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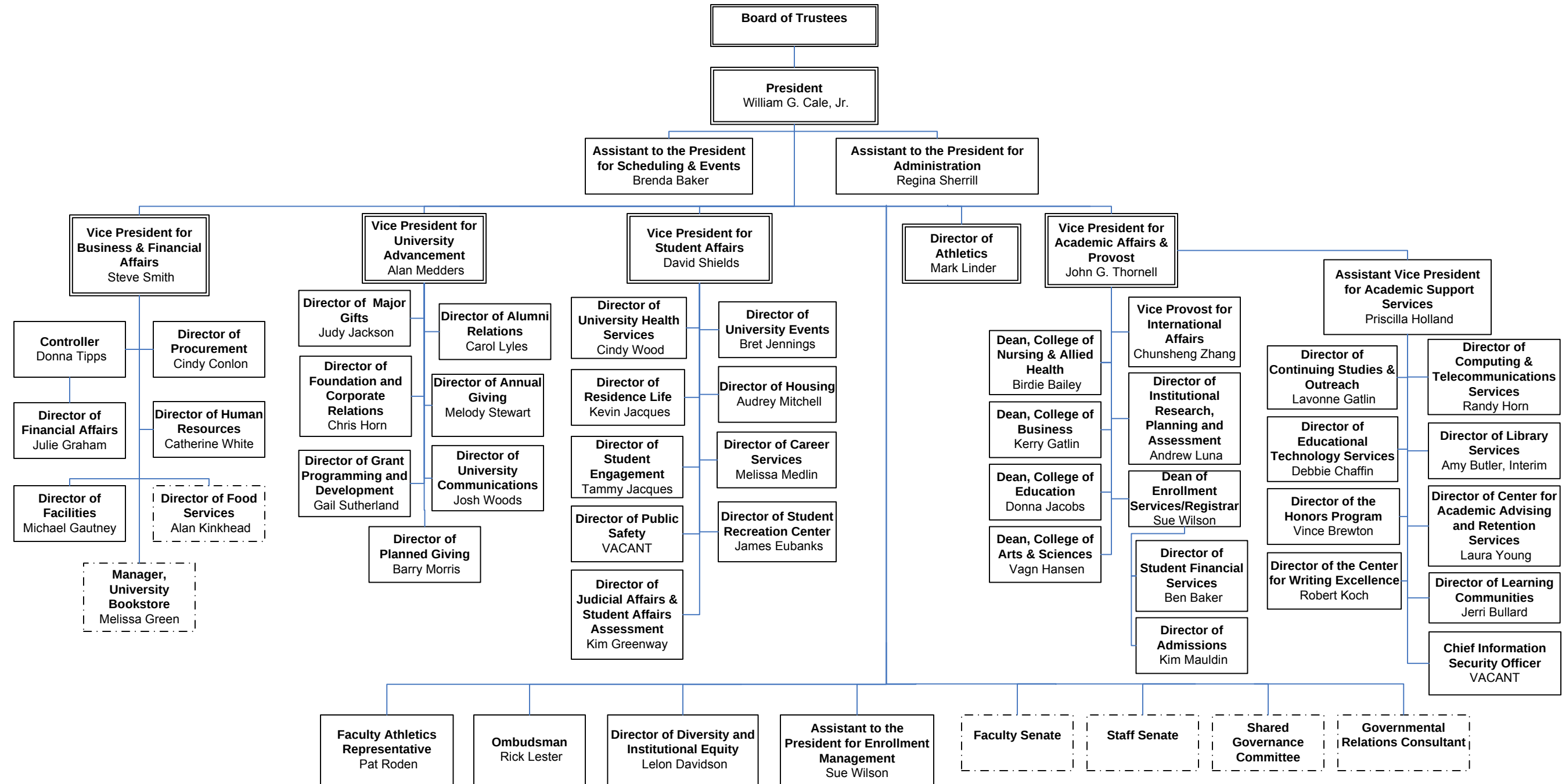

University of North Alabama Students and Faculty at a Glance:

Student Profile - Fall 2008

* <u>Number of Students</u>	7,198 total students of which 5,776 (80.2%) are undergraduate; 1,286 (17.8%) are graduate; 42 (.5%) are post baccalaureate; and 94 (1.3%) are ESL Students
* <u>Status of Students</u>	5,222 (72.5%) are full-time students; 1,882 (26.1%) are part-time students; and 94 (1.3%) are non-credit ESL/IE students
* <u>Gender of Students</u>	3,993 (55.4%) are female; 3202 (44.5%) are male; and 3 (.1%) are unreported
* <u>Age of Students</u>	65% of all students are less than 25 years of age; 32% of all students are 25 to 49 years of age; and 3% of the students are 50 years and older

* <u>Gender of Full-Time Faculty</u>	52% are male and 48% are female

Science Reasoning Test Description

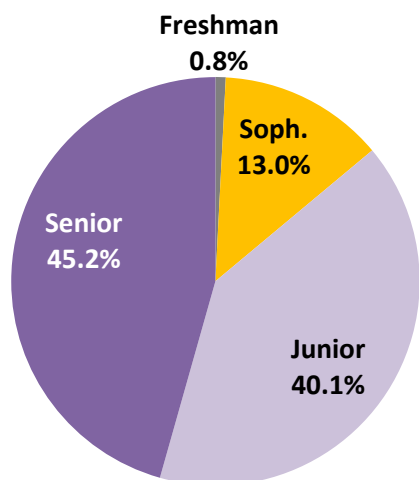
This 45-item, 40-minute test measures the student's abilities in scientific reasoning. The content is drawn from biology, chemistry, physics, and physical sciences. The test consists of eight units, each of which contains scientific information and a set of multiple-choice questions. The test includes content from biology, physical sciences, chemistry, and physics.

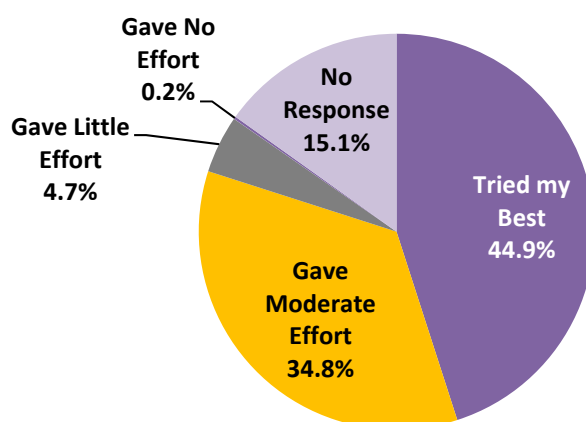
Number of Students by Class*

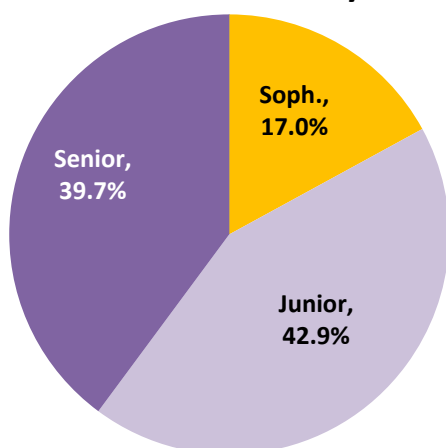
CAAP Spring 2009 Critical Thinking Description

The CAAP Critical Thinking test measures students' skills in clarifying, analyzing, evaluating, and extending arguments. An argument is defined as a sequence of statements that includes a claim that one of the statements, the conclusion, follows from the other statements. Each passage in the test presents a series of sub-arguments in support of a more general conclusion or conclusions. A variety of formats are used: case studies, debates, dialogues, overlapping positions, statistical arguments, experimental results, and editorials. About 60% of the test focuses on the analysis of the elements of an argument, with about 20% covering each of the other two areas.

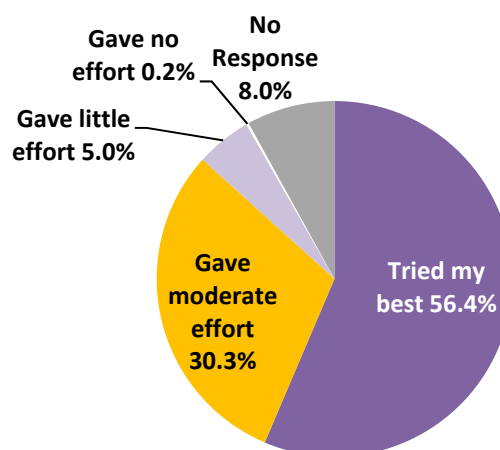
Number of Students by Class*

New Student Admissions Comparison Fall 2004 - Fall 2008

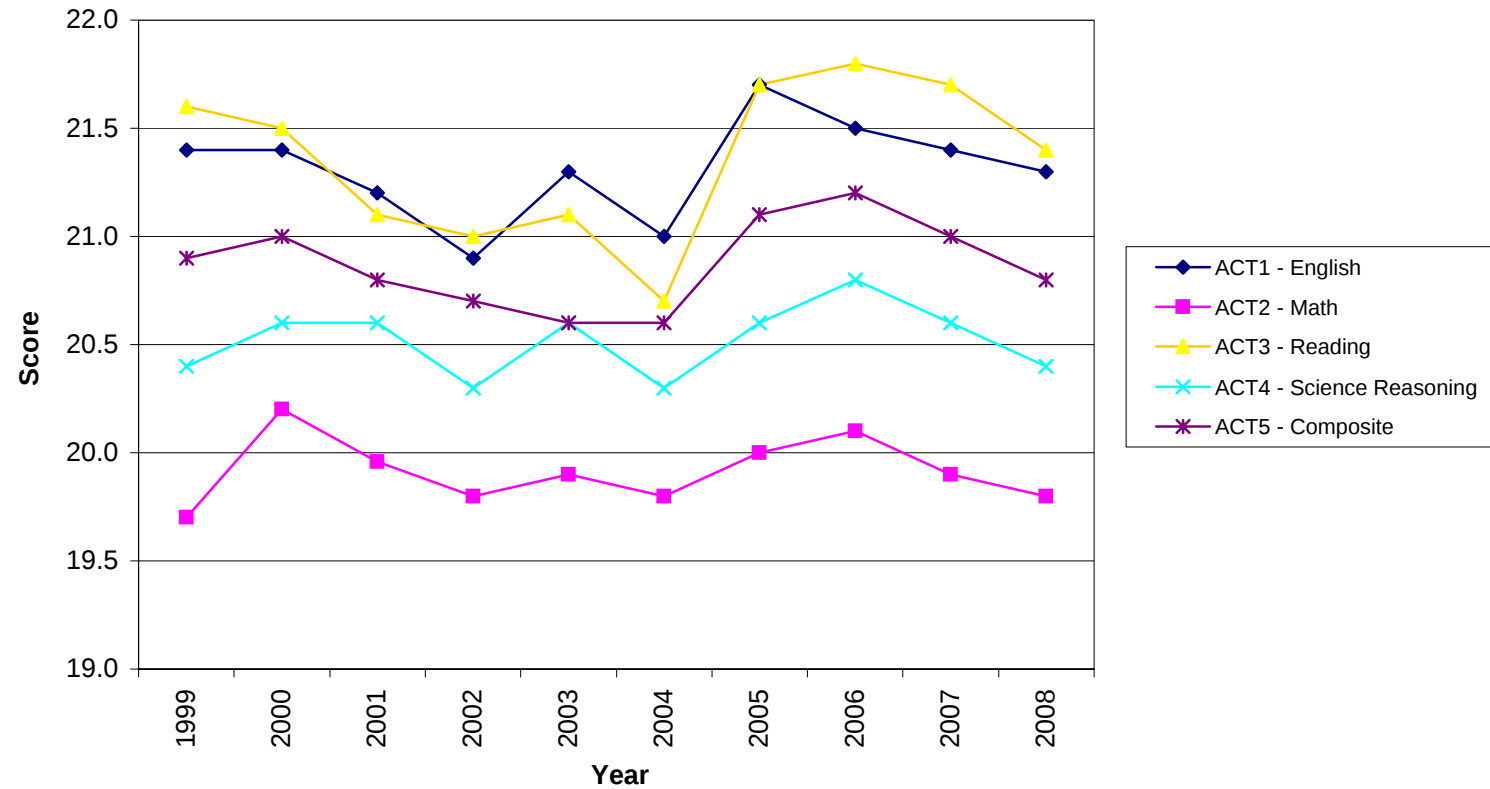

Fall 1999 - Fall 2008

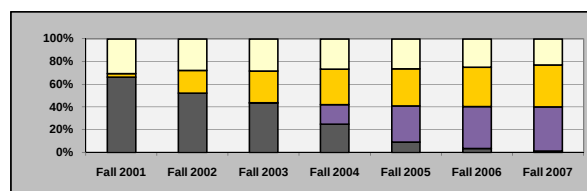
