XIV. **NEW BUSINESS**

- Bill 25-17: Freshman Forum Inter-Collaboration Act
 - The first piece of legislation on the Senate floor today is being presented by Freshman Forum Advisor Anthony and Freshman Forum Advisor Ballenger.
 - This bill basically outlines in the code of laws what has already been done in the past: the hosting of a large-scale event once a year by Freshman Forum.
 - Freshman Forum really enjoyed collaborating on the big event they held this year, so this is the reasoning behind
 why the advisors have chosen to write this bill.
 - President Mardis believes that this bill is great, especially since Freshman Forum already does this anyways.
 - There was a motion to move into a vote on this bill. The motion was heard and properly seconded.
 - The Senate unanimously approved the passing of this bill as it was presented. Congratulations!
- Bill 25-18: 2025 Pride Points Prize Bill
 - The second piece of legislation on the Senate floor today is being presented by Chairwoman Winston.
 - The purpose of this bill is to allocate funding from the miscellaneous line item for a prize, given to the 2025 Pride Points Winner at the end of this semester.
 - Treasurer Batchelor informs the Senate that we currently have roughly \$1,400 left in the miscellaneous line item.
 - Pro-Tempore Fitz asks why there was not an exact price put on the bill. Chairwoman Winston clarifies that it was for shipping purposes.
 - Senator Gilliland asks if taxes would apply to this purchase. Vice-President McGinnis informs him that it would not.
 - Senator Murray asks why we are pushing for a prize when we would probably not see the engagement we want from the Pride Points initiative.
 - Senator Strait asks how many applicants we currently have for Pride Points. Senator Strait would also like clarification on what Pride Points is, and how someone can earn this prize.
 - Senator Vezina believes we need to pass this so that we can offer an incentive to the student body.
 - Pro-Tempore Fitz thinks we have done a really good job advertising this initiative this year, and she thinks this
 award would be a good incentive for students to participate.
 - Senator Gottman reiterates that this award is a really good incentive for this initiative this is merchandise that can
 easily be found on other places here on campus.
 - Senator Strait believes it may be beneficial to do many smaller prizes instead of one big prize.
 - DIA Saunders thinks that the award presented in the bill is a good incentive for this year's Pride Points, and we could try to implement different incentives in the coming years.
 - Senator Moore asks how many people have participated in the Pride Points initiative so far this semester.
 - There was a motion to move into a vote on this bill. The motion was heard and properly seconded.
 - The Senate voted to pass this bill as it was presented. Congratulations!

• Allocations Manual Changes

- Chairman McCuiston will be proposing potential changes to the Student Allocations Funding Manual.
- He clarifies that RSOs are limited to 5 approved events in an academic year, not just requested events.
- There was a motion to move into a vote on the changes. The motion was heard and properly seconded.
- The Senate unanimously voted to pass the changes as they were presented. Congratulations!
