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University of North Alabama Students and Faculty at a Glance:

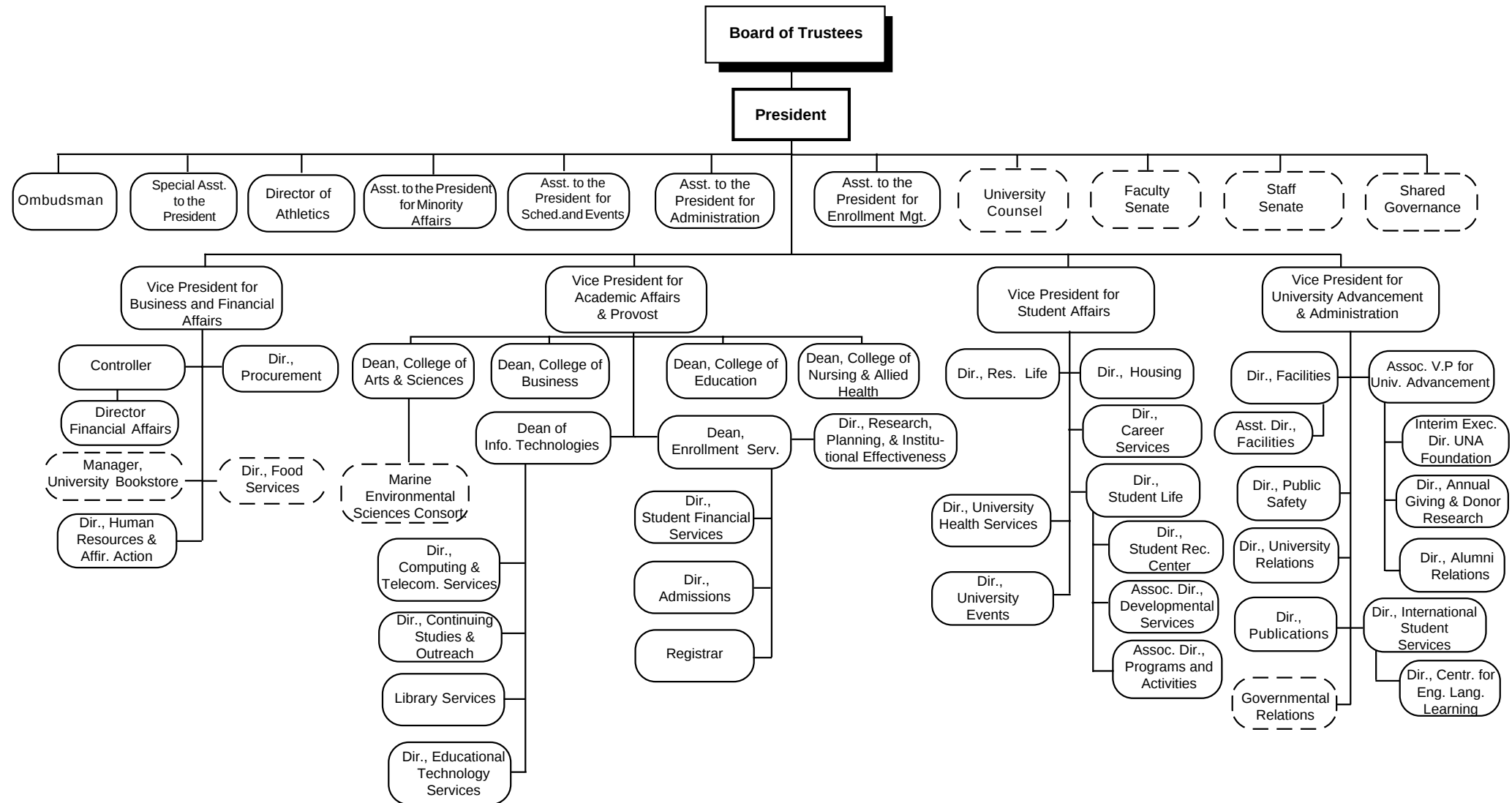
Student Profile - Fall 2005

- * **Number of Students** 6,444 total students of which 5,446 (85%) are undergraduate students and 998 (15%) are graduate students.
- * **Status of Students** 4,650 (72.2%) are full-time students; 1,765 (27.4%) are part-time students; and 29 (.4%) are non-credit ESL/IE students.
- * **Gender of Students** 3,679 (57%) are female and 2,765 (43%) are male
- * **Age of Students** 71% of all students are less than 25 years of age, 27% of all students are 25 to 49 years of age, and 2% of the students are 50 years and older.
- * **Ethnicity of Students** 72.3% are white, 9.4% are black, 1.3% are American Indian/Alaskan Native, 7.4% did not report ethnic group, 6.5% are International, and 3.1% are from other ethnic groups
- * **Residency of Students** 73% are residents of Alabama, 8% are residents of Tennessee, 6% are residents of Mississippi, 6% are from 39 other states, and 7% from 42 foreign countries
- * **Housing of Students** 21% of undergraduate students live in student housing

Faculty Profile - Fall 2005

- * **Number of Faculty** 314 instructional faculty of which 209 (67%) are full-time and 105 (33%) are part-time
- * **Rank of Full-Time Faculty** 27% are professors, 26% are associate professors, 35% are assistant professors, and 12% are instructors
- * **Gender of Full-Time Faculty** 59% are male and 41% are female
- * **Ethnicity of Full-Time Faculty** 88% are white, 6% are black, and 6% are from other ethnic groups
- * **Credentials of Full-Time Faculty** 66% hold a doctoral degree and 74% are considered terminally prepared in their discipline.
- * **Tenure Status of Full-Time Faculty** 68% are tenured, 20% are non-tenured on tenure track, and 12% are on non-tenure track

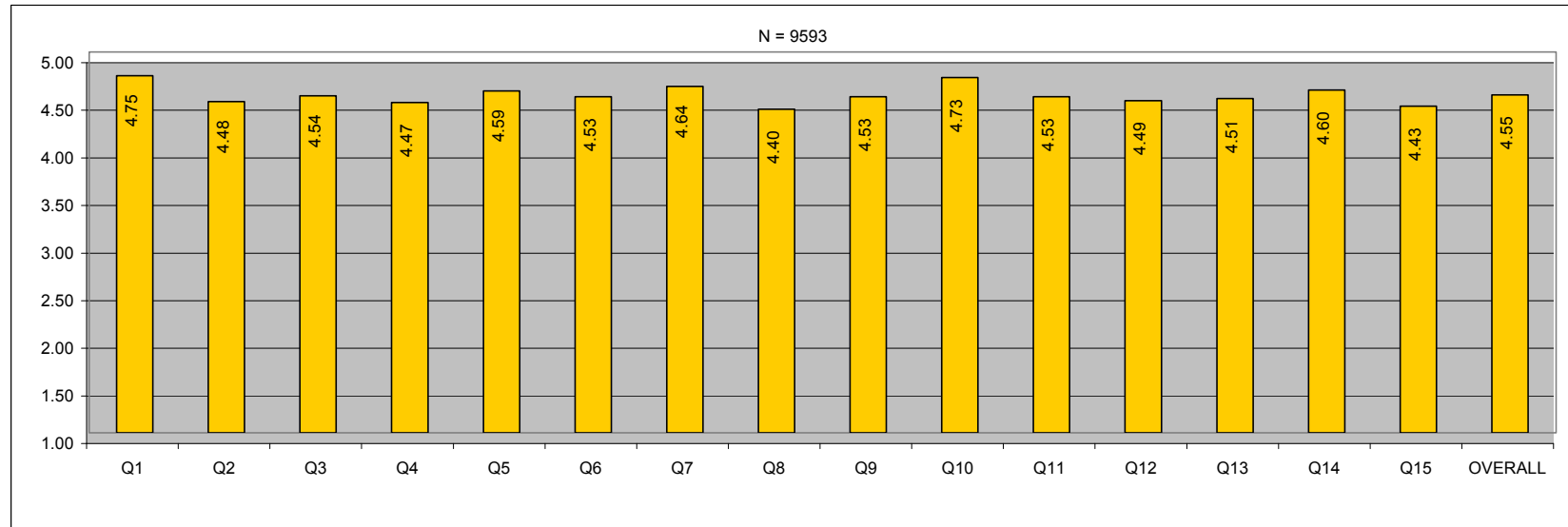

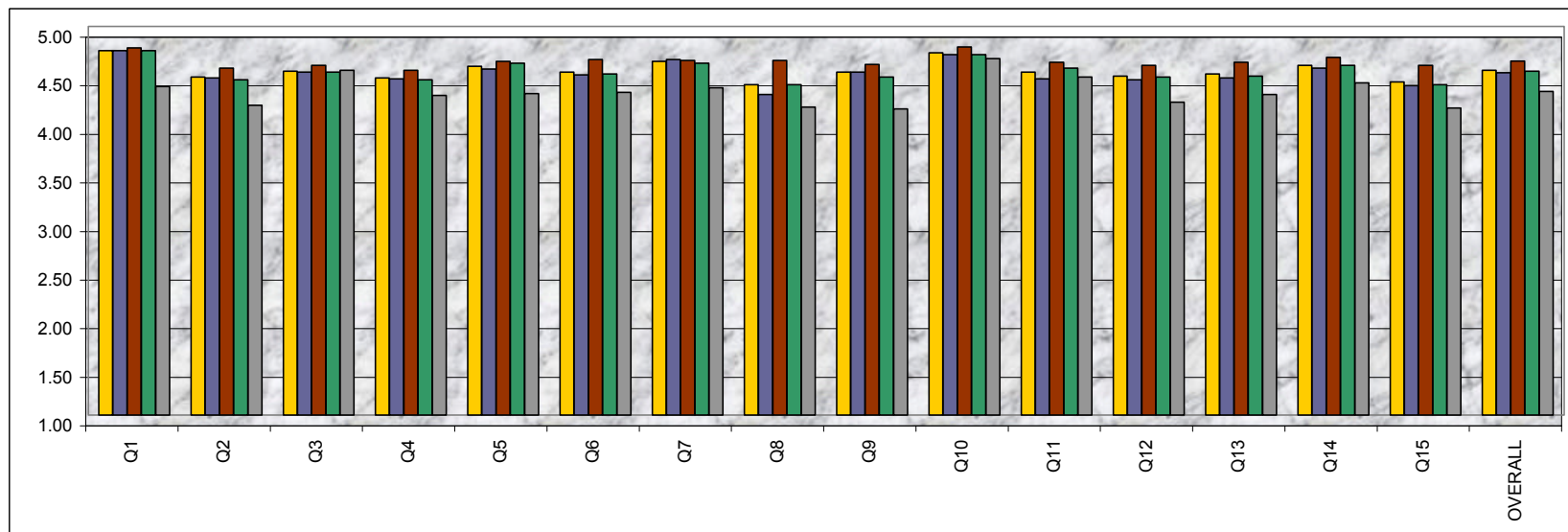

CAAP Writing Skills Description

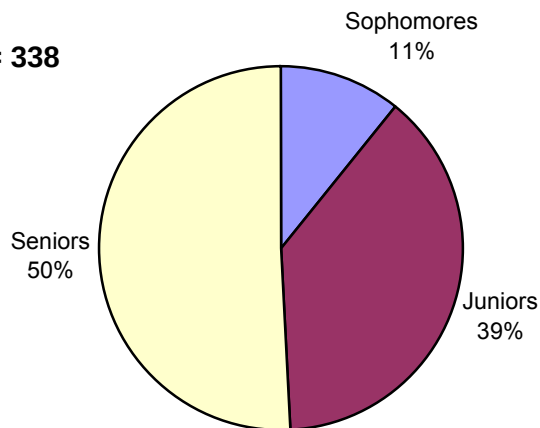
This 72-item, 40-minute test measures the student's understanding of standard written English in usage/mechanics and rhetorical skills. Spelling, vocabulary, and rote recall of grammar are not tested. The test consists of six prose passages, each of which is accompanied by a set of 12 multiple-choice items. A range of passage types is used to provide a variety of rhetorical situations.

Number of Students by Class*

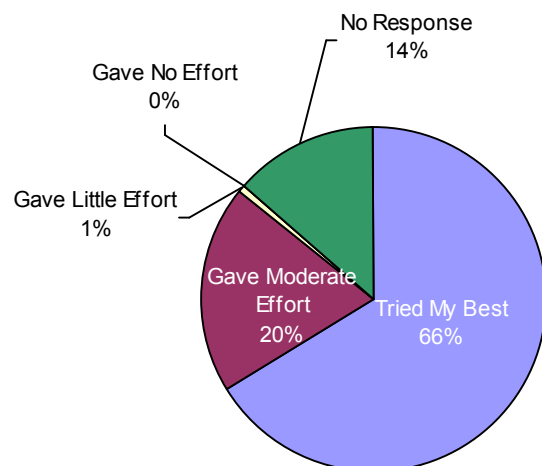

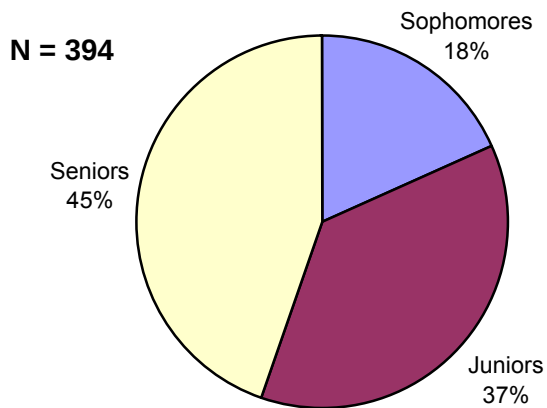

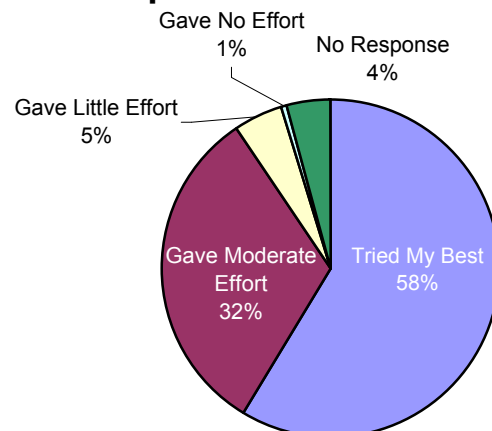
Number of Students by Class*

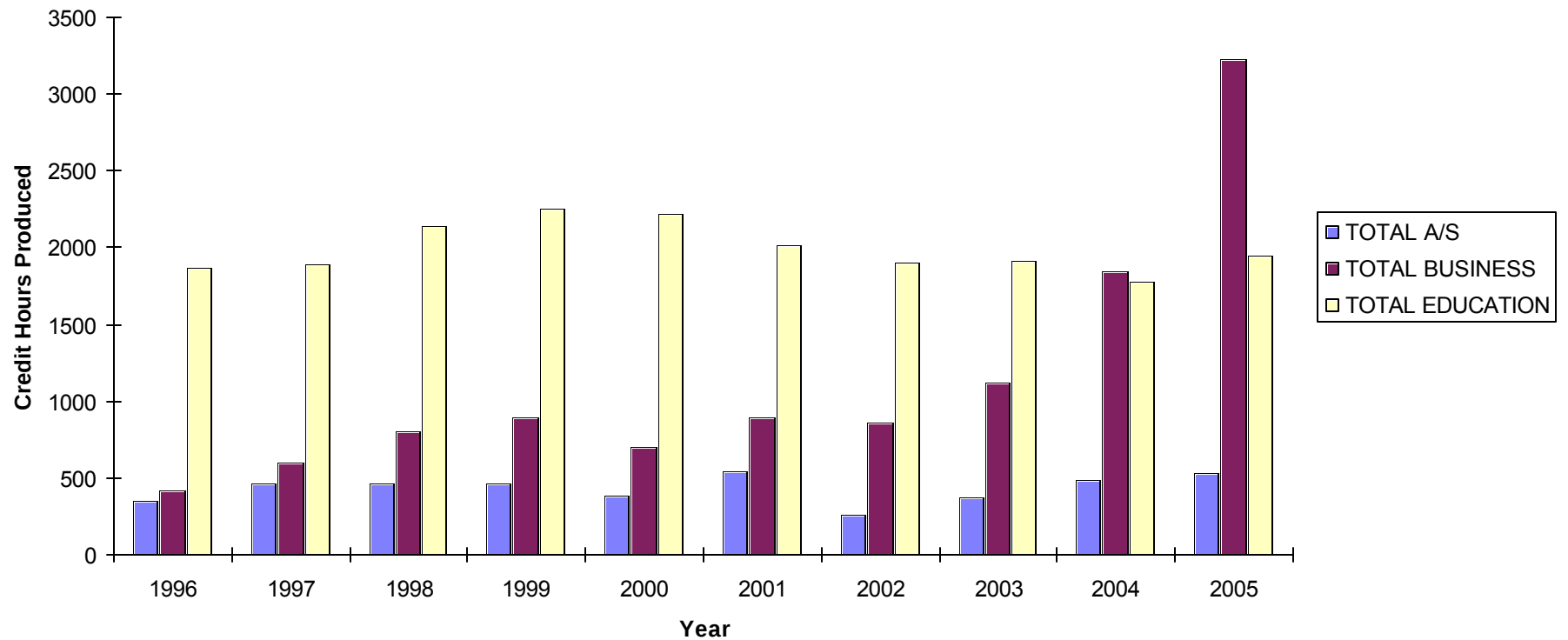

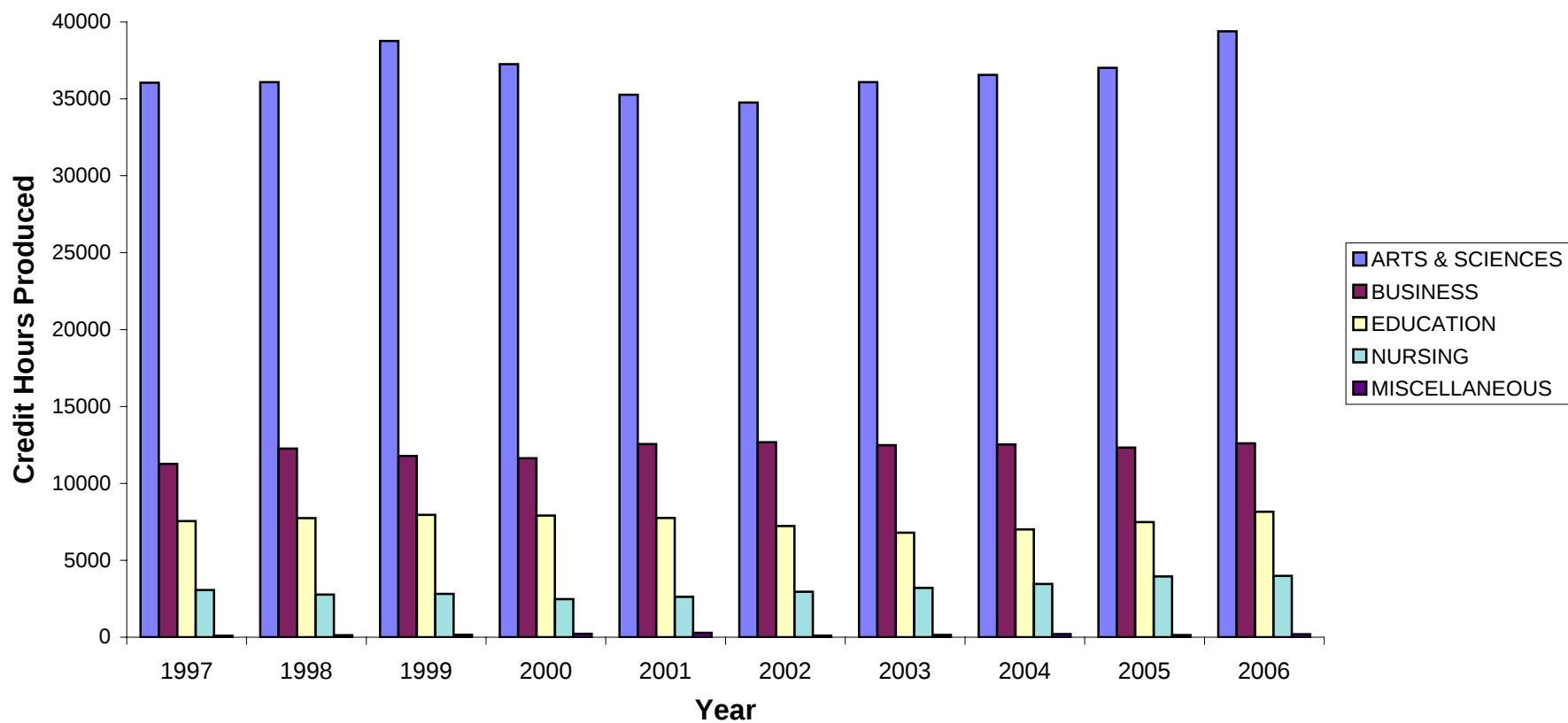

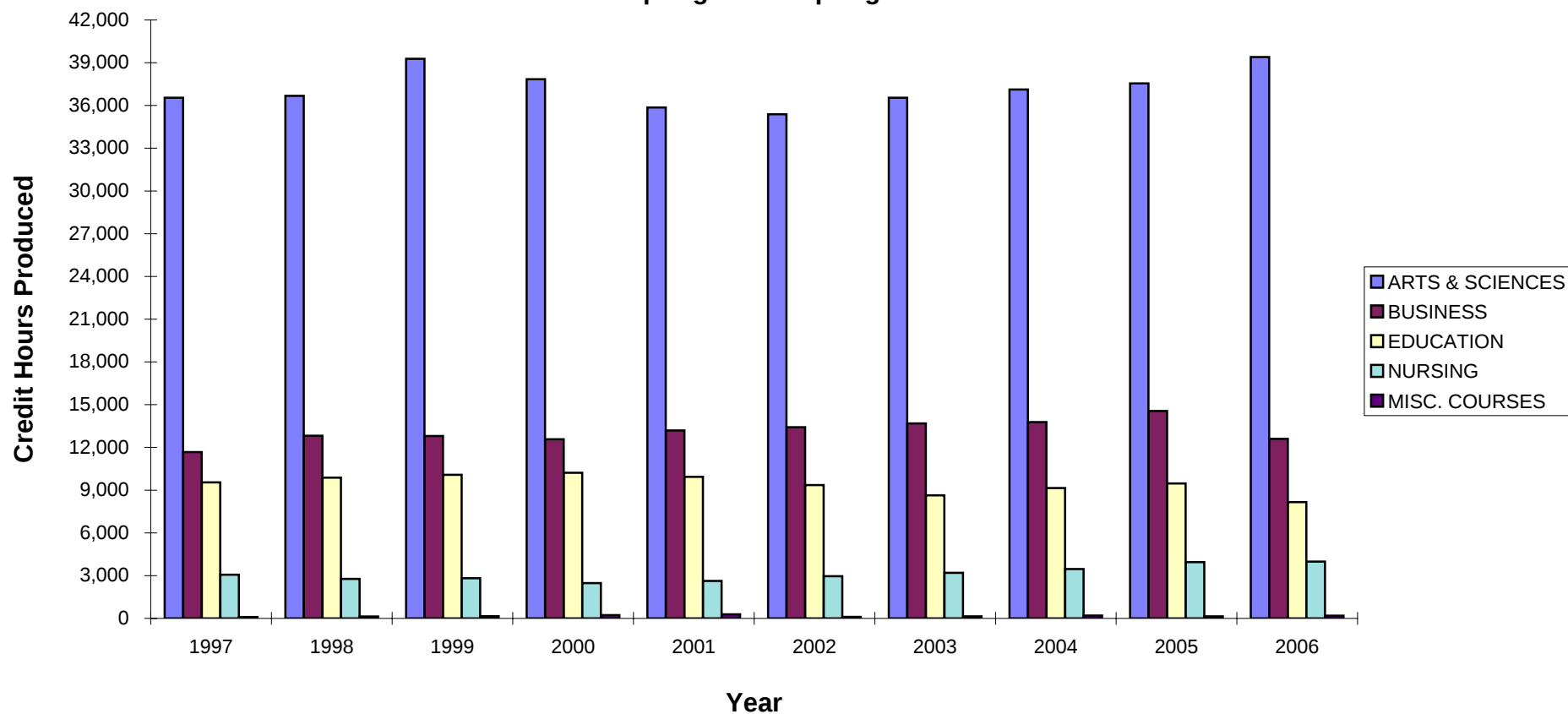
**Undergraduate Credit Hour Production

Spring 1997 - Spring 2006**



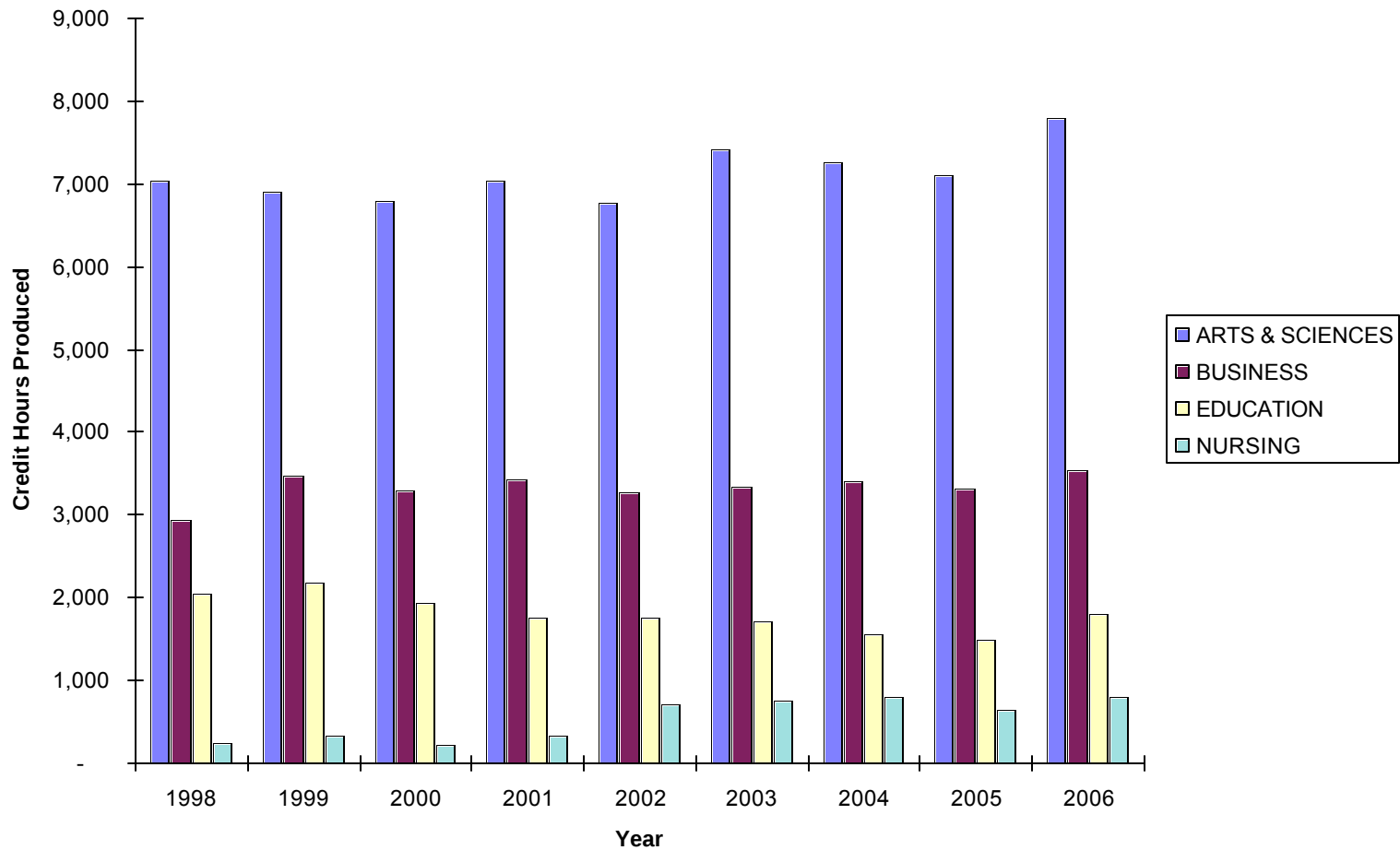
**Combined Undergraduate and Graduate Credit Hour Production

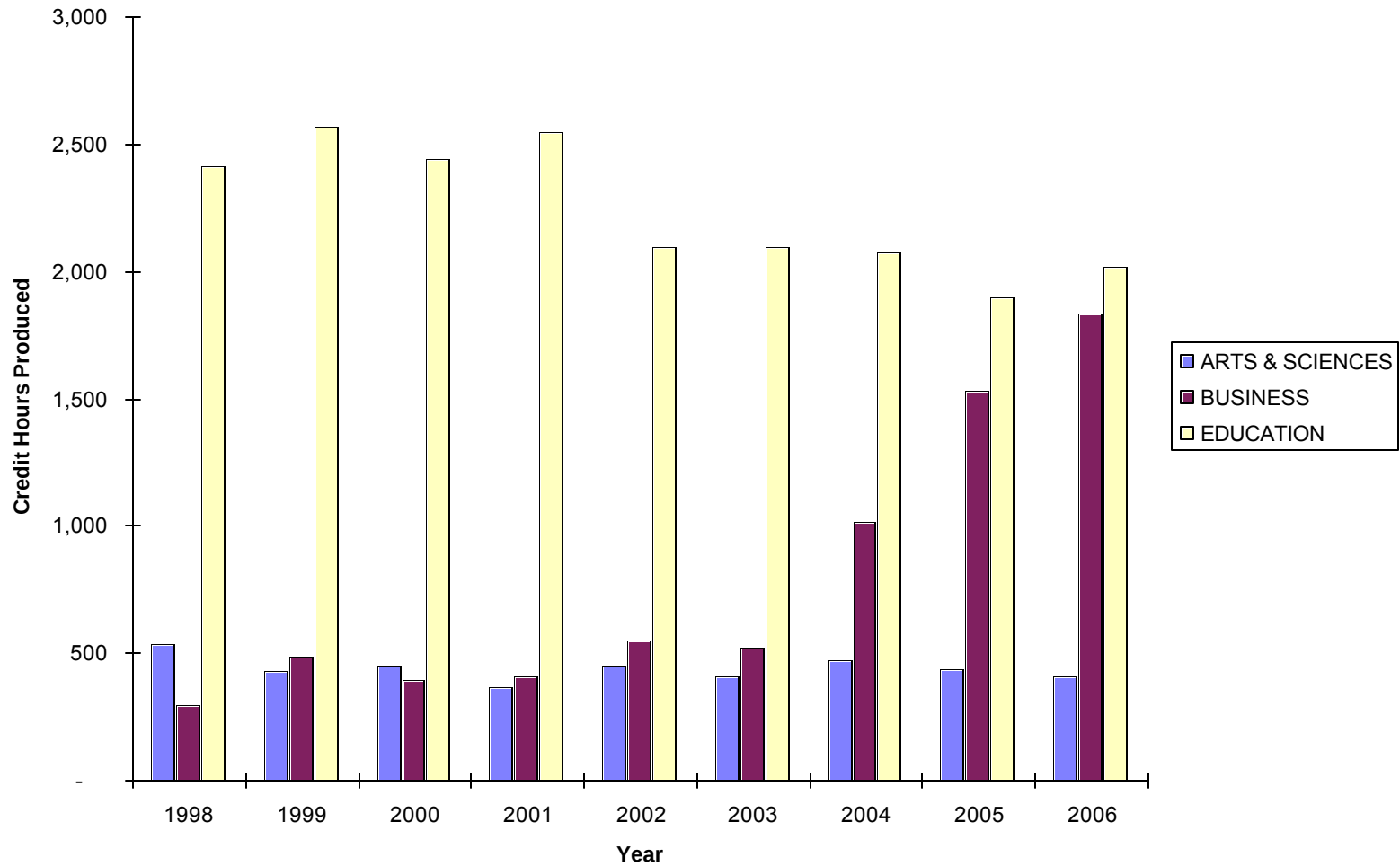

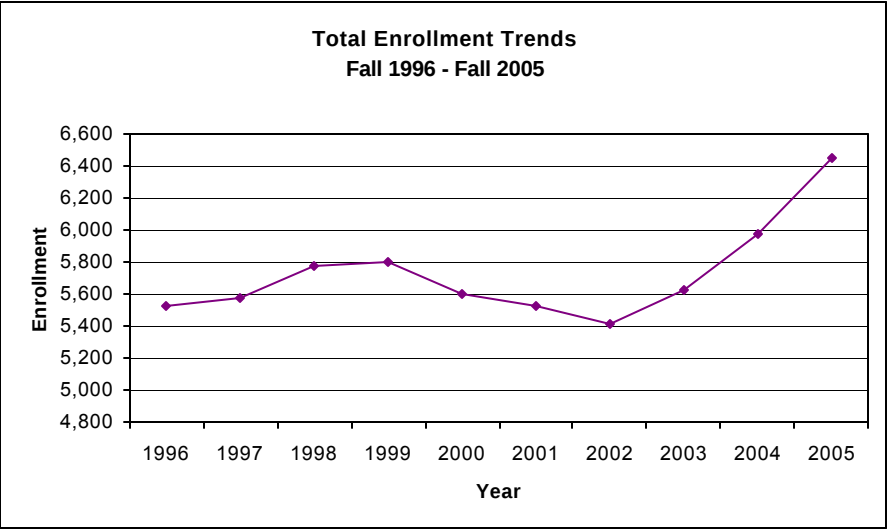
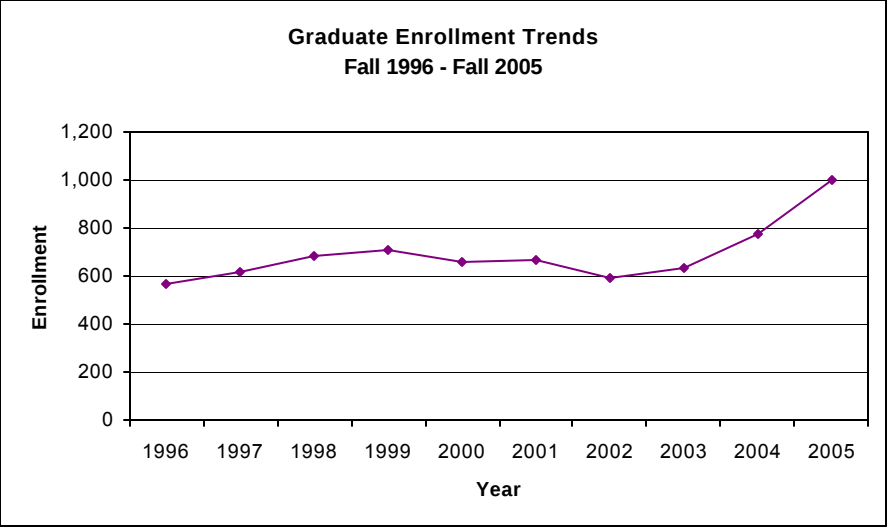
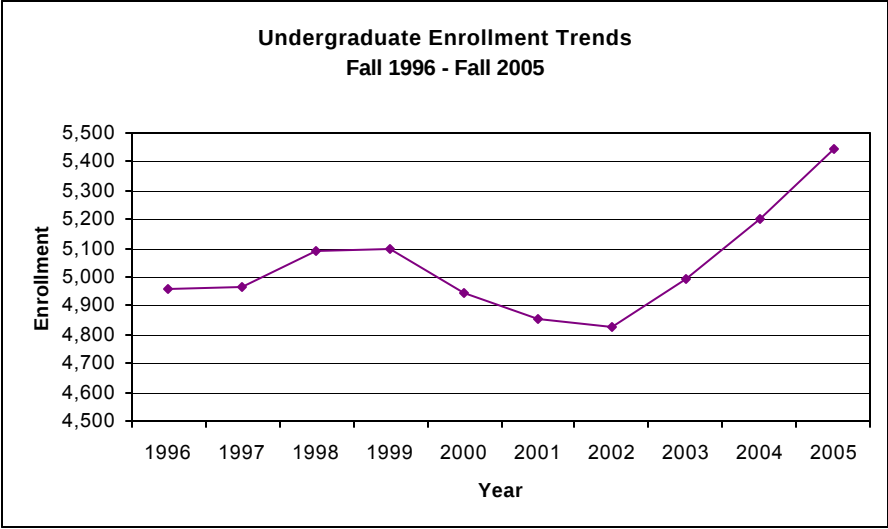


**Graduate Credit Hour Production

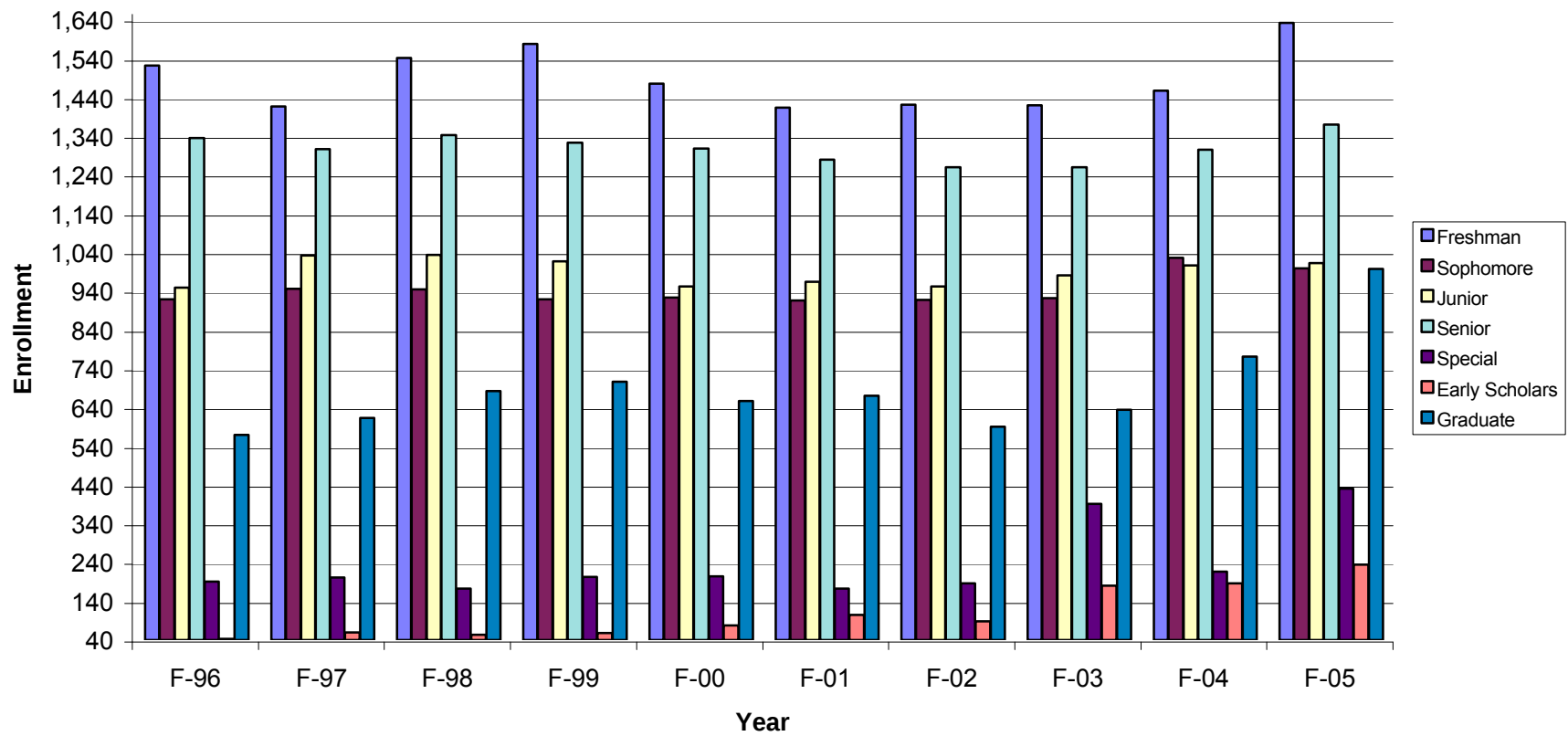

Enrollment Trends by Classification Fall 1996 - Fall 2005

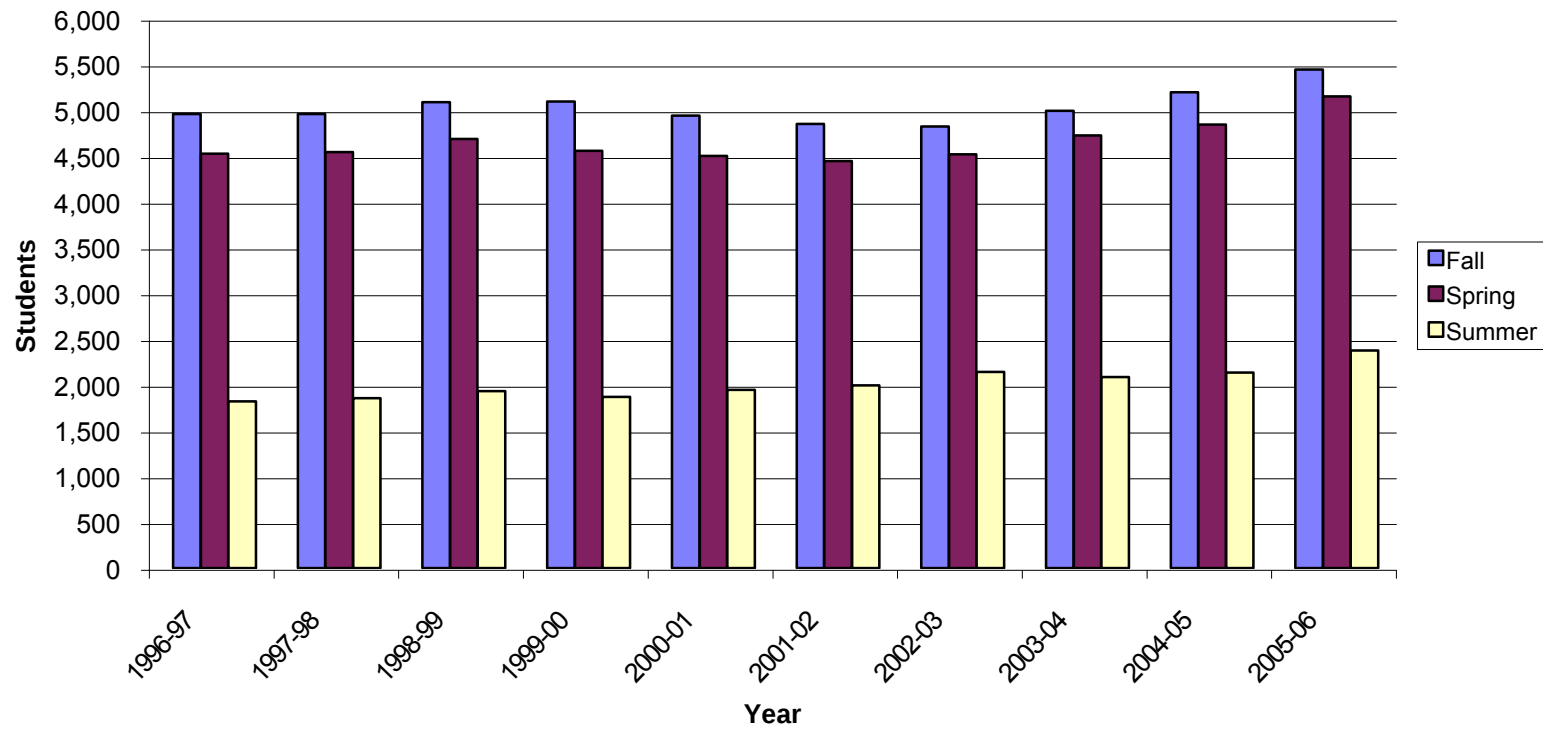

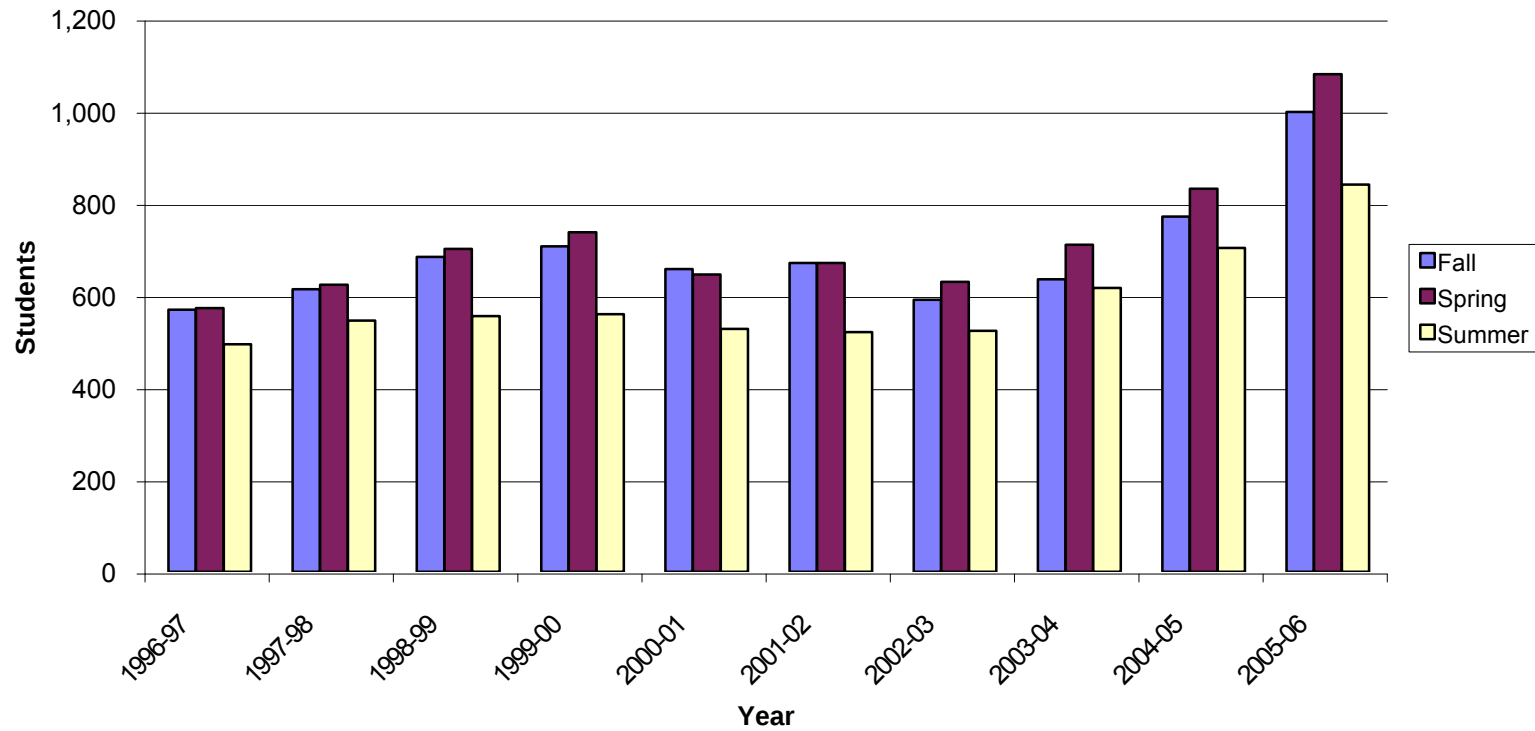

University of North Alabama Graduate Enrollment Trends by Semester

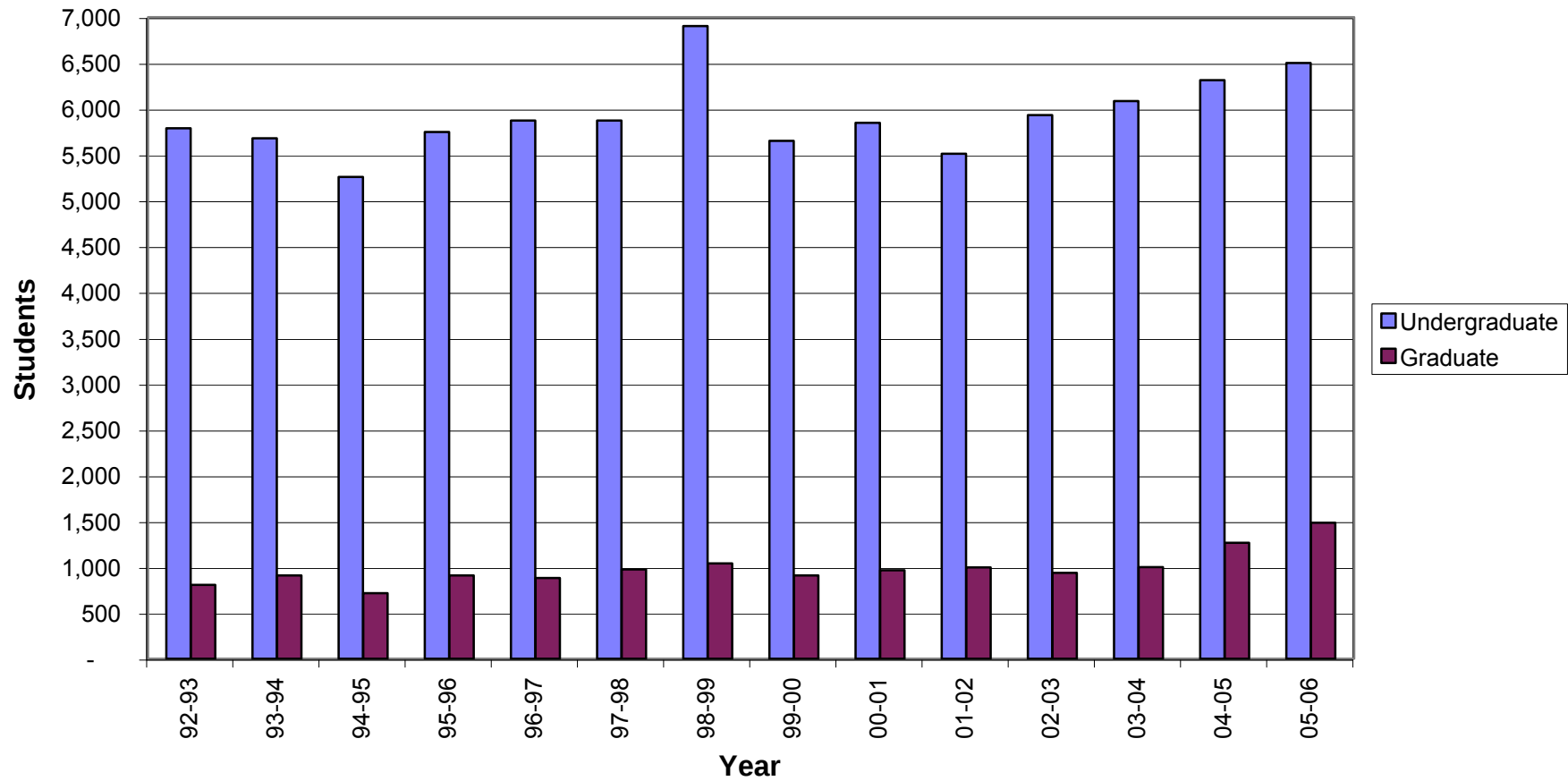

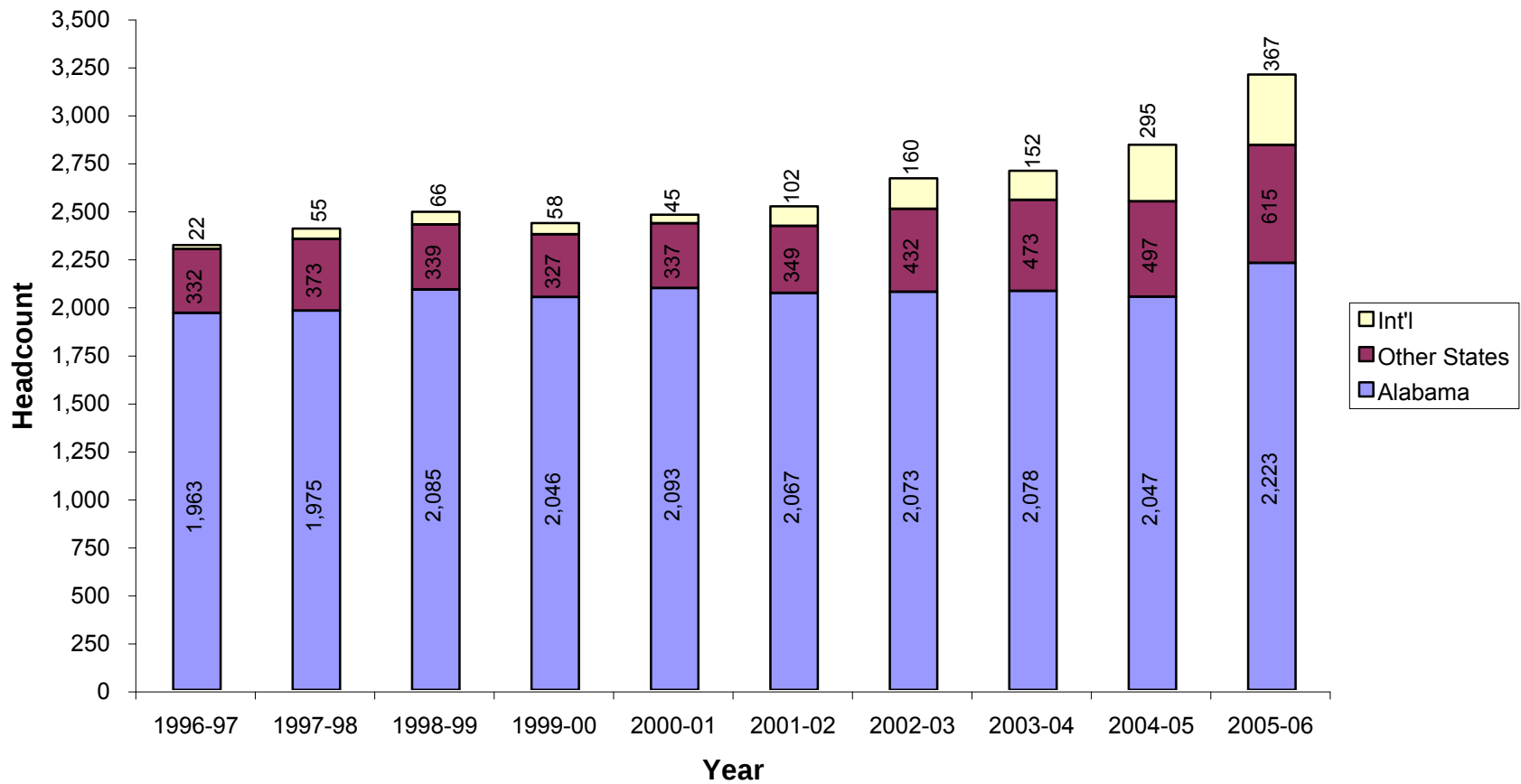
Student Headcount by Source Fall 1996 - Fall 2005



Student Headcount by Source Spring 1997 - Spring 2006

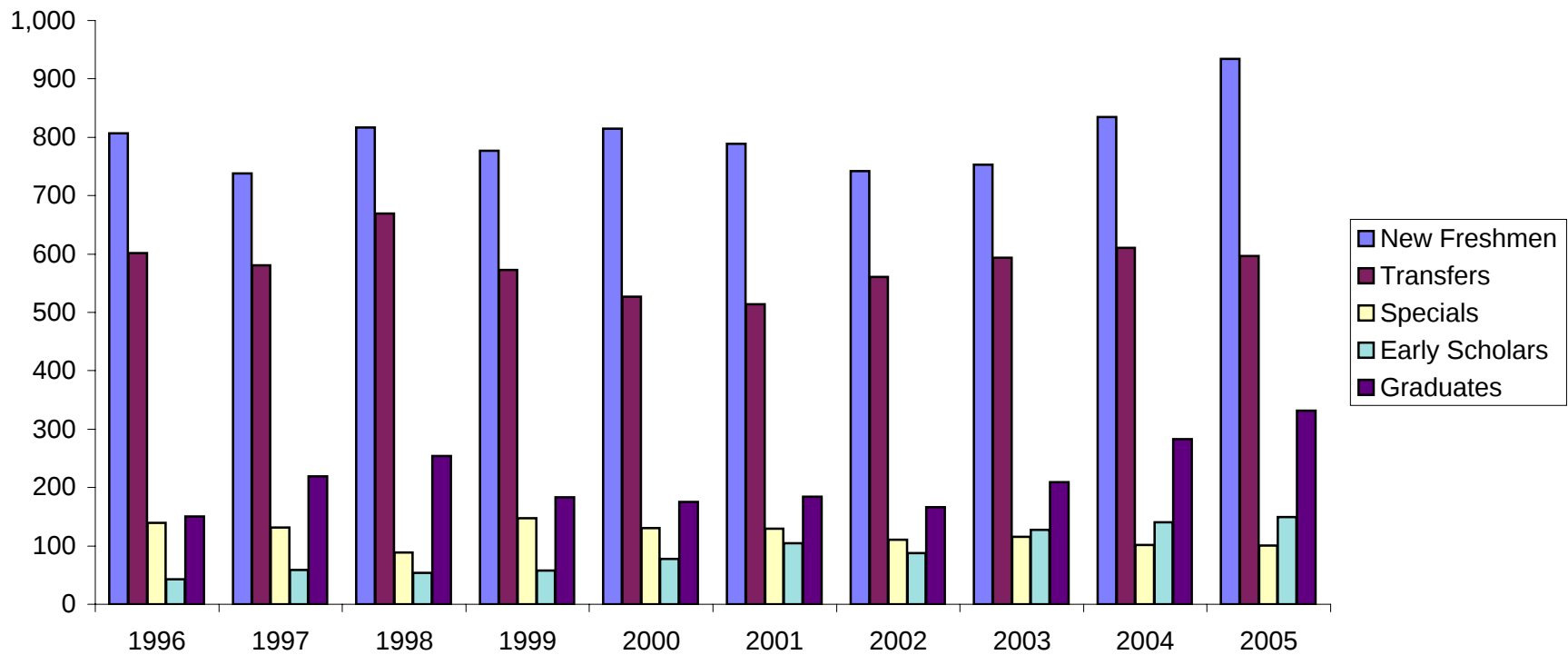


Student Headcount by Source Summer 1997 - Summer 2006

New Student Admissions Comparison Fall 1996 - Fall 2005

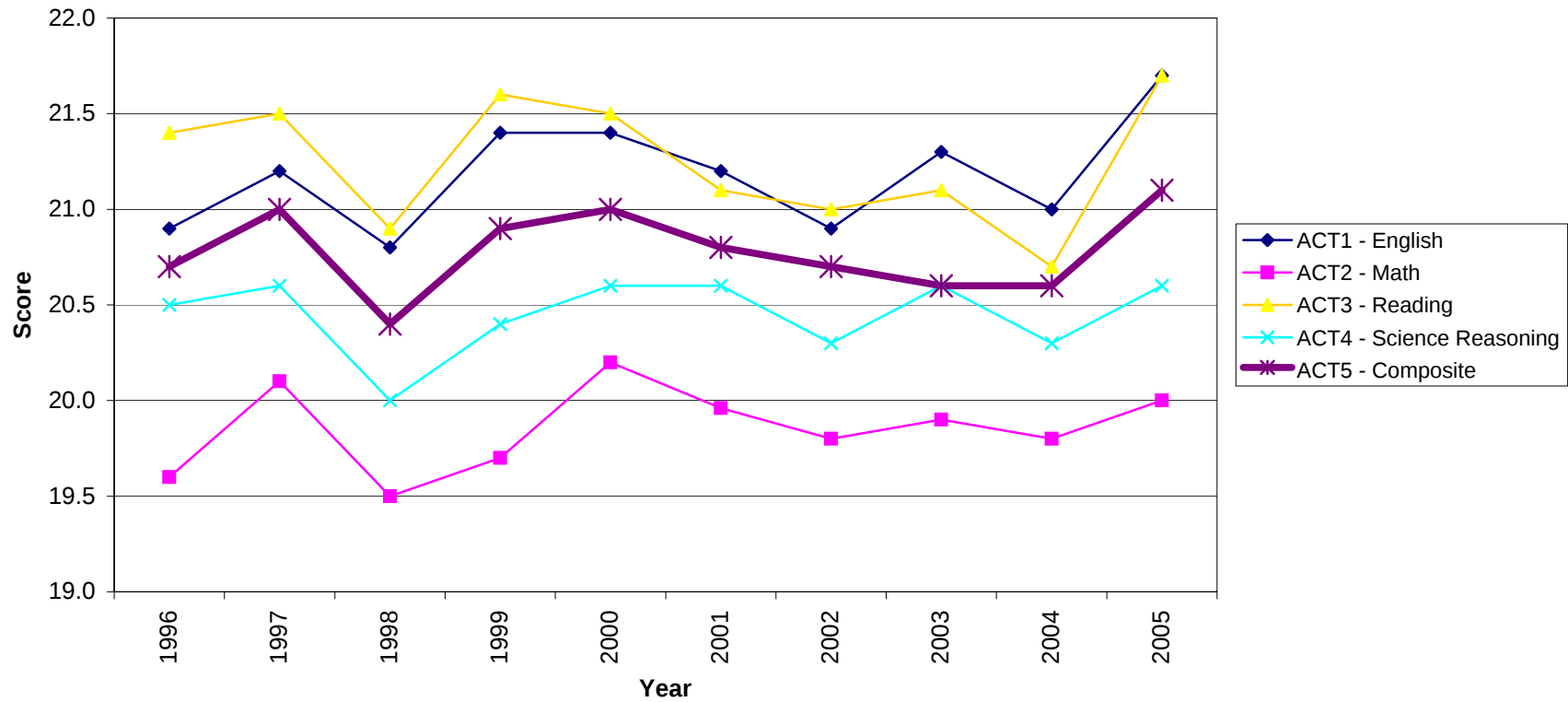

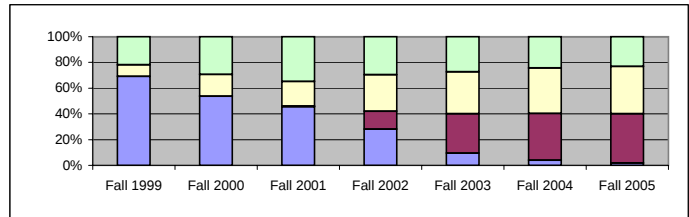

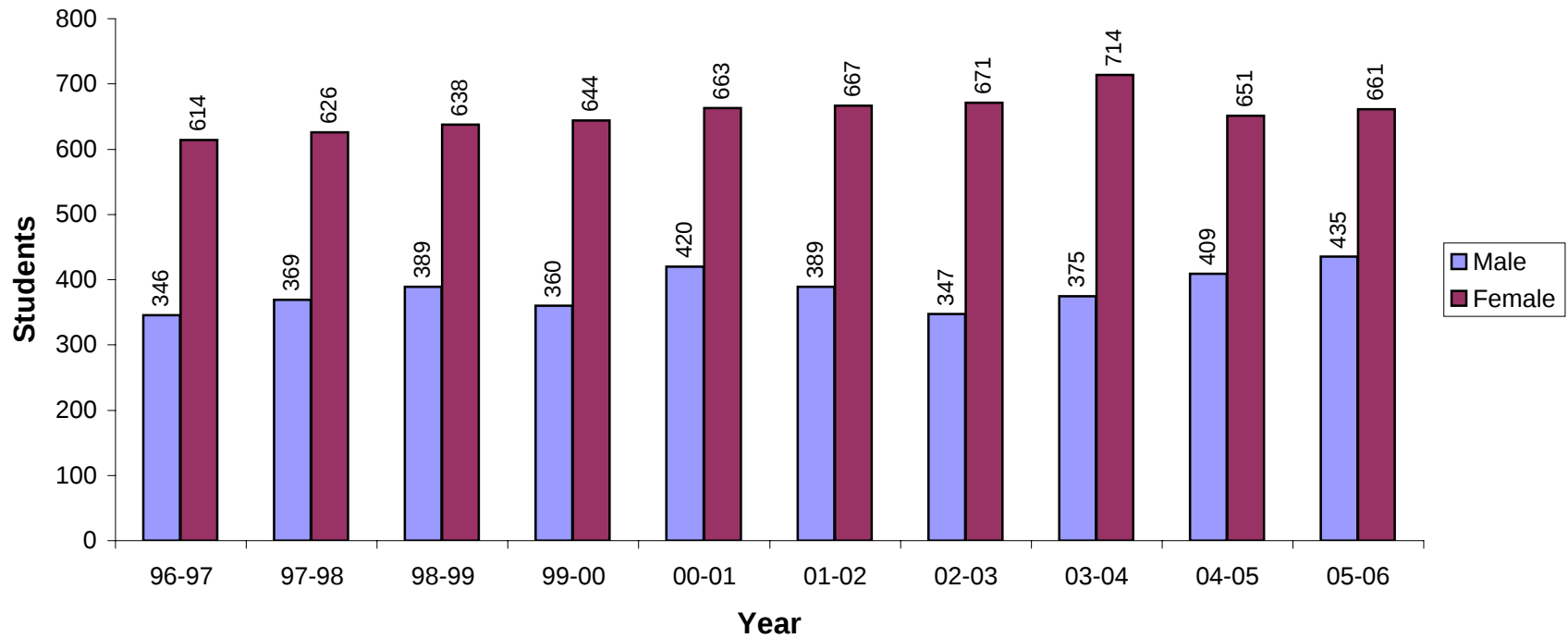

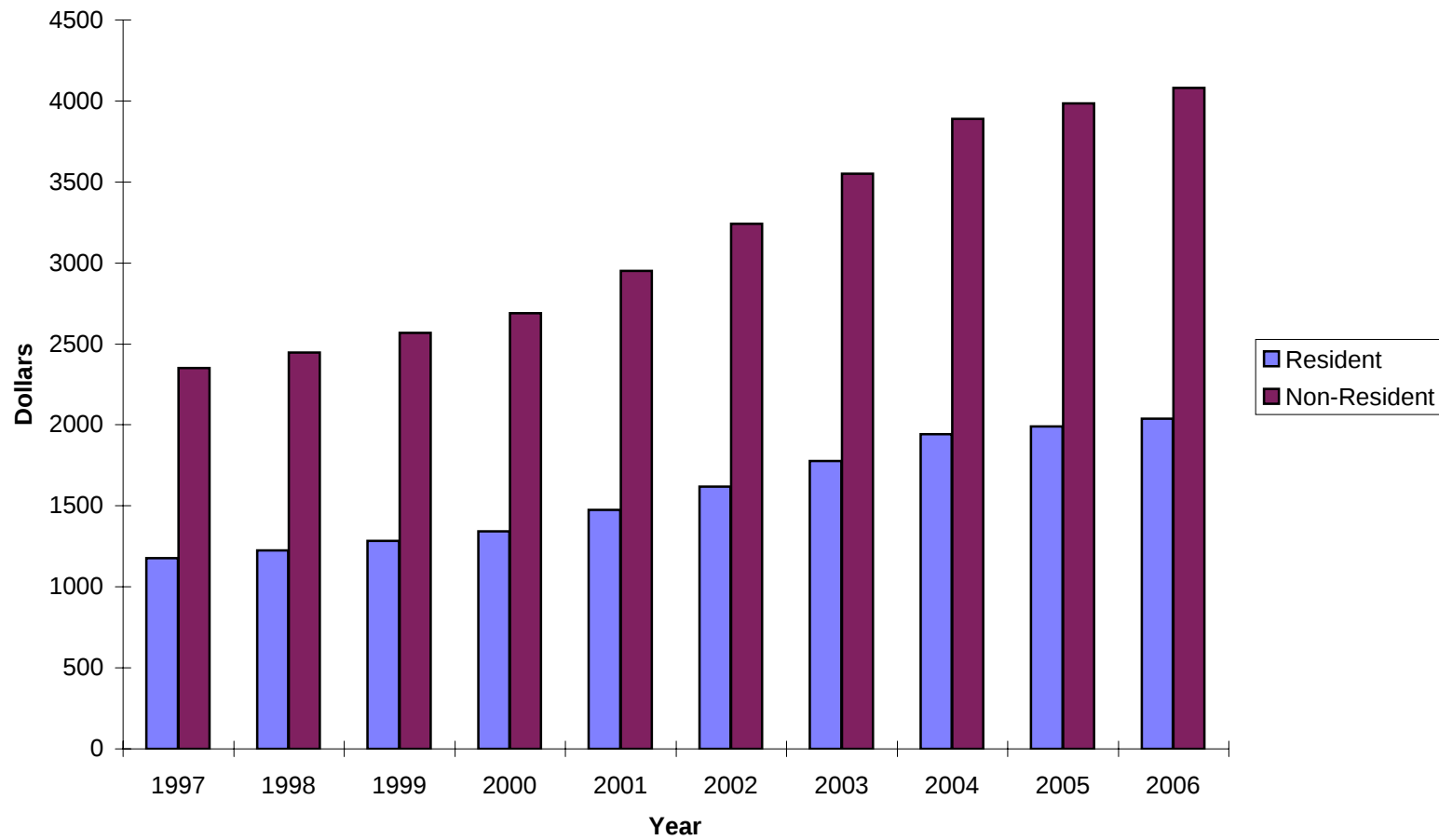

University of North Alabama Graduate Tuition 1997-2006



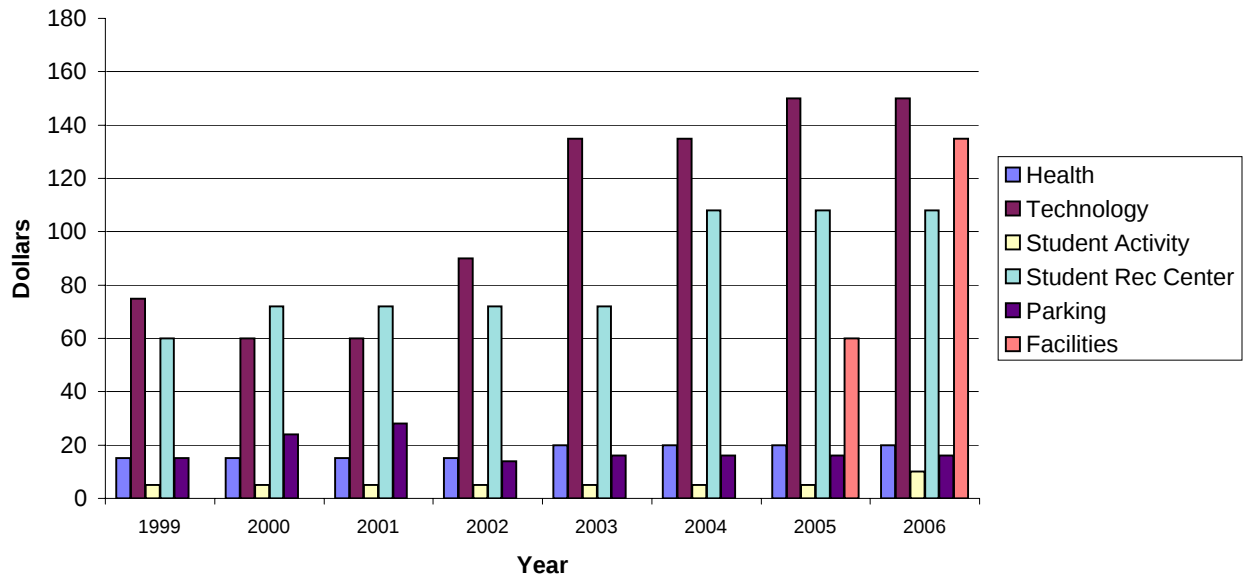

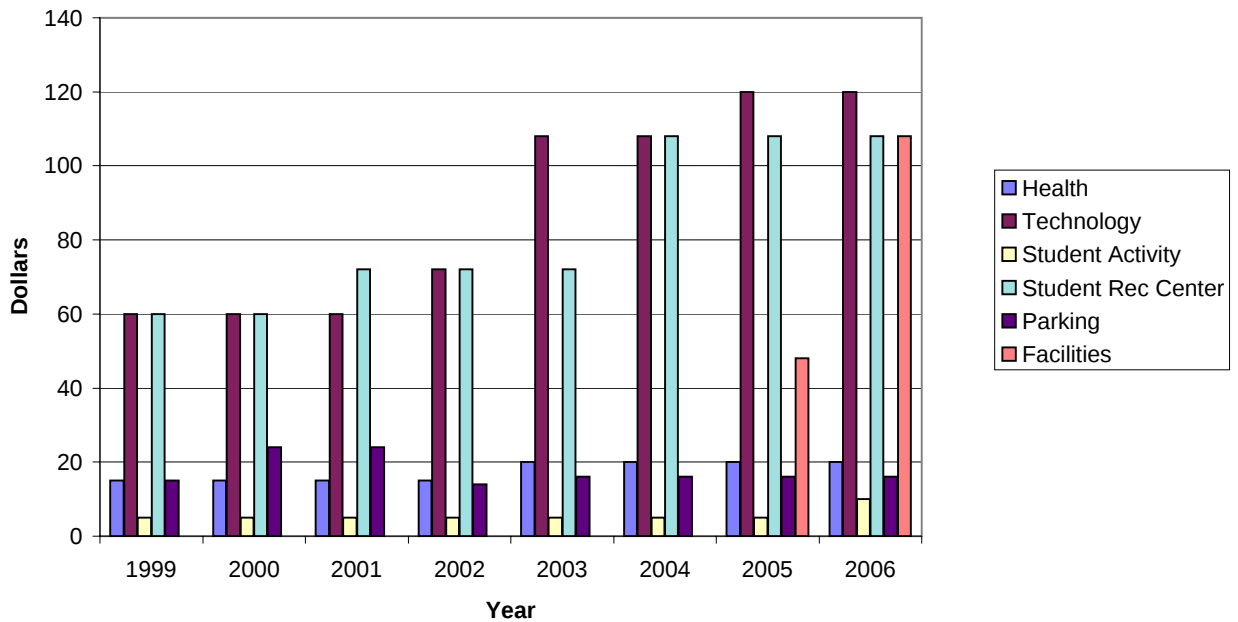
