STUDENT GOVERNMENT ASSOCIATION A BILL TO BE ENTILTLED AN ACT Bill 22-05

- I. This Act shall be known and cited as Mandatory Senate Trainings.
- II. The purpose of this bill is to amend the Code of Laws Chapter 200 to increase diversity and inclusion training in senate as well as to increase leadership and team building as a whole.
- III. Currently reads:

 There is nothing in the SGA code of laws or SGA Constitution that refers to any type of mandatory training for SGA senators or executive council.
- IV. Now it shall read:

200.6 SGA Senators and Executive Council members are required to attend mandatory trainings every semester including:

- Diversity and Inclusion training once per semester with the office of Division of Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (ODIE).
- Leadership or Team Building training once per semester.

The Executive Council members are required to attend:

- One (1) additional Diversity and Inclusion training per semester.
- One (1) additional Leadership or Team Building training per semester.

Failure to participate in required semester trainings will result in an absence per training not completed. Semester trainings must be completed at least two (2) weeks prior to final examinations each semester. Trainings are to be set up and scheduled by the executive council. If a senator or executive council member is absent during one of the scheduled trainings, it is the responsibility of the senator or executive council member to attend a training session on their own time. Email documentation from the training leader of attendance must be submitted to the SGA Secretary no later than one week after completion of the make-up training.

V. This bill will become law upon the ratification by two-thirds (2/3) vote of the University of North Alabama Student Government Association Senate, and its subsequent approval by the Student Government Association President and Vice-President.
