

Accelerated Master's Program (AMP)

Description

Through the Accelerated Master's Program (AMP), students can:

- Take up to 9 credit hrs of approved graduate courses concurrently with undergraduate courses.
- Substitute up to 9 credit hrs of approved graduate courses (in place of undergraduate courses) toward completion of the undergraduate degree.

Requirements for Admission to AMP

- Completion of 60 or more hours at UNA.
- Overall GPA 3.0 or higher in all undergraduate coursework.
- A or B on all coursework in a Kinesiology (or acceptable) major.
- Favorable vote by Department of Kinesiology (two-thirds vote).
- Approval by Chair of Department of Kinesiology.

Requirements for Continued Enrollment in AMP

- Students must maintain a 3.0 or higher with no grades lower than "C" in all courses following admission to the AMP.

- Enhanced credentials (accepted into and completed the UNA AMP).
- Students complete their Bachelor's degree having already completed 3-9 credit hrs applicable toward their Master's degree.
- Students can complete the BS and MS degree in a total of 5 years.
- Potential waiver of standardized testing (GRE, MAT) typically required for admission to the MS in Health and Human Performance and MS in Sport & Recreation Management degree plans.
