HIGHER EDUCATION DAY



On February 19, 2026, the Student Government Association and Freshman Forum was invited to go to Montgomery, Alabama to encourage the decision makers in Alabama to support and help fund public universities all over the state. We had the privilege of attending and hearing from Alabama Governor Kay Ivey, legislators all over the state, as well as getting to represent the University of North Alabama. This event was organized by Chairwoman McDonald and the Legislative Affairs Committee.

SGA ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

SGA was able to award \$2,904 for our endowed scholarship. We are excited to award two students with financial support.



The journey to establish this scholarship began in 2010, and it took five years to raise \$25,000 to endow it. The first scholarships were awarded in 2016. The SGA Endowed Scholarship is managed by the Treasurer who creates a committee to select the recipients.

SGA 5K



On March 7, 2026, the Student Government Association held the SGA 5K in order to raise money for their philanthropy Disability Support Services. In 2025, SGA was able to bring back this 5K tradition to raise money for specific philanthropies selected annually. This year SGA focused on Disability Support Services and was able to raise \$2,000 through the SGA 5K. This event was organized by Chairwoman Gaertner and the Philanthropy Committee.

LEGISLATION PASSED

CODE OF LAWS

- **Bill 25-17: Freshman Forum Executive Chair and Clerk Voting Bill**
 - The purpose of this bill is to allow the delegates ample time to think, process, and decide who they think is fit to fill the positions or if they themselves would like to run for the positions.
- **Bill 25-18: "Dishin in the New Year" Funding Bill**
 - The purpose of this bill is to allocate funding from the Miscellaneous line item for the "Dishin in the New Year" Potluck with the Senate to be held on September 11, 2025.
- **Bill 25-19: The UNA SGA Constitution Day Funding Bill**
 - The purpose of this bill is to fund the UNA SGA Constitution Day Event.
- **Bill 25-20: Six, Not Five Bill**
 - The purpose of this bill is to amend the Code of Laws to update the language in Chapter 608.2 to include the Philanthropy Committee chairperson in the Chairpersons Committee.
- **Bill 25-21: The Link with the Legislators Funding Bill**
 - The purpose of this bill is to fund the UNA SGA/ Freshman Forum Link with the Legislators Event.
- **Bill 25-22: "Loco for Hoco" Funding Bill**
 - The purpose of this bill is to allocate funding from the Miscellaneous line item for the purchase of items for our homecoming festivities.
- **Bill 25-23: Dreams to Reality Food Funding Bill.**
 - The purpose of this bill is to distribute additional funding from the miscellaneous budget to purchase a variety of food items from Chartwells Dining to host Alabama (AL) legislators, SGA Senate, UNA faculty, and local City Councils.
- **Bill 25-24: Ice Cream Social Bill**
 - The purpose of this bill is to allocate funding from the Miscellaneous line to purchase items for the Ice Cream Social held on October 21, 2025.

LEGISLATION PASSED

CODE OF LAWS

- **Bill 25-26: Distribution of Funds Clean Up Act**
 - The purpose of this bill is to update the amount of money to be allocated from Student Activity Funds for the Campus Groups platform. Additionally, this bill corrects the percentages for student activity fee distribution.
- **Bill 25-27: "Friendsgiving Lip Sync Extravaganza" Funding Bill**
 - The purpose of this bill is to allocate funding from the Miscellaneous line item for the purchase of items for our Thanksgiving festivities.
- **Bill 25-28: CCT/Service Hours & Custom Branding Add-on Act**
 - The purpose of this bill is to update the amount of money to be allocated from Student Activity Funds for the Campus Groups platform, specifically adding on the \$2,000/year co-curricular transcript model (includes service hours) and \$1,250/year custom branding feature.
- **Bill 25-29: Refinement of Proposed Legislation Bill**
 - The purpose of this bill is to amend the Code of Laws Chapter 504 section 504.1, with the addition of sections 504.1.1-504.1.3.1 to clarify the procedures of proposed legislation for the Student Government Association at the University of North Alabama.
- **Bill 25-30: Discrepancies Between Secretary and Court Clerk Bill**
 - The purpose of this bill is to amend the Code of Laws to distinguish the responsibilities and roles between the SGA Secretary and the Court Clerk by removing Section 402.13 from the Code of Law. The Code of Law currently has the Secretary fulfilling duties that already are fulfilled by the Court Clerk.
- **Bill 25-31: Snaps for SNAP Funding Bill**
 - The purpose of this bill is to allocate funds from the Miscellaneous line to recognize and show appreciation for the UNA Student Nighttime Auxiliary Patrol (SNAP) drivers.
- **Bill 25-32: UNA SGA Take What You Need Event Funding Bill**
 - The purpose of this bill is to fund the UNA SGA Take What You Need Event on December 3rd, 2025.

LEGISLATION PASSED

CODE OF LAWS

- **Bill 25-33: "Coffee & Chat" Funding Bill**
 - The purpose of this bill is to allocate funding from the miscellaneous line item for the purchase of items for our pre-finals pick me up.
- **Bill 26-1: No Contact Act**
 - The purpose of this bill is to strike Sections 605.2.2, 605.2.2.1, & 605.2.2.2 for the purpose of ending the mandating of communication with specific legislators as to focus more on the whole of the state legislature and our duties of supporting the Higher Education Partnership and Florence City Council.
- **Bill 26-2: "Valentine's Mixer" Funding Bill**
 - The purpose of this bill is to allocate funding from the miscellaneous line item for the purchase of items for our Valentine's mixer with our entire Student Government Association Branches.
- **Bill 26-3: Scholarship Clarification Act**
 - The purpose of this bill is to amend Code of Laws section 404 to select one choice of verbiage regarding the scholarships and salaries of SGA officers for consistency and ease of understanding for any reader.
- **Bill 26-4: No Exec for Exec Act**
 - The purpose of this bill is to remove the requirement of the mandatory attendance of the Executive Chair at SGA Executive Council meetings.
- **Bill 26-5: One is a Must Act**
 - The purpose of this bill is to remove the requirement of attendance for both Freshman Forum Advisors at weekly SGA Executive Council meetings.
- **Bill 26-6: Executive Session Reformation Act**
 - The purpose of this bill is to amend current legislation within the SGA Code of Laws that currently contradicts the SGA Constitution and verify any future necessary disciplinary procedures following a violation of Executive Session.

LEGISLATION PASSED

CODE OF LAWS

- **Bill 26-7: Academic Affairs Committee Representing All Act**
 - The purpose of this bill is to amend the Code of Laws Section 602.1 to have the Academic Affairs Committee represent all colleges at the University of North Alabama.
- **Bill 26-8: The Bridging the Gap Act**
 - The purpose of this bill is to amend the Code of Laws Section 602.3.1 to make it a requirement for Academic Affairs to meet with University representatives at least once per semester to discuss the continued improvement of UNA's educational quality.
- **Bill 26-9: Salaries to Scholarships Act**
 - The purpose of this bill is to amend the Code of Laws to make the language referring to the payment of student leaders more appropriate.
- **Bill 26-10: All Good Things Must Come to an End Bill**
 - The purpose of this bill is to amend the Code of Laws to update the language in Chapter 500.1.1 to include a formal ending time for the Senate.
- **Bill 26-11: The Attendance Accountability Act**
 - The purpose of this bill is to amend the Code of Laws Section 200.8 to make the attendance policy clearer.
- **Bill 26-12: Freshman Forum Announcement Act**
 - The purpose of this bill is to amend current wording within the Code of Laws to bring it in alignment with current Student Government Association precedent regarding the method of delivery regarding the announcement of the chosen Freshman Forum in any given school year.
- **Bill 26-13: Pride Points Bill**
 - The purpose of this bill is to allocate funding from the miscellaneous line item for the purchase of items for the Pride Points prizes.

LEGISLATION PASSED

CODE OF LAWS

- **Bill 26-14: Student Welfare Party of Three Act**
 - The purpose of this bill is to amend Code of Laws Section 603.1 to increase input to the Student Welfare Committee from different types of students.
- **Bill 26-15: Fill the Fridge Act**
 - The purpose of this bill is to amend 603.4 to specify the Student Welfare Committee's involvement with the food pantry.
- **Bill 26-16: Welfare for All Act**
 - The purpose of this bill is to add section 603.5 to the Code of Laws to require the Student Welfare Committee to host at least one (1) transfer student and at least one (1) international student programming event per academic year to foster belonging and campus engagement.
- **Bill 26-17: CLEG Strike Bill**
 - The purpose of this bill is to strike Chapter 609 from the Code of Laws, seeing that the Collegiate Legislature organization, also known as CLEG, has been dissolved.
- **Bill 26-18: Freshman Forum Election Act**
 - The purpose of this bill is to amend the Code of Laws to update the language in Chapter 803.1 and 804.1 to stay in compliance with 802.2 of the Code of Laws stating that both the Freshman Forum Clerk and Executive Chair shall be elected before or during the first formal meeting by a simple majority of the Freshman Forum.
- **Bill 26-19: Academic Affairs Committee Representing All Amendment Act**
 - The purpose of this bill is to amend the Code of Laws Section 602.1 to clarify that members of the Academic Affairs committee will be assigned to represent a different college on campus.
- **Bill 26-20: Freshman Forum Numerical Act**
 - The purpose of this bill is to update the code of laws to keep it in line with the constitution on Freshman Forum Clerk and Executive Chair.

LEGISLATION PASSED

CODE OF LAWS

- **Bill 26-21: Not Changing the Absenteeism Policy Act**
 - The purpose of this bill is to amend the Code of Laws Chapter 200 to specify that this absenteeism policy shall be solely for the Executive and Legislative Branches of the SGA. The attendance and absenteeism policy for the Judicial branch is outlined in Code of Laws Title XI, and there will be further legislation specifying the Freshman Forum absenteeism policy should this bill pass.
- **Bill 26-22: The Declaration of Freshman Forum Absenteeism Act**
 - The purpose of this bill is to insert a new Chapter 803 to the Freshman Forum section of the Code of Laws to clarify and outline the attendance and absenteeism policy for delegates. All current chapters (803-806) following the insertion of the new Chapter 803 shall be moved in number.
- **Bill 26-23: So it Begins...and Ends Act**
 - The purpose of this bill is to amend the Code of Laws to update the language in Chapter 800.3 to include a formal ending time for Freshman Forum and clarify the meeting times of Freshman Forum committees.
- **Bill 26-24: Freshman Forum Both/And Act**
 - The purpose of this bill is to add a new Chapter 804.10 to the Code of Laws to establish the reporting of Freshman Forum absences to both the SGA Secretary and the Chief Justice of the Judicial Branch.
- **Bill 26-25: Freshman Forum Executive Chair Role Expansion Act**
 - The purpose of this bill is to expand the role of the Freshman Forum Executive Chair to include oversight of budgeting and financial matters in coordination with the SGA Treasurer. Additionally, to assist in internal event planning to create a more balanced and effective distribution of responsibilities within Freshman Forum leadership.
- **Bill 26-26: Impact Over Internal Act**
 - The purpose of this bill is to amend the Code of Laws to update the language in Chapter 606.5 to better define the Philanthropy Committee's responsibilities regarding hosting required philanthropic events.

LEGISLATION PASSED

CODE OF LAWS

- **Bill 26-26: Impact Over Internal Act**
 - The purpose of this bill is to amend the Code of Laws to update the language in Chapter 606.5 to better define the Philanthropy Committee's responsibilities regarding hosting required philanthropic events.
- **Bill 26-27: Volunteerism Clarification Act**
 - The purpose of this bill is to clarify the terminology used in the current section of the Code of Laws and to add a criterion of completion for the act.
- **Bill 26-28: PR Core Four Act**
 - The purpose of this bill is to give each delegate in the Freshman Forum Public Relations Committee a certain role.
- **Bill 26-29: Budget Cushioning Bill**
 - The purpose of this bill is to allocate funding from the miscellaneous fund line to support an Academic Affairs event that is in collaboration with Collier Library and the Math Center. The event includes giveaway prizes to encourage student participation and encourage students to use their academic resources on campus.
- **Bill 26-30: Diversity and Inclusion Obligations Act**
 - The purpose of this bill is to amend Chapter 3000 of the Code of Laws pertaining to the position and obligations tasked to the SGA Diversity and Inclusion Advocate (DIA).
- **Bill 26-31: The Officers Rules Test Act**
 - The purpose of this bill is to amend Code of Laws Chapter 100 to establish a clear timeline and maximum attempt limits for the mandatory knowledge test required of all SGA Executive Officers.
- **Bill 26-32: The Senate Rules Test Act**
 - The purpose of this bill is to amend Code of Laws Chapter 101 to establish a clear timeline and maximum attempt limits for the mandatory knowledge test required of all SGA Senators.

LEGISLATION PASSED

CODE OF LAWS

- **Bill 26-33: The Judicial Rules Test Act**
 - The purpose of this bill is to amend Code of Laws Chapter 900 to establish a clear timeline and procedures for the Senate Rules test administered by the Judicial Branch.
- **Bill 26-35: Who Shall Serve Act**
 - The purpose of this bill is to amend the Code of Laws to establish who shall serve in the place of the SGA Secretary in the case that they may be absent from a Senate meeting.

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS

- **CAB 26-1: Freshman Forum Qualification Revision Amendment**
 - The purpose of this bill is to amend Article IV, Section 3, A, to adjust the qualifications for incoming Freshmen who want to apply for Freshman Forum. This amendment grants Freshman Forum advisors to recognize incoming students who are classified as Sophomores, Juniors, or Seniors due to dual enrollment or college credit earned in high school prior to enrolling to University of North Alabama.

MEMORANDUM

- **Alma Mater Memorandum**
 - The purpose of this memorandum is to address concerns with the current Alma Mater, the first verse contains language that is widely considered offensive and discriminatory. We would like to remove the discriminatory term from the Alma Mater and construct it in a way in which it exemplifies every aspect of our beloved University. Our goal is to bring back previous traditions and make use of the Alma Mater after these changes are made.

- **Resolution 26-01: A Resolution Commemorating the 10th Anniversary of Light the Fountain**
 - The University of North Alabama’s Student Government Association commemorates the 10th anniversary of Light the Fountain and expresses gratitude to the generous sponsors of the event and the campus organizations, leaders, faculty, and staff who helped establish and continue this meaningful tradition. They have devoted their time and efforts to found and preserve this beloved campus tradition that unites our campus community, celebrates the coming of the spring season, and reminds us all of the school we owe all honor.
- **Resolution 26-02**
 - The University of North Alabama Student Government Association recognizes the need for more adequate and compatible accessibility and infrastructure on campus to all students no matter the demographic.
