About the Conductors:

Rebecca Warren

Becky Rodgers Warren grew up in Decatur, Al. and graduated from Austin High School. She earned the Bachelors and Masters degrees from the University of North Alabama. She began teaching at Lynn High School followed by West Point High School. Her final 14 years in Alabama were at Ft. Payne High School. Her bands consistently received Superior ratings in concert, jazz and marching festivals. They performed and competed throughout the United States and London, England.

While in Alabama, Mrs. Warren was an active member of the music education profession serving as ABA Chairman for Districts 2 and 3, President-elect of the Alabama Bandmasters Association, and President of the Alabama Music Educators Association. While President of AMEA she founded *FAME- Future Alabama Music Educators* program for students interested in becoming music educators. Mrs. Warren has served as guest conductor throughout the southeast for various county and district honor bands as well as the University of North Alabama and the University of Alabama Honor Bands. She has served on the summer camp staffs at Troy University, Wallace College, and Auburn University. She conducted the 2021 Alabama All-State Middle School Band.

In 2008 she moved to Mandan, North Dakota where she continued teaching for 12 years. In North Dakota, she served as the West Region Band Representative to the Board of the NDMEA. Memberships include the North Dakota Music Educators Association, the Alabama Bandmasters Association, the National Band Association, and Alabama Phi Beta Mu as well as the North Dakota Phi Beta Mu where she served as President of the Alpha Gamma Chapter. During her tenure as President, the Chapter began awarding an annual scholarship to a high school senior in pursuit of a degree in instrumental music education. She also began the project to commission new works of band literature by composers Rob Grice, Aaron Perrine, and Tyler Grant. She conducted the South Dakota Junior High All-State Band in 2022. She served as a guest conductor at the International Music Camp. She is the 2021 NDMEA Distinguished Service Award recipient.

Rebecca Warren retired in 2020 after serving 40 years as a Band Director. In 2021 she founded *Warren Music Consulting*. Three of her clinics have been presented at the Midwest Band and Orchestra Clinic. She has provided in-service and professional development sessions for music educators as well as B.L.T.- Band Leadership Training for students in North Dakota, South Dakota, Iowa, and Illinois. She continues to serve the band community and music educators in the hopes of "paying it forward" in ways that educators helped her throughout her career. She credits her success to Bill Brunner, director at Austin High School and Edd Jones, director at U.N.A.

She resides on the prairie of North Dakota with her husband John, a retired band director, and their Golden Retriever, Bama.

Tiffany Elkins

Originally from Tuscumbia, Alabama, Tiffany Elkins is the Director of Bands at East Central Community College in Decatur, MS. She leads the Wall O' Sound Marching Band, Concert Band, EC Jazz Band, and Basketball Pep Band. Ms. Elkins is also the choir director at Newton United Methodist Church in Newton, MS.

Ms. Elkins holds a Bachelor of Science in Instrumental Music and a Master of Arts in Instrumental Music Education from the University of North Alabama, as well as a Master of Music in Trumpet Performance from the University of Florida. She was awarded graduate assistantships with the UF Gator Marching Band and the UNA Marching Pride. While obtaining her master's at UNA, she assisted the trumpet studio as an adjunct

professor. She also performed regularly with the Shoals Symphony Orchestra and local bands, including the Edd Jones Orchestra and Shoals Area Big Band. She is an Alumnus of Tau Beta Sigma Honorary Band Sorority.

Ms. Elkins is an active trumpet player and frequently performs with community theater organizations. She has performed abroad during the Vienna Summer Music Festival in Vienna, Austria, and the Festival des Anches d'Azur in La Croix-Valmer, France. She also marched as a member of several drum and bugle corps, including Memphis Sound, Spirit of Atlanta, and Carolina Crown.

Ms. Elkins currently resides in Decatur, MS with her two dogs, Ada and Leo. She enjoys kayaking and musical theatre.

Russ Thompson

Russ Thompson currently serves as Assistant Band Director at Decatur High School in Decatur, Ga. At Decatur HS, his primary responsibilities include Concert Band, IB Music, assisting with the marching band, and teaching beginning band in the upper elementary schools. Outside of teaching, Russ serves as the Executive Director of Atlanta CV Drum and Bugle Corps and serves as Assistant Conductor of the Atlanta Concert Band in Sandy Springs, GA. From 2014-2018, Russ was the Director of Bands at Woodland High School – Henry County, GA where he led a 150 member program consisting of three concert ensembles, percussion ensemble, the Wolfpack Marching Band, two Southern Association of Performance Arts Winter Guard Ensembles, a SAPA/WGI circuit Indoor Percussion Ensemble, and taught AP Music Theory. Russ served as Assistant Director of Bands/Instructor of Music at Campbellsville University, in Campbellsville, KY from 2012-2014 where his primary responsibilities were assisting the Director of Bands in all administrative, programming, and recruiting areas of the CU Band program. His undergraduate teaching responsibilities included; Conducting, Secondary Instrumental Methods and Literature, Marching Band Techniques, and Understanding Music.

In 2012, Russ completed the Master's of Music in Wind Band Conducting at Georgia State University as a student of Dr. Robert Ambrose and holds a Master's in Education degree from Auburn University where he also served as a Graduate Assistant with the Auburn University Bands. From 2008-2010, he served as the Director of Bands at Duluth High School in Duluth, Georgia and began his teaching career as band director at Lauderdale County High School from 2005-2007.

Russ is a 2005 graduate of the University of North Alabama, earning a Bachelor's of Music in Music Education. In addition, he has attended conducting classes with Frank Ticheli, Mallory Thompson, H. Robert Reynolds, Alan McMurray, Jerry Junkin, Gary Green, Mark Scatterday, Kevin Sedatole, John Lynch and Jamie Nix. He is a member of Georgia Music Educators Association, NAfME, American School Band Directors Association, and the National Band Association. Russ was invited to present at the 2017 GMEA, 2017 AMEA In-Service Conferences and the 2018 MidWest Band and Orchestra Clinic.

Kayla Sims

Mrs. Kayla Sims is a native of Athens, Alabama. She graduated top of her class from the University of North Alabama in 2016 with a Bachelor's degree in Instrumental Music Education. After graduation, Mrs. Sims worked as an Assistant Band Director in the Morgan County school system before moving to Madison City Schools. Mrs. Sims is currently the Band Director at Liberty Middle School in Madison, Alabama where she has taught for the last six years. Mrs. Sims is a member of the National Association for Music Education as well as the Alabama Bandmasters Association.

About the UNA Bands

Membership in the UNA Bands is open to all UNA students with prior high school band experience. A student does not have to be a music major to participate. Almost 65% of the current band members are non-music majors and represent nearly every academic field on campus. The UNA Majorettes, Lionettes, and Color Guard are all members of the Band.

Band Performance Awards (scholarships) range from \$400-\$4000 per semester and are available to all members of the UNA Bands regardless of academic major. Students are encouraged to audition for a performance award prior to the beginning of the fall semester. Band Performance Awards are renewable throughout a student's academic career (4+ years), and students have the opportunity to audition for an award increase near the end of each spring semester.
