- **1. Approval of Minutes from June 2, 2015:** The minutes were approved by consensus.
- 2. Arts and Sciences Advisory Council: Dean Burkhalter discussed the new A&S Advisory Council she has established. The initial board members are John Briggs, Tom Ross, Eve Rhea and Ann Whitaker. The Council's year one goals are: a) alumni engagement b) telling the A&S story c) academic support, including establishing a speaker series and study abroad support.
