Student Profile - Fall 2007

* <u>Number of Students</u>	7,323 total students of which 5,768 (79%) are undergraduate, 1,329 (18%) are graduate, and 226 (3%) are ESL Students
* <u>Status of Students</u>	5,173 (70.7%) are full-time students; 1,924 (26.3%) are part-time students; and 226 (3%) are non-credit ESL/IE students
* <u>Gender of Students</u>	4,056 (55%) are female and 3,267 (45%) are male
* <u>Age of Students</u>	69% of all students are less than 25 years of age, 30% of all students are 25 to 49 years of age, and 1% of the students are 50 years and older
* <u>Ethnicity of Students</u>	64.4% are white, 9.4% are black, 1.3% are American Indian/Alaskan Native, 7.6% did not report ethnic group, 13.2% are International, 1.0% are Hispanic, and 3.1% are Asian

* <u>Housing of Students</u>	23% of undergraduate students live in student housing

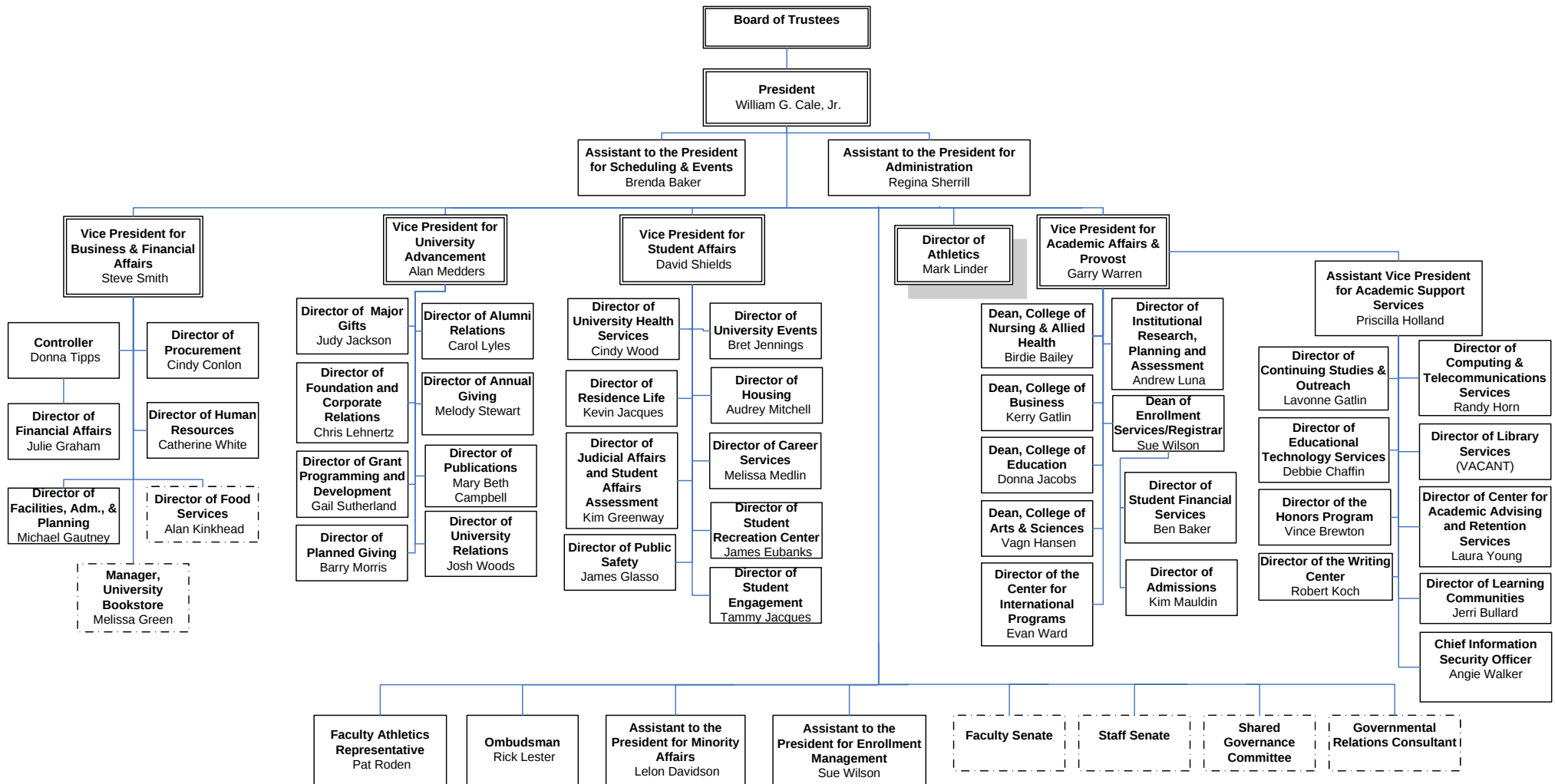
Faculty Profile - Fall 2007

* <u>Number of Faculty</u>	374 instructional faculty of which 230 (61.5%) are full-time and 144 (38.5%) are part-time

* <u>Gender of Full-Time Faculty</u>	54% are male and 46% are female

CAAP Reading Test - Fall 2007

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CAAP Reading Description

The CAAP Reading Test is a 36-item, 40-minute test that measures reading comprehension as a combination of skills that can be conceptualized in two broad categories:

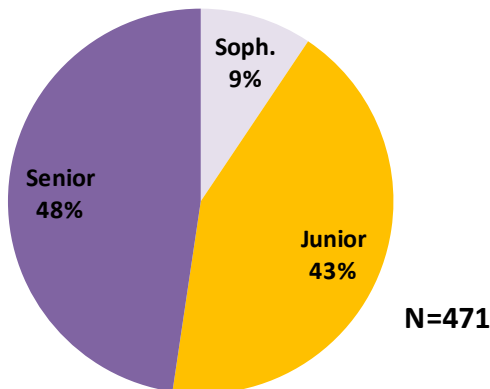
Referring Skills: Test items that focus on referring skills require the student to derive meaning from text by identifying and interpreting specific information that is explicitly stated. Typical items of this type require students to recognize main ideas of paragraphs and passages, to identify important factual information, and to identify relationships among different components of textual information.

Reasoning Skills: Test items that focus on reasoning skills require students to determine implicit meanings and to go beyond the information that is explicitly presented. Typical items in this category assess students' ability to determine meaning from context, to infer main ideas and relationships, to generalize and apply information beyond the immediate context, to draw appropriate conclusions, and to make appropriate comparisons.

The Reading Test consists of four prose passages of about 900 words each that are representative of the level and kinds of writing

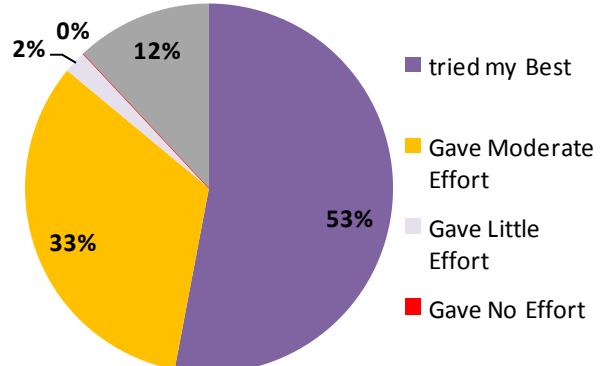

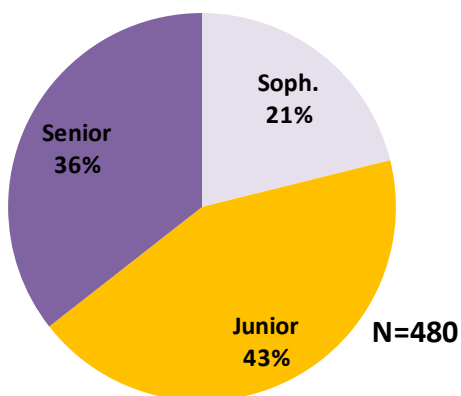
CAAP Writing Skills Description

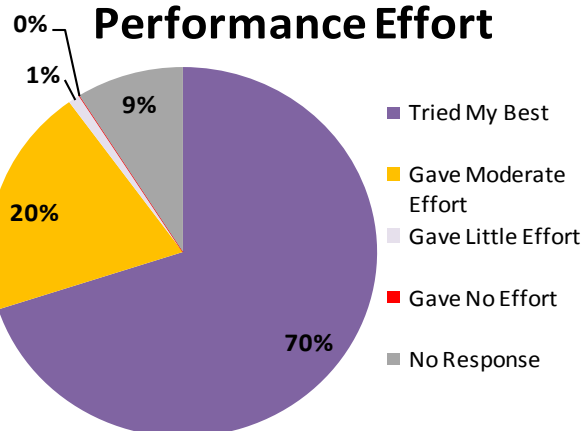

New Student Admissions Comparison Fall 2003 - Fall 2007

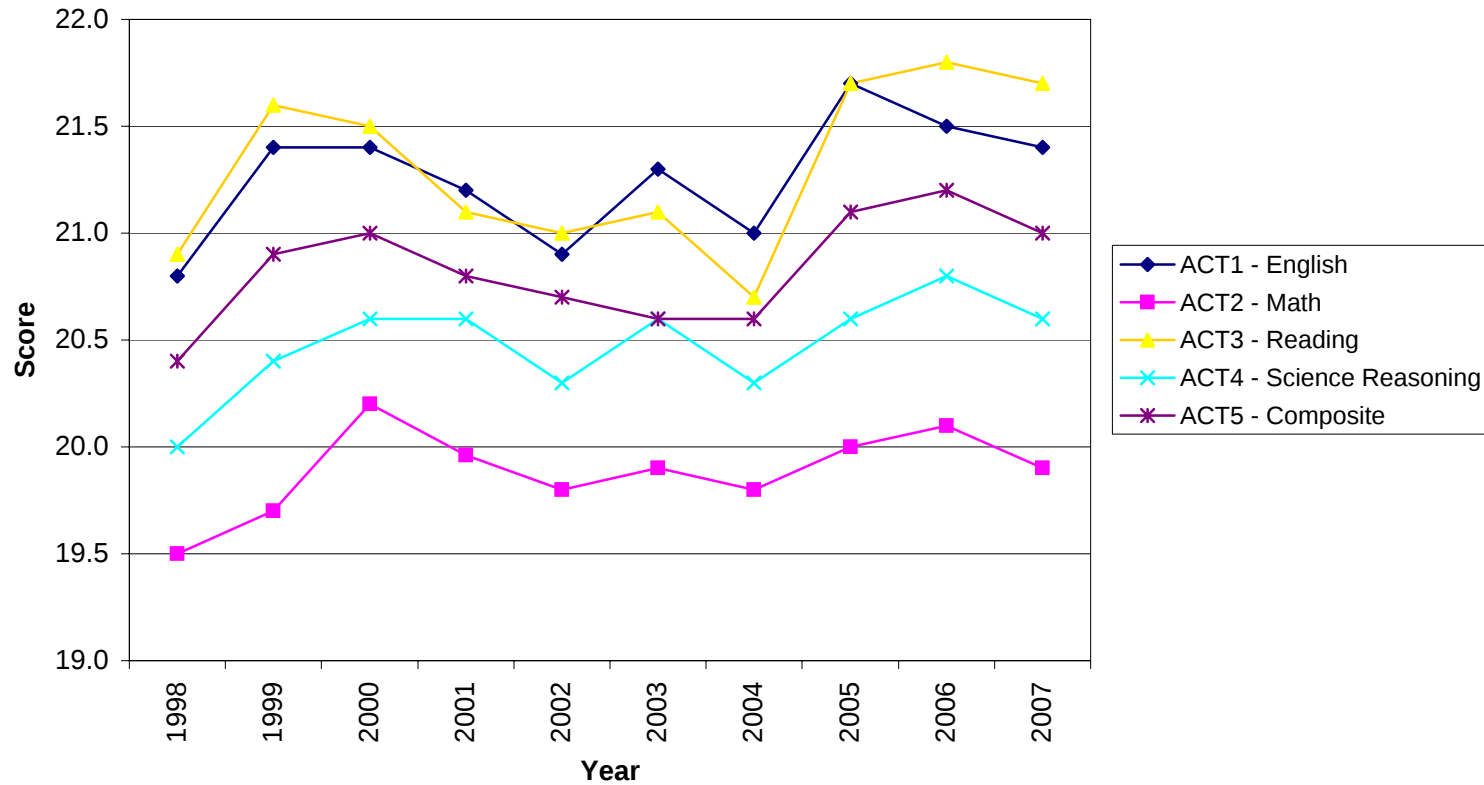

Fall 1998 - Fall 2007



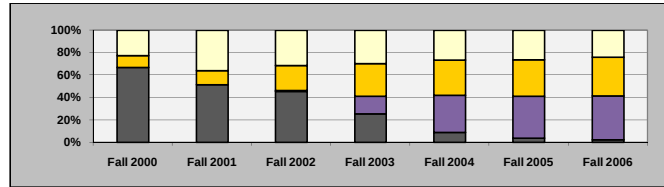

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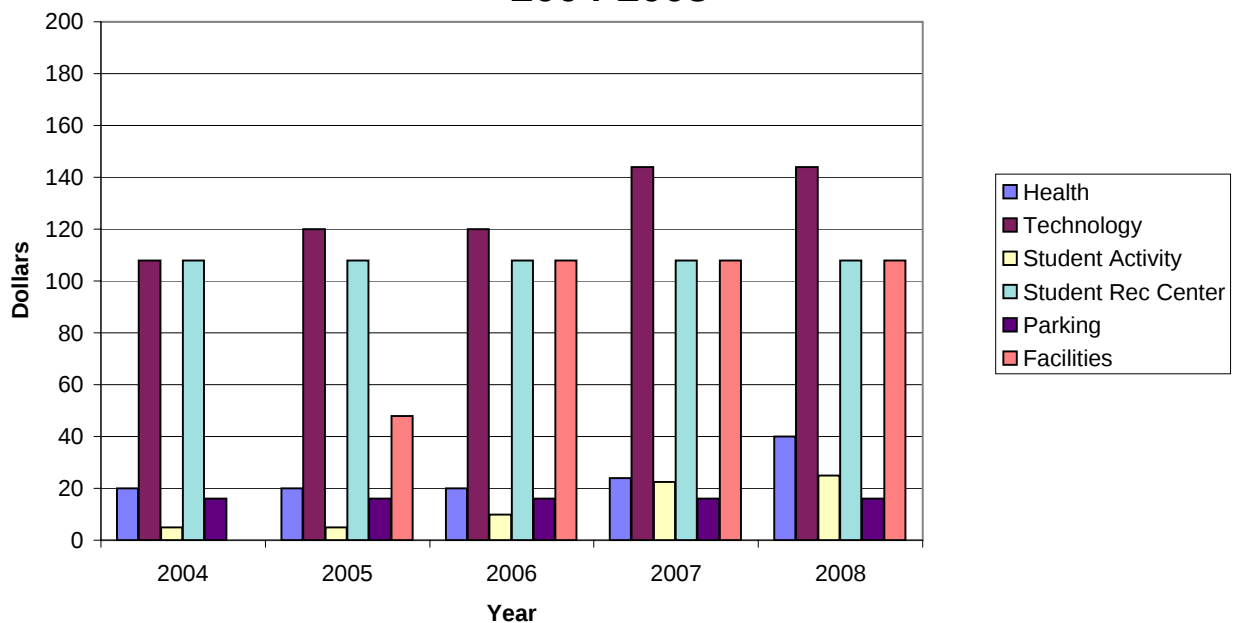
