

## WHAT IS SOCIAL WORK?

Social Work is a profession that serves individuals, families, and communities. Social workers advocate, build relationships, empower people, create opportunities for positive change.

#### **ABOUT US**

UNA's Department of Social Work is nationally accredited by the Council on Social Work Education and offers course work leading to the Bachelor of Social Work (BSW) degree and the Master of Social Work (MSW). The Bachelor of Social Work (BSW) prepares professional, ethical, and competent generalist social workers to intervene with individuals, families, organizations, and communities. The BSW allows students to practice in community agencies and enter the UNA one-year MSW program option. The degree also allows students to become state-licensed at the BSW level.

# MASTER OF SOCIAL WORK (MSW)

The Master of Social Work (MSW) prepares advanced generalist social workers to apply professional social work knowledge, values, and skills to practice situations, promoting human and community well-being. The program focuses on promoting and advocating for human rights and social/economic justice. The MSW degree is a completely online program and is offered in 8-week sessions. There is a two-year option available for graduates who do not have a BSW. The degree allows students to become statelicensed at the MSW level.

### **FIELD INTERNSHIP**

As part of the BSW or MSW program, students are required to participate in a Field Internship experience with local, state, or regional human services agencies, providing a variety of services to all income levels.
