




**Q:** How can I find my bank routing and account number?

Take a look at one of your checks. The routing number is the first string of numbers listed on the bottom left of the check. The account number is the second string of numbers.



**Q:** What if I don't have checks?

If you do not have checks, you will need to contact your bank or financial institution to obtain the bank routing number and your account number. It is important to note that, while routing numbers are common to most customers of your financial institution, your account number is a specific number assigned only to your account.



Your bank account number is **NOT** your debit card number.
