Professional Competencies

Commitment to Learning and Growth, Awareness, Humility, Empathy and Compassion, Ethical Responsibility to Self and Others, Interpersonal Skills, Oral Communication, Reliability and Dependability, Resilience and Adaptability, Service Orientation, Teamwork and Collaboration

Service & volunteer experiences

Evidence of a demonstrated concern for others, particularly with unmet needs, through a pattern of on-going, face-to-face, hands-on service.

Medically Related Experiences and Shadowing

Medical exposure is an essential part of being considered competitive for admission. Through experiences in a medical setting, you should develop an understanding of what happens when doctors and patients interact, gain insight into the patient's experience, and better understand what becoming a physician would mean to you.

Extracurricular Activities/Work Experience

Getting involved and building the above-mentioned professional competencies is critical to your development in becoming an exceptional physician. These activities will also help you develop effective time management skills.

Teamwork & Leadership roles

Experience collaborating with others toward a common goal. Ability to hold self and others accountable.

Research experience

Research experiences provide an opportunity to develop fundamentals of scientific inquiry important for evidence-based medicine.

WHAT HAVE YOU LEARNED FROM YOUR PREMED JOURNEY?

An essential element of the application process is describing and demonstrating the competencies you have developed in your preparation for medical school. The most competitive applicants are prepared to tell their stories with specific examples of their development as premedical students. Consider the following questions:

- Why medicine?
- What were you hoping to gain from each of your chosen experiences in preparing for medical school?
- How did you grow through participation in each experience?
- Which professional competencies have you developed and how have you developed them?
- What did you learn from interactions with others from different backgrounds, beliefs, and/or resources?
- Reflect on specific examples of learning experiences or "ah-ha" moments.
