

CAAP Reading Spring 2010

Reading Description

The CAAP Reading Test is a 36-item, 40-minute test that measures reading comprehension as a combination of skills that can be conceptualized in two broad categories:

Referring Skills: Test items that focus on referring skills require the student to derive meaning from text by identifying and interpreting specific information that is explicitly stated.

Reasoning Skills : Test items that focus on reasoning skills require students to determine implicit meanings and to go beyond the information that is explicitly presented.

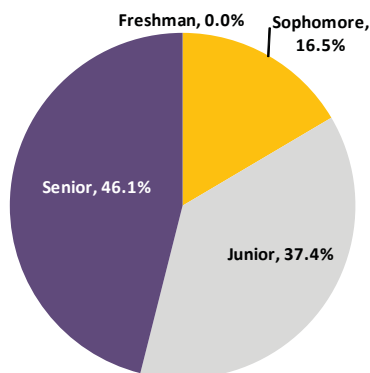
The Reading Test consists of four prose passages of about 900 words each that are representative of the level and kinds of writing commonly encountered in college curricula.
