Users will be enrolled based on their selection in Question 1 as follows:

- Biomedical Researchers: *Biomedical Research Basic Course* (14 required modules)

- IRB Members: *IRB Members Basic Course* (34 required modules)

UNA ONLY REQUIRES AN ANSWER TO QUESTION 1.

Answering other questions will enroll a user into additional modules, which the user may remove later; additional courses are optional. However, the Basic Courses are REQUIRED.

Users are required to complete each of the *required* modules within the Basic Course that corresponds with the Human Subjects Research proposed. Users must complete each module with a minimum score of 80% and then print/save the certificate of completion. Certification is valid for up to 3 years.
