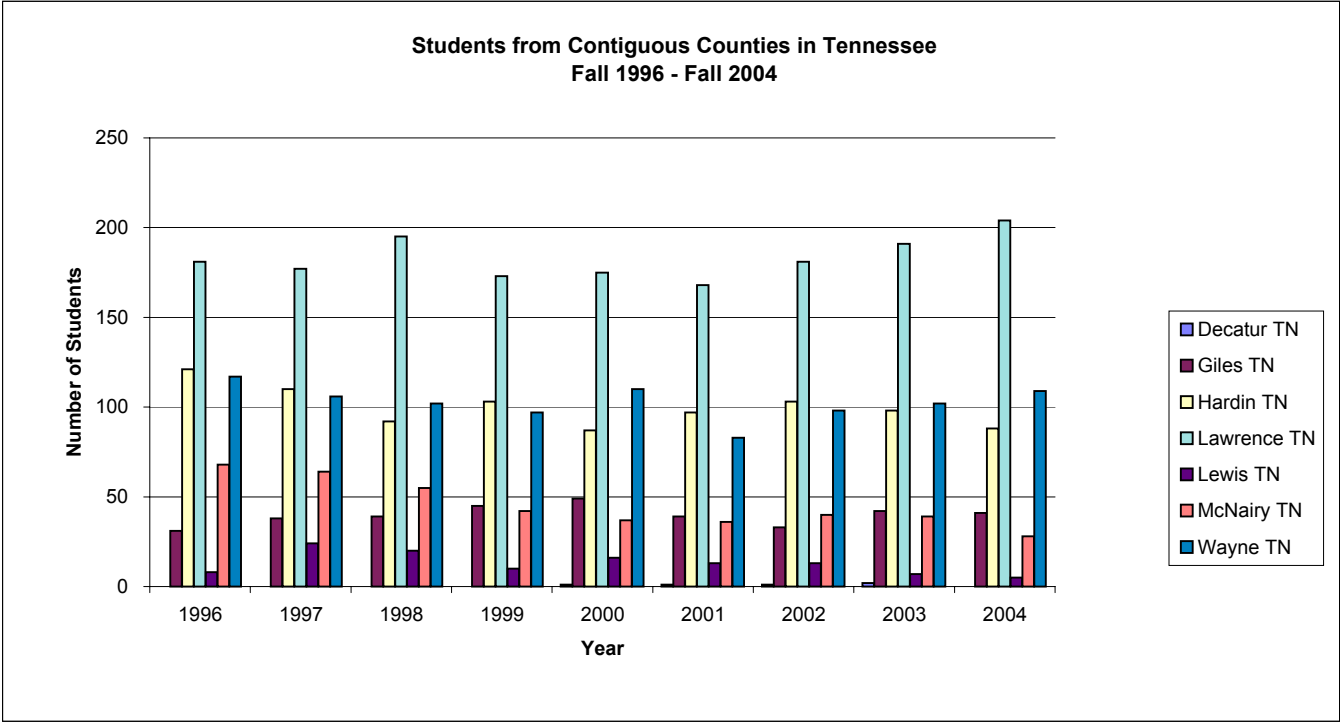
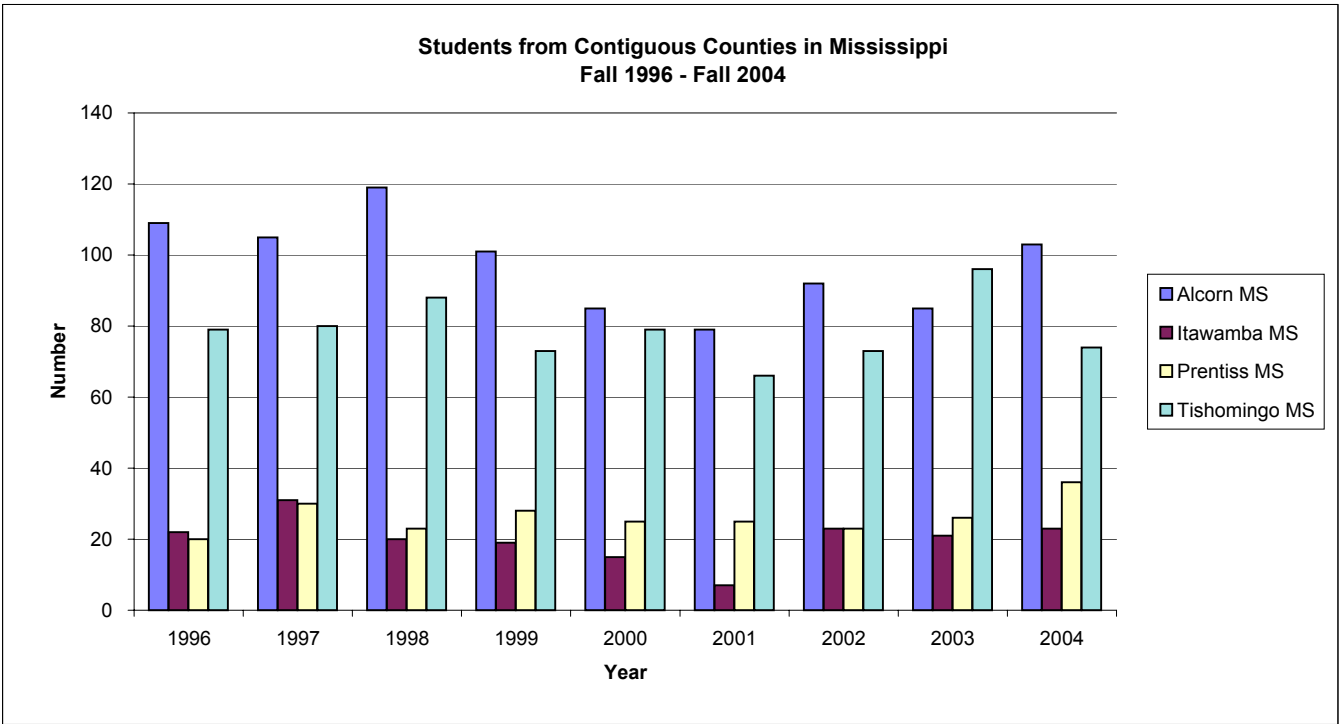

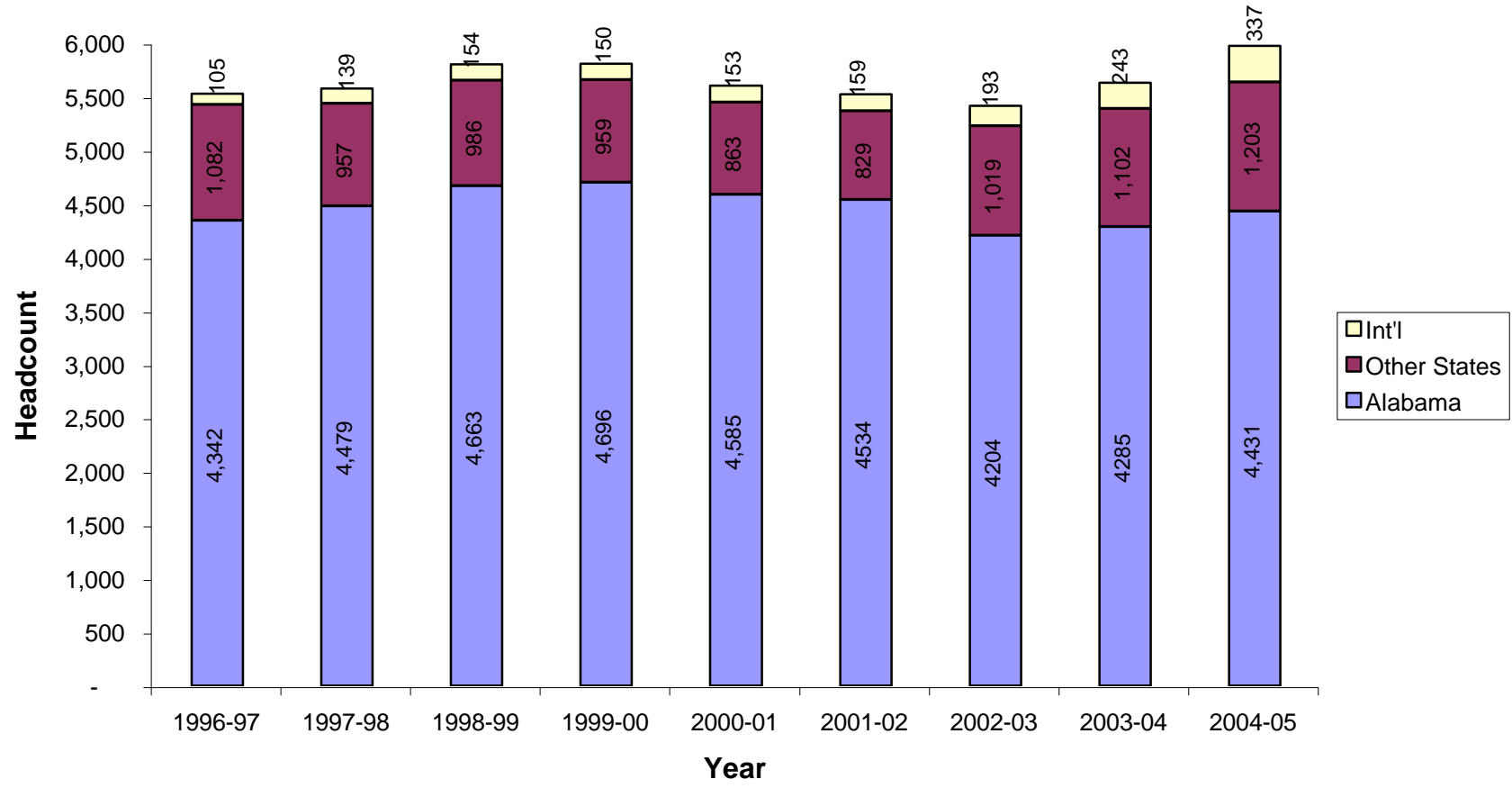

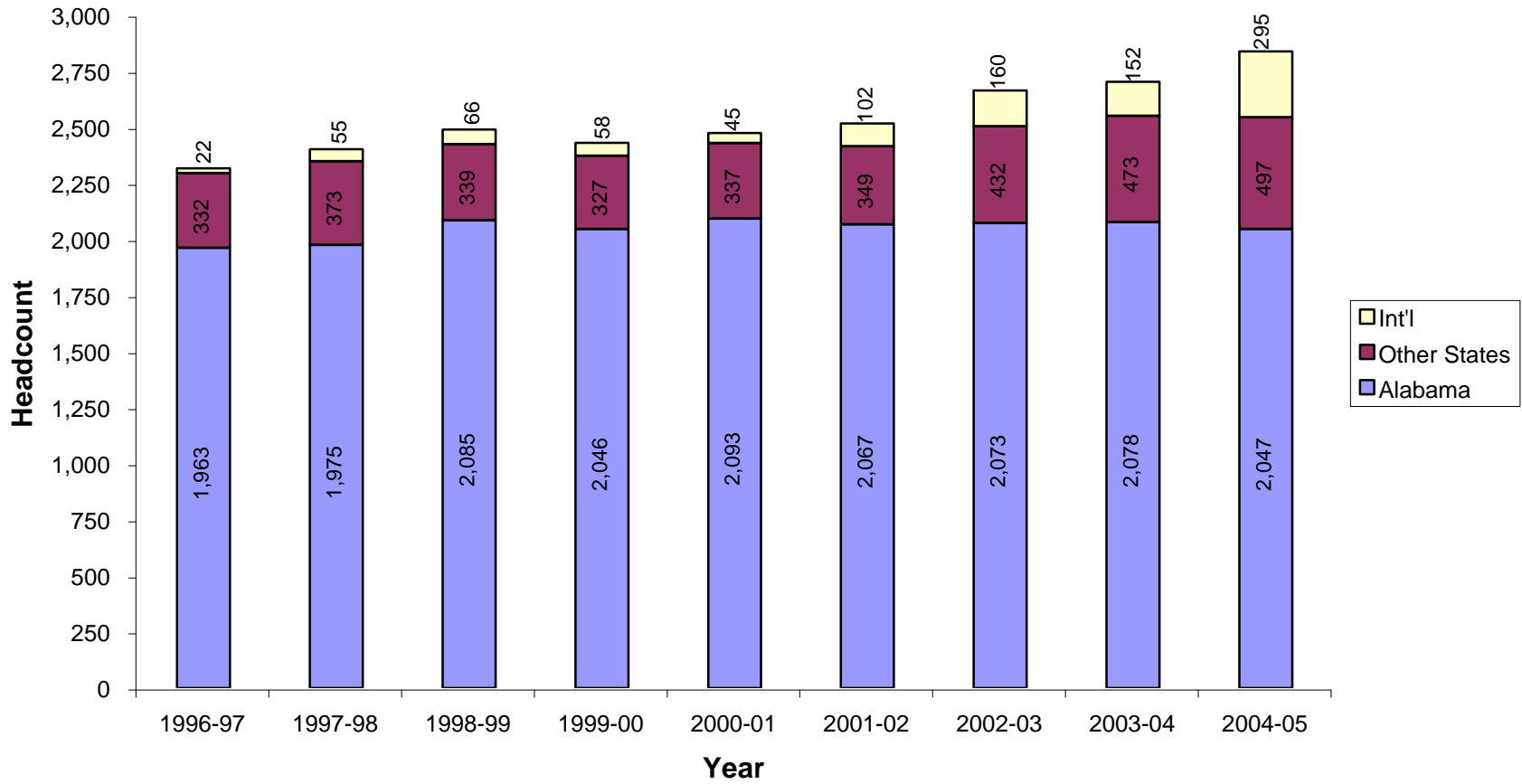
Student Headcount by Source Fall 1996 - Fall 2004



Student Headcount by Source Spring 1997 - Spring 2004



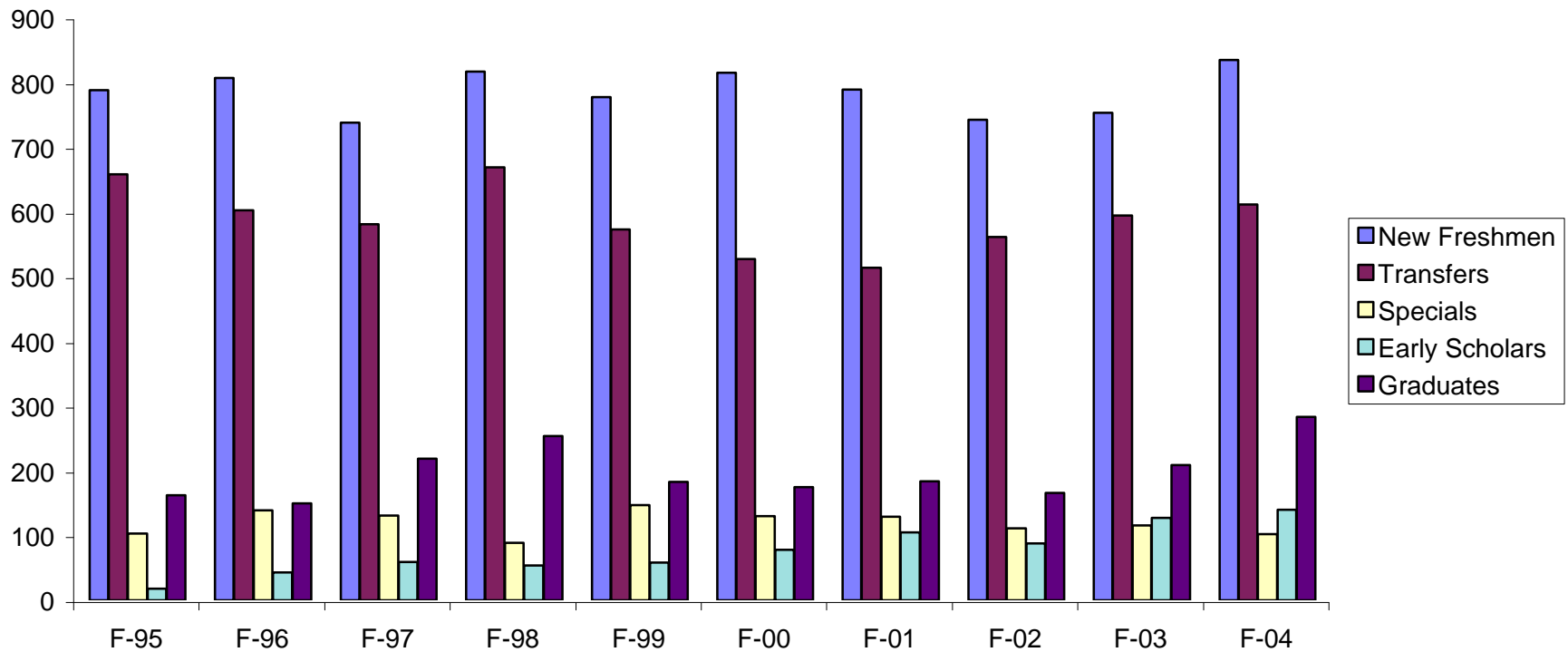
Student Headcount by Source Summer 1997 - Summer 2004

New Student Admissions Comparison Fall 1995 - Fall 2004

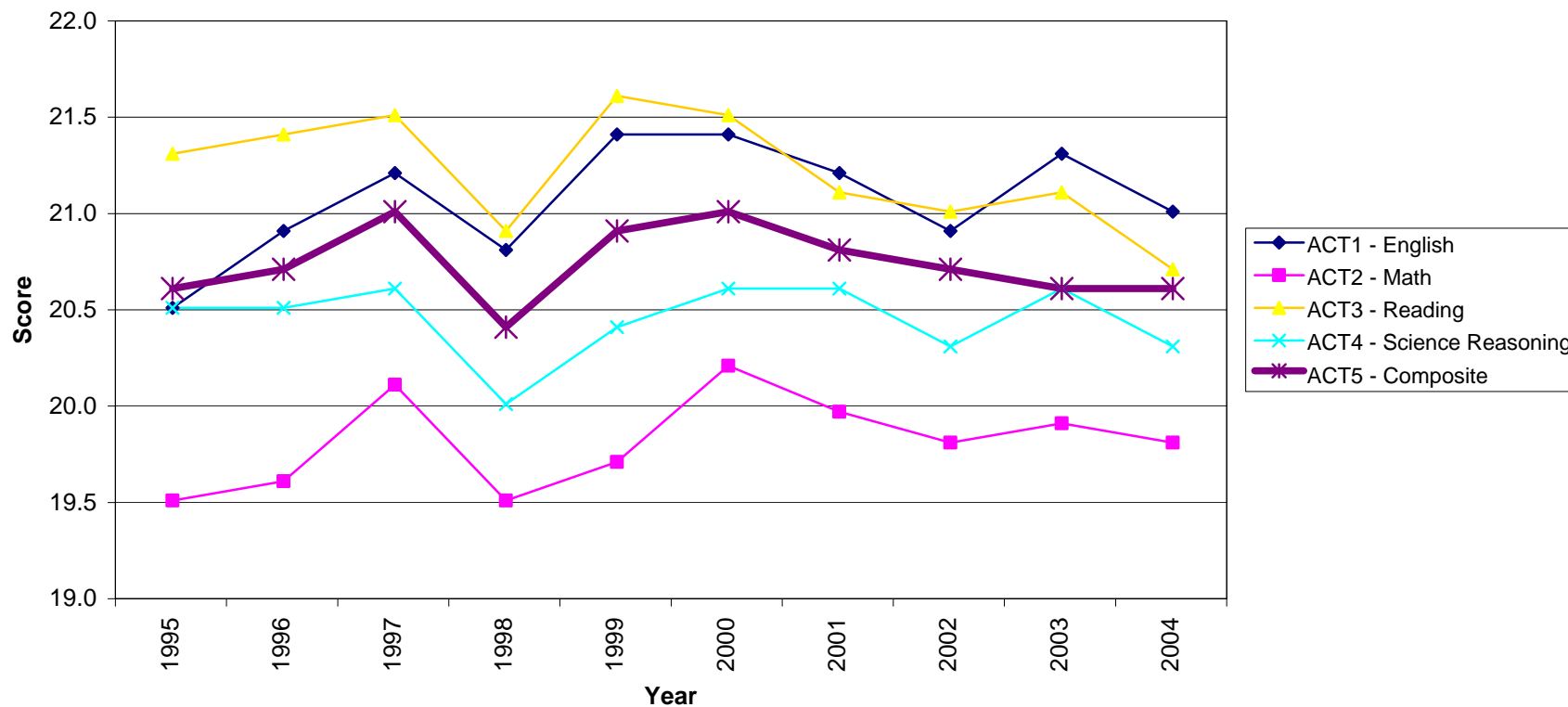

Fall 1995 - Fall 2004

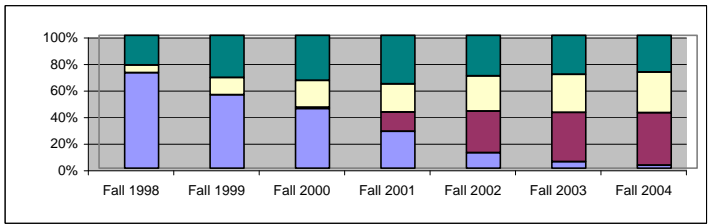

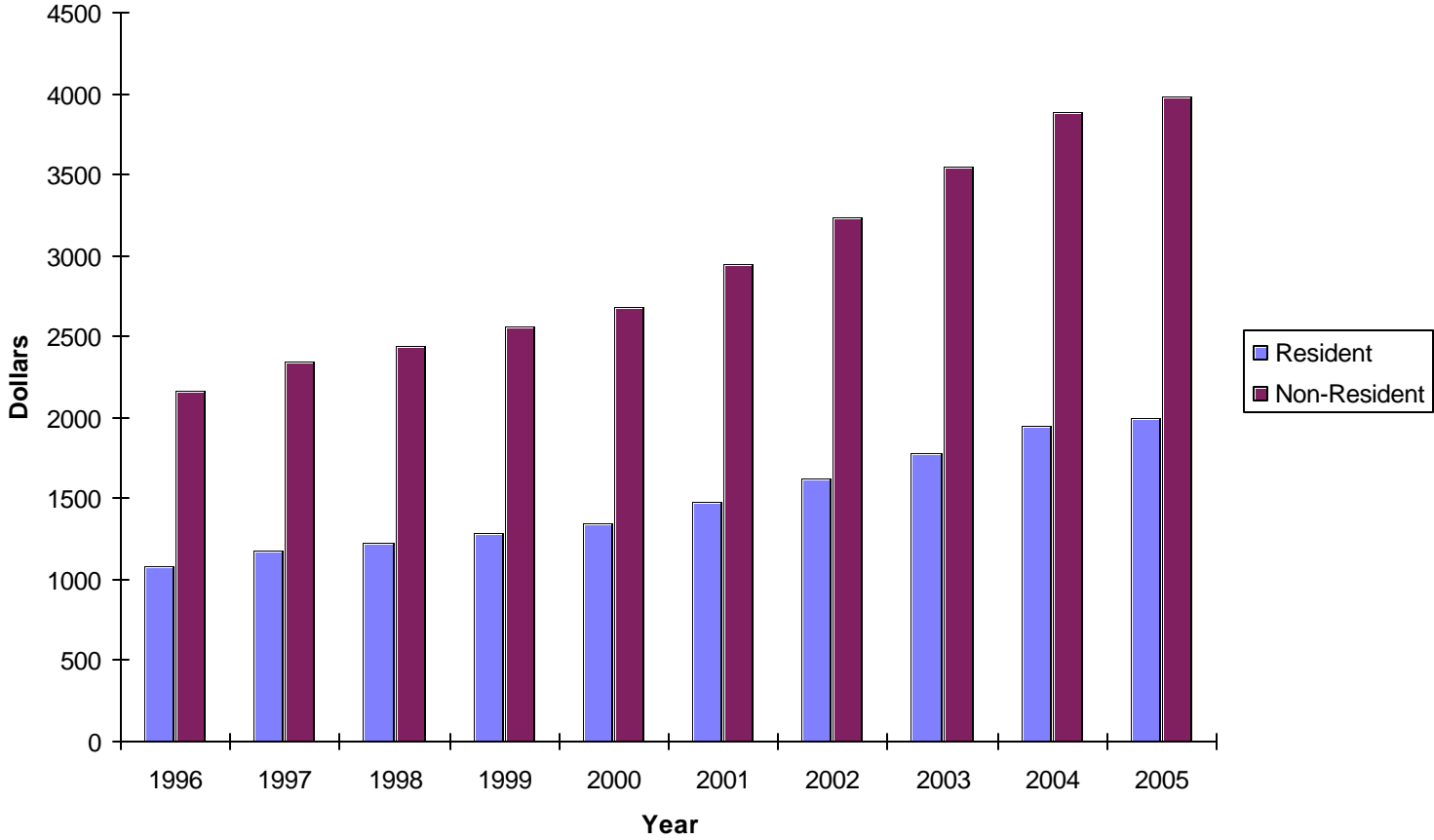

University of North Alabama Graduate Tuition 1996-2005

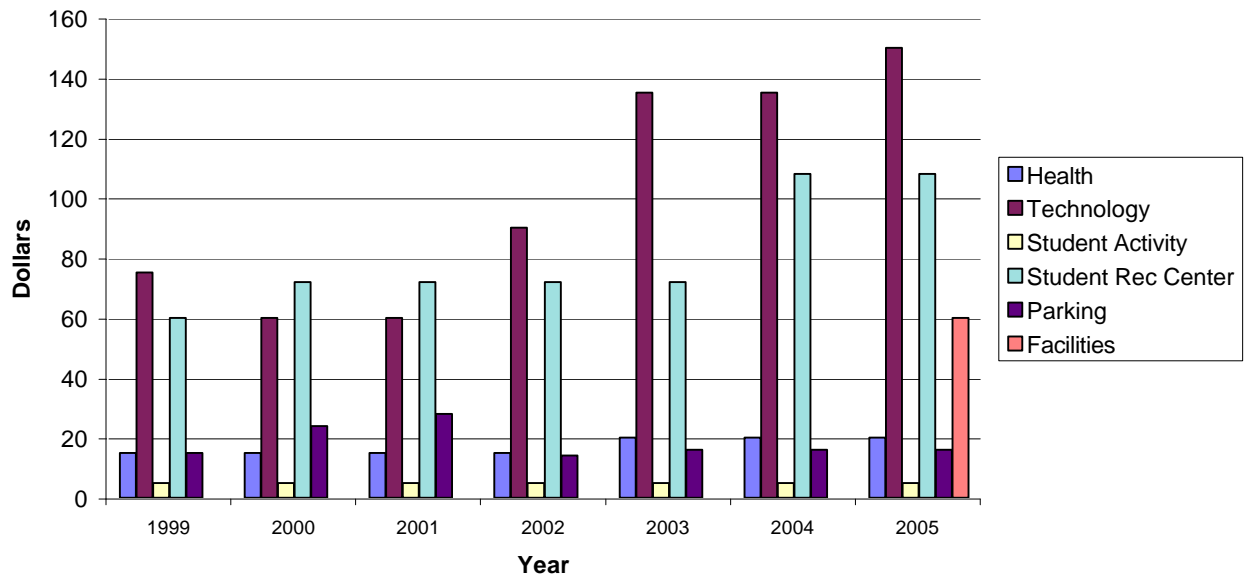

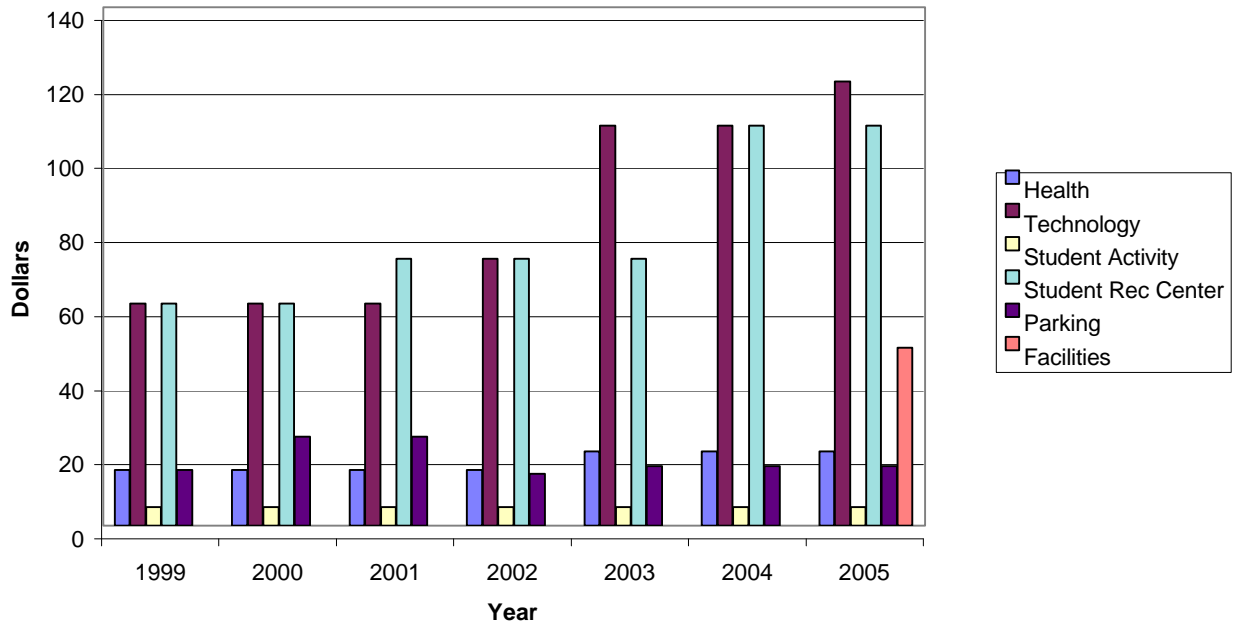
