<b>Description:</b>	Implement UNA OrgSync software system to maintain the Recognized Student Organization (RSO) database, communication, web pages, and student allocation funding on-line. Teh program also serves as an assessment tool to determine the percentage of students involved in co-curricular activities and volunteerism.

**Results:** •The UNA OrgSync system was implemented. •A training session was conducted at the beginning of semester at the RSO Leadership Retreat to introduce the RSOs to OrgSync. •An OrgSync representative came to campus for two days to train RSOs on how to use the system.

**Actions/Improvements:** More training was conducted based on the needs of the students. The system proved to be user friendly with the student allocation funding process through OrgSync. This is the first year Student Engagement was able to assess student involvement in Recognized Student Organizations through UNA OrgSync. The following data came from the assessment: •Currently, there are 1301 users using the UNA OrgSync system which consists for students and staff/faculty advisors. •Out of 1301, this is the breakdown of users: -97 Faculty or Staff -15 Alumni -37 Graduate Students – Approximately 3% of Graduate Population are involved in RSOs -1152 Undergraduate Students - Approximately 20% of Undergraduate Population are involved in RSOs -364 live on campus -814 live off campus -272 of the students were 1st year generation students going to college

**Future Actions/Improvements:** •The OrgSync tool has been so successful that Student Engagement will be purchasing the Service Management module to assist with volunteerism opportunities and to track service hours.
